KNOW Ye that in pursuance of the provisions of Article 74 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation signify the assent given by His Majesty the King, through one of His Principal Secretaries of State, to the Bill intituled "An Ordinance to make provision for the prohibition or control of the erection and alteration of buildings and of the sale or disposition of land in and in the neighbourhood of Anuradhapura, and for matters connected with or incidental to the matters aforesaid", which was passed by the State Council on the Second day of December, One thousand Nine hundred and Forty-one, and was reserved by me under Article 77 of the aforesaid Order in Council for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure.

By-laws.

1. For the purposes of the assessment tax, the percentage or rate to be deducted from the annual value for the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep, shall be as follows:—

- (a) in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent;
- (b) in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent;
- (c) in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent; and
- (d) in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent.

2. (1) For the purpose of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

- (a) to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and
- (b) to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose.

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice.

(3) For the purposes of this by-law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed on a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person.

3. No person shall obstruct any assessor or any person acting under the orders of an assessor, in the lawful discharge of his duties.

4. In these by-laws—

- "building" includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure, whether used for human habitation or otherwise;
- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee;
- "Committee" means the Village Committee.

"A radiographic unit for correcting radiographic distortion and a method for obtaining radiographically true measurements, especially of the heart relative to the chest."

Abstract.—The object of the invention is to eliminate the errors arising from the disproportionate magnification of objects in an X-ray photograph. As the rays diverge from the focus of the tube, objects close to the recording surface (film) are magnified to a lesser extent than those which are further away.

According to the invention, a horizontal beam of X-rays diverging from the focus in a horizontal direction only, is made to sweep in a vertical direction over an object so as to produce an impression on a sensitized surface placed perpendicular to the beam. The resulting photograph is true as regards vertical dimensions. Alternatively a vertical beam moving horizontally may be used to produce a photograph which is true as regards horizontal distances.

The beam of X-rays is produced by fixing on to the cone of a standard X-ray tube-cone unit a radio-opaque four-sided hollow shield at the other end of which is mounted a radio-opaque slide with either a horizontal or a vertical slit. If the whole combination is now given either a vertical or a horizontal movement, the desired results could be obtained.

Suitable apparatus for producing the necessary movement is described.

"Manufacture of neutral potash salts, such as muriate of potash, sulphate of potash and/or their mixed salts (for use as fertilizers or in industry) from coconut husk ash, or similar vegetable ashes or mineral substances of an alkaline reaction".

Abstract.—The inventor states that ashes of vegetable origin such as coconut husk ash are harmful to certain crops such as tea and tobacco, due to their alkalinity.

He proposes the manufacture of neutral potash salts from such ashes by the addition of chlorides or sulphates of Calcium, Magnesium, Iron (Ferrous or Ferric) or Aluminium to the aqueous extract of the ashes, till the solution is neutral, removal of the insoluble carbonates of calcium, &c., by precipitation and evaporation of the remaining solution.

He claims that such a process can be cheaply worked in Ceylon by the use of local deposits of calcium sulphate, or magnesium salts from the Government Salt Pans.

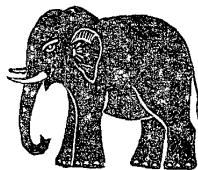

 - (d) the "wholesale dealers' maximum prices" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor;
 - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of Australian wheat flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (f) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Australian wheat flour sold by a wholesale dealer shall include the price of the container in which such flour is sold.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices, do by this Order—

- revoke with effect from this date my Order dated September 16, 1942, published on pages 1851 and 1852 of *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,007 of September 16, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of soaps of the descriptions and grades specified in column 1 of the Schedule thereto;
- fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the manufacturer’s maximum price to a wholesale dealer per case, the maximum wholesale price per case, the maximum retail price per box and the maximum retail price per tablet or bar, as the case may be, above which soap of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - “manufacturer” shall mean any person or firm or association of persons who manufactures any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
 - a “wholesale dealer” shall mean any person who has been in the habit of selling for resale any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
 - “manufacturer’s maximum price” shall apply to any sale by wholesale by a manufacturer to a wholesale dealer;
 - “maximum wholesale price” shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by a manufacturer to a wholesale dealer;
 - “maximum retail price” shall apply to all sales by retail;
- direct that every trader who at any premises within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo exposes for sale soap of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of soap of that description and grade;
- direct that every person who sells soap of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that soap a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - the date of the sale;
 - the quantity of soap sold;
 - the description and grade of soap sold;
 - the price paid for the quantity of soap sold; and
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

(vi.) direct that every trader who has at any time during the three months prior to this date sold any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of that article available for sale shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the effect that stocks of that article are not available for sale for the time being.
