THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

Order.

IN pursuance of the provisions of Regulation 25 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (a) declare the premises described in Schedule A hereto to be a protected place for the purposes of the aforesaid regulations;

- (c) specify the Port Security Officer, Colombo, as the authority without whose permission no person, other than those specified in Schedule B, shall be in the premises described in Schedule A.

- (3) Officers of the Regular Naval, Military or Air Force or of the Ceylon Defence Force or of the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force, and members of the Colombo Town Guard in uniform, who carry an identity pass issued by an officer of the unit to which they belong; or non-commissioned officers or other ranks (other than non-commissioned officers or soldiers of the Colombo Town Guard) accompanied or identified by an officer or a non-commissioned officer, who carries an identity pass issued by an officer of the unit to which such officer belongs.
- (4) Members of the Essential Services Labour Corps who enter the area in parties under the charge of an officer of such Corps who carries a permit issued by or on behalf of the Principal Collector of Customs.
- (5) Uniformed drivers of military vehicles who carry a Service paybook, or a document which has been issued by the Commanding officer of the unit to which they belong and furnishes proof of their identity.
- (6) Civilian employees of the Admiralty who carry a passport-type Admiralty pass or other pass issued by the Flag Officer, Ceylon.

NOTICE.

PERMISSION is granted, subject to the provisions of the Customs law, Port rules, and any other rules or regulations applicable within the area, and to the directions given in the Schedule hereto, to the following persons, and no others (except those exempted by Order of the Governor), to be in the Colombo Port Premises, Protected Place No. 31 :—

- (a) Persons who carry a permit issued by or on behalf of the Principal Collector of Customs, containing the name and address, photograph, and signature of the holder, the nature of his business and the signature of his employer.
- (b) Labourers named in the register and indexes held by the Port Controller and Principal Collector of Customs who carry an identity disc with their registration index number thereon.
- (c) Members of the Harbour Auxiliary Fire Service, whose names appear in the index held by the Principal Collector of Customs, and who carry an identity disc with their index number thereon.
- (d) Labourers of the Harbour Engineer's Department who carry a Harbour Engineer's work ticket.
- (e) Crews of merchant vessels (including Hired Transports) passing to or from their vessels, who carry a special pass issued by the Master and signed by the bearer either before the Master or before a customs officer.
- (f) Persons who carry a special daily pass bearing their signature and issued by me.
- (g) Persons who carry a War Department Pass and Identity Book endorsed by or on behalf of the Principal Collector of Customs, or a Security Pass.
- (h) One visitor only accompanying a member of the Royal Colombo Yacht Club who carries a pass or permit authorising him to enter the premises.

*Schedule.***Directions regulating the conduct of persons permitted to be in the Colombo Port Premises.**

1. No person holding any permit, pass, disc, or other authority, or exempted from holding such pass, shall be in the Colombo Port Premises unless he is actually engaged on business therein or is going to or from his own ship.
2. No such person shall be in any part of the premises except that where he is engaged in business or along the most direct route to or from such place of business.
3. Every such person shall, if required by any officer of the Naval Police, Military Police, Civil Police or Customs, state his business at the time and satisfy such officer that he is actually engaged in such business or is going to or from such business.
4. Masters, officers, and seamen from merchant vessels shall land at and depart from the Passenger Jetty only or through the gate on T.S. bridge, provided that return shall be made by the same gate as that of entry.
5. (a) Wharf labourers and boatmen of the Ceylon Wharfage Company engaged in the import premises shall enter and leave only by the Customs Main Gate.
(b) Other wharf labourers and boatmen engaged in the import premises shall enter and leave only by the Leyden Bastion Gate.

(c) Labourers registered in the Port Controller's "coal section" pool shall enter and leave only by the Leyden Bastion Gate.

(d) Wharf labourers and boatmen engaged in the export premises shall enter and leave only by the Baghdad Gate.

(e) Shore labourers and boatmen engaged in the Kochchikadde gram sheds or coal grounds shall enter and leave only by the Kochchikadde Gate (No. 4).

(f) Shore coal labourers and boatmen and stevedores engaged in the Central and Salvaged coaling grounds (including all those registered in the Port Controller's "coal section" pool) shall enter and leave only by St. Anthony's Gate (No. 5) or the gate on T.S. bridge.

(g) Labourers engaged in Walker's Workshop shall enter and leave only by the gate on T.S. bridge.

(h) Labourers engaged in the Harbour Engineer's Workshop shall enter and leave only by Harbour Engineer's Main Gate.

(k) Employees at the wharf of the Ceylon Government Railway shall enter and leave only by the Main Gate, or St. Anthony's Gate (No. 5) or the gate on T.S. bridge.

(l) Labourers engaged by the Harbour Engineer in the Dock premises shall enter and leave only by the Fisher's Hill Gate.

(m) Labourers employed in the Admiralty Stores at Kochchikadde and indexed by the Principal Collector of Customs, shall enter and leave only by the St. Anthony's Gate (No. 5).

(n) No person shall enter or leave the premises by the North-East breakwater gate or any other gate not specified in paragraphs (a) to (m) above, unless he is in possession of an approved pass and proof of identity.

No person shall wear in public any dress resembling any uniform required to be worn by a member of His Majesty's forces or by any police officer or by a member of any force constituted or established under any written law, unless permission has been granted by the Chief Secretary for the use of such dress by any association or body of persons of which that person is a member.

2. No person shall wear or display in public any dress or article of apparel or any emblem distinctive of, or signifying his association with, any body of persons organised for the promotion of any political or economic object, unless permission has been granted by the Chief Secretary for the use of such dress, article of apparel or emblem by such body of persons.

3. The Order under Regulation 23E of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,989 of August 18, 1942, is hereby rescinded.

Regulations.

1. Nothing in any provision of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, requiring or relating to the registration or licensing of motor cars or the carriage of identification plates on motor cars shall apply in the case of any service motor car.

2. An authorised officer may issue to any person a permit authorising that person to drive service motor cars; and any permit so issued shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be deemed to be a certificate of competence issued under the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938:

Provided, however, that no person shall, by reason only that he is the holder of any such permit, be entitled to drive any motor car other than a service motor car.

3. For the purposes of these regulations, "authorised officer" means any of the following:—

- the Officer Commanding the Troops, Ceylon, or any other officer acting under his authority;
- the Air Officer Commanding, Royal Air Force, Ceylon, or any other officer acting under his authority;
- the Captain Superintendent, Ceylon, or any other officer acting under his authority.

4. In these regulations—

"certificate of competence" and "motor car" have, respectively, the same meaning as in the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938;

"His Majesty's forces" includes the Ceylon Defence Force, and the Ceylon Naval Volunteer Force;

"service motor car" means any motor car which belongs to His Majesty or is used by any of His Majesty's forces and which bears, upon a plate or otherwise a distinctive number assigned to that motor car by an authorised officer.

5. The Defence (War Department Motor Cars) Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,842 of January 6, 1942, are hereby rescinded.

6. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Service Motor Cars) Regulations.

By-laws relating to the Tax on Vehicles and Animals.

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt by the person to whom the schedule is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept or used.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished, and every person who has sent the written notice referred to in by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee

within one month from the date on which the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person, in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of such owner and on payment by such owner of fifty cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

8. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee.

“Committee” means the Eravur Pattu South Village Committee.

Interest.—Interest received during the year amounted to Rs. 318,403·31.

Rate of Interest.—The rate of interest on loans to local authorities remains at four per cent. per annum and that for Co-operative Societies and Government Officers for building houses at five per cent. per annum. Interest on loans to Co-operative Banking Unions is $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum.

Receipts.—The receipts for the year amounted to Rs. 845,206·40 exclusive of Rs. 2,279·54 recovered as legal and inspection fees.

Borrowing.—No money was borrowed from Government or the Savings Certificates Fund during the year. The total borrowing remains at Rs. 1,185,000.

Expenses of the Fund.—The working expenses of the Fund amounted to Rs. 2,864·26, exclusive of Rs. 44,437·50 paid as interest on the borrowings from Government and the Savings Certificate Fund. A sum of Rs. 2,332·79 paid to the legal advisers and the Inspecting Officers of the Public Works Department was recovered from Government Officers.

Bad Debts.—No bad debts were written off during the year.

Net Profit of the Fund.—A sum of Rs. 271,533·55 being net profit for the year 1939-40 was paid into Government revenue during the year.

The net profit for the year 1940-41 is Rs. 271,101·55.

Cash Balance.—The cash balance lying in the Treasury on September 30, 1941, was Rs. 71,129·18.

Capital of the Fund.—The capital of the Fund stood at Rs. 6,673,783·04, of which Government grants amounted to Rs. 4,193,094·27 and the accumulated interest to Rs. 2,480,688·77. Of the latter amount Rs. 271,101·55 represents the net profit for the year still due to Government revenue.

Arrears of Repayment.—The position in regard to the repayment of the loan to the Chilaw Urban Council has not altered. Early in the year, the Commissioners decided that they would not have any objection to waiving that portion of the loan which represented expenditure on the water scheme—Rs. 113,620·45—and to allowing repayment of the balance Rs. 121,801·05 in easy instalments after making allowance for the repayments already made. The Commissioner of Local Government undertook to sound the views of the Council on this proposal. Owing to a deadlock in the Council, the Council's views could not be obtained.

Three Sanitary Board towns defaulted this year in respect of repayments due on loans obtained for their electricity schemes : the Small Towns of Point Pedro and Velvettiturai paid only the interest due for the year 1941, the recovery of instalments being suspended until the full statistics in regard to the electric lighting supply for 1941 were worked out by the Government Electrical Department. The Small Towns of Hikkaduwa and Dodanduwa were also allowed the concession of paying interest only in 1941, the position being left to be reviewed in 1942. For want of funds the Small Town of Kuliyapitiya delayed payment of two sums of Rs. 400 and Rs. 1,888 due in July, 1941. The two sums have since been paid.

Of the sum of Rs. 924,620·34 outstanding from Co-operative Societies, Rs. 840,513·92 represented the liability of the Jaffna Malayalam Tobacco Co-operative Sale Society, Ltd. Of the balance of Rs. 84,106·42, a sum of Rs. 7,377·06 is in arrears.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

By virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Noel Edward Ernst, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kurunegala District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke my Order dated June 29, 1942, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8965 of July 10, 1942, fixing the wholesale price per bag and retail price per pound of flour;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per pound above which flour of the description mentioned in the headings of columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the corresponding areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (3) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions of flour mentioned in the First Schedule hereto;
- (4) direct that all dealers in flour in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the descriptions and grades of flour for sale and maximum prices fixed by this Order;
- (5) direct that no dealer shall sell flour of any description mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with flour of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every dealer who sells flour of any description mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that flour a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of flour sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of flour sold;
 - (c) the date of sale;
 - (d) whether the sale is by wholesale or by retail;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of flour for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from a retail dealer for any quantity of flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (c) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for flour of any description which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such flour is sold.

- (1) revoke my Orders dated August 3, 1942, published in *Government Gazettes* No. 8,987 of August 14, 1942, and No. 8,983 of August 7, 1942, fixing the wholesale price per bag and retail price per measure of rice, paddy and wheat
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag and the authorised distributor's maximum retail price per measure above which rice or paddy or wheat of the description mentioned in the headings of columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the corresponding areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (3) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions of rice, paddy and wheat mentioned in the First Schedule hereto;
- (4) direct that wholesale dealers and authorised distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the descriptions of rice, paddy and wheat for sale and maximum prices fixed by this Order;
- (5) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorised distributor shall sell rice or paddy or wheat of any description mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice or paddy or wheat of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer and authorised distributor who sells rice or paddy or wheat of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice or paddy or wheat a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of rice or paddy or wheat sold;
 - (b) the quantity of rice or paddy or wheat sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice or paddy or wheat sold;
 - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice or paddy or wheat for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
 - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of rice or paddy or wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (d) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller, under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
 - (e) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots.

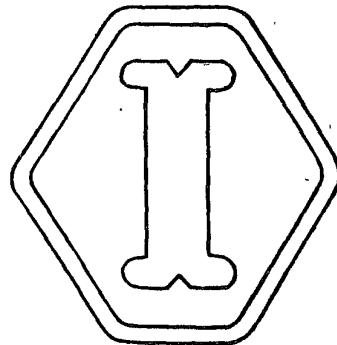

Abstract.—The applicants state that the bitumen dispersions used in road construction have a high bitumen content (about 50–60%). They claim that by the process disclosed in the specification a very thin liquid dispersion containing 10–12 % of bitumen is obtained which has a high covering power as a coating agent. In particular these dispersions can be used for camouflaging, and covering roads, tennis courts, &c.

According to the invention, an ordinary bitumen dispersion of the stable type is diluted with water to a bitumen content of 10–12 % by weight, and to this diluted dispersion are added a pigment and a highly swellable or colloidal substance such as bentonite which serves to suspend the pigment. The pigment content may be equal to or slightly lower than the bitumen content by weight.

Abstract.—This invention relates to the preparation of stable bituminous dispersions, for use in the production of coloured bitumen dispersions (as disclosed in Ceylon Specification No. 3192) which consists in mixing bitumen or an aqueous dispersion thereof with an aqueous dispersion or slurry of a highly swellable or colloidal inorganic substance such as bentonite, such that the resulting dispersion contains not more than 25 % by weight, and preferably less than 15 % by weight of bitumen; the percentage being calculated on the weight of the base dispersion, excluding the highly swellable and colloidal substance.

To a bituminous dispersion as proposed above a pigment may be added to produce a coloured bituminous dispersion. For this purpose dry pigments or water-base pigments may be added; in the latter case more concentrated base dispersion must be used.

Traces of such substances as aluminium sulphate which cause flocculation of the bentonite may be added if desired to control the consistency of the final product.
