THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61 of 1939.

Order under section 6.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order divide the town for which the Avissawella Urban Council is to be constituted under that Ordinance into the five electoral divisions defined in the Schedule hereto.

#### Schedule.

### Electoral Division No. 1. (Avissawella).

North: From a point at the centre of the junction of Colombo-Yatıyantota Main Road and the cross road eastwards along the centre line of the said Main Road and the old road to the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of its junction with Heen Ela alias Bisodola, thence south-westwards, north-westwards and southwards along the centre line

of the said Heen Ela alias Bisodola to a point opposite the south-eastern corner of lot P310 m Preliminary Plan 3,289.

South: From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of the said Heen Ela alias Bisodola till it meets the centre of its junction with Kotahera Ela, thence north-westwards along the centre line of Kotahera Ela as far as the centre of the Colombo-Ratnapura Main Road.

West: From the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of Colombo-Ratnapura Main Road to the centre of its junction with the Cross Road, thence northeastwards along the centre line of the Cross Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

### Electoral Division No. 2. (Sitawaka East).

North: From a point at the centre of the Avissawella-Yatıyantota Railway line where it meets the northern limit

North: From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area until it meets the northern extremity of the western limit of Division No. 2.

East: From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the western limits of Divisions Nos. 2 and 1 as far as the centre of the junction of the Cross Road and Colombo-Ratnapura Main Road.

South: From the last mentioned point north-westwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the Colombo-Ratnapura Mam Road as far as the 29th Mile Post.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern boundary of the Division.

## Electoral Division No. 4. (Horagaslanga).

North: From the western extremity of the southern limit of Division No. 3 north-eastwards and south-eastwards along the said limit as far as the centre of the junction of Colombo-Yatiyantota Road and Colombo-Ratnapura Road.

#### RECRUITMENT OF PROBATIONARY DIVISIONAL REVENUE OFFICERS.

APPLICATIONS are invited from applicants possessing the necessary qualifications, as set out in this notice, for appointment as Probationers in the schome of Divisional Revenue Officers. .

#### Method of Application.

- (a) Application on forms to be obtained from the Office of the Director of Education must be forwarded by registered post, addressed to the Director of Education, Branch E, Galle Face Secretariat, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo, and must reach that office on or before November 10, 1942. No application received after that date will be considered. It is important that all necessary enclosures—vide (d) and (e) below—should be attached to and forwarded with the completed form of application.
- (b) Stamps to the value of Rs. 15 must be affixed to each application and cancelled by the applicant's signature over
- (c) Two referees must be named in the form, who from their personal knowledge of the candidate can testify to his character and capacity.

(d) Originals of recent testimonials, not more than three in number, together with copies thereof, must be attached to the application form. The originals will be returned and the

(e) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth together with a copy thereof must be attached to the form of application. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted examination. as substitutes for birth certificates.

### Number of Vacancies and Conditions of Appointment.

3. Four Probationers will be selected for the Maritime area, eleven for the Kandyan area, and five for the Tamil speaking area. Each Probationer will be attached to a Kachcheri and will rank as a Junior Staff Officer. He will undergo a period of training in Kachcheri as well as in district works in the course of which he will be expected to qualify himself for appointment as a Divisional Revenue Officer on the occurrence of a vacancy in a Chief Headman's Post. He will not be appointed a Divisional Revenue Officer until the Government Agent has certified that he has fully qualified himself in all respects including the passing of an exacting test in the language chiefly spoken in the district and a less severe test in the other vernacular language

### Pay and Conditions of Service.

A probationer while in training will be paid at the rate of Rs. 1,800 per annum. The normal period of training of Rs. 1,800 per annum. The normal period of training will be 18 months, but this period may be extended if necessary. During the training period the Probationer will be expected to pass examinations in the vernacular languages, in law, accounts and in any other subject included in his training programme in which it is thought necessary to test his knowledge. When a probationer has passed all his examinations, except that in the second language, and has been given a certificate by the Government Agent to the effect been given a certificate by the Government Agent to the effect that he is fully capable in all respects of acting as a Divisional Revenue Officer he will receive payment at the rate of Rs. 2,100 per annum, unless he is placed in charge of a division in a probationary capacity. From the date of such appointment he will be placed on the scale Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 6,000 by annual increments of Rs. 200, but will not receive any increment until he has passed the second language examination. Confirmation will not take place until a Divisional Revenue Officer has been in charge of a division for a period of not less than 2 years, is

fully qualified and has been certified fit for confirmation by the Government Agent.

A Divisional Revenue Officer will on confirmation be allowed to proceed along the scale, Rs. 3,000, to Rs. 6,000, by annual increments of Rs. 200, subject to the passing of efficiency bars at Rs. 4,200 and Rs. 5,200. His post will be pensionable and he will be liable to transfer only within the administrative area for which he has been selected. Probationers are subject to the Public Service, Financial, Leave and other regulations applicable to public officers.

If a Probationer fails to pass his examinations (except that in the second language) within 2 years of appointment, or if he passes his other examinations but fails to pass the second language examination within 4 years of appointment, the question whether he should be continued in service will be

considered.

#### Qualifications of Candidates.

- Every candidate must possess the following minimum qualifications:
  - (1) \*He must be a Ceylonese.
  - (2) He must have been born not later than December 1, 1920, and not earlier than December 1, 1917.
  - (3) He must have passed at least the Senior School Certificate Examination English, or Cambridge Senior or London Matriculation.
  - (4) He must be of good moral character and of sound constitution physically fit for service in any part of the Island.
  - (5) Successful candidates will be required to pass a Medical examination the fee for which must be paid by the candidate.

#### Method of Selection.

- For the purpose of recruitment of Probationers the Island will be regarded as comprising three administrative areas, viz., Low-country, Kandyan, and Tamil speaking; in each case the successful candidate will be selected for service in one of these three areas and an officer will subsequently be transferable only within the area for which he was originally selected. The selection will be made by a Selection Board having regard to two considerations, viz.:-
  - (i.) the results of a competitive examination, and
  - (u.) the requirements of the particular area in which the selected candidate is intended to serve.

#### Examination.

- 7. A competitive examination will be held for the selection of candidates wishing to join the Divisional Revenue Officers Service. The examination will be in two parts, viz., (a) Written and (b) Personal Interview.
  - (a) The written examination will be held at Batticaloa, Colombo, Galle, Jaffna, and Kandy, commencing on January 29, 1943. Candidates should state in their application forms at which centre they wish to be examined. Any candidate who fails to indicate where he wishes to be examined will be entered for the centre closest to his place of address. dates will however be required to attend at Colombo or any other centre if circumstances so require.
  - (b) The personal interview, which will be restricted to candidates attaining a certain standard in the written examination, will be held only in Colombo on a date which will be communicated to candidates after the written examination. Candidates will be required to produce at the interview the original certificates granted in respect of any examinations they have passed.

\* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

(a) A British subject born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
(b) A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a); or
(c) A British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances,
(c) A British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

The interview will be similar to that at present conducted at the Civil Service Entrance Examination.

The examinations in English, Sinhalese and Tamil will be designed to test the candidate's understanding and command of the language. In the English paper a passage will be set for a summary or precis.

Questions in General Knowledge will be designed to test the knowledge and interest of candidates (a) in the more important topics of the day, and (b) in literature, world geography, and other subjects.

### GENERAL CLERICAL SERVICE EXAMINATION.

Date of Examination

1. A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the General Clerical Class, Grade II., will be held in Colombo, Kandy, Galle, and Jaffna, on December 5, 1942.

### Salary and Conditions of Service-

2. (a) The salary and conditions of service on which successful candidates will be appointed will be those fixed for the General Clercial Class after a decision has been reached on the recommendations of the Select Committee of the State Council appointed to consider the Reports of the Retrenchment Commission, on the structure, salary and conditions of service of the General Clerical Service. If any candidates take up duties before a decision has been reached they will receive a provisional salary of Rs. 600 per annum and their other conditions of service will provisionally be those applicable to officers recruited to Class III. of the General Clerical Service after June 1, 1934. Candidates must clearly understand however that the salary scale and conditions of service which will be finally applicable to them will be those fixed by Government. ment when a final decision has been reached on the recommendations of the Select Committee and that they will have no claims to special consideration on the ground that they have been appointed before a final decision has been reached on their terms of service.

THE annual report of the Commissioners of the Loan Board for the year 1941 is submitted together with the statement of Loan Board funds duly audited by the Auditor-General.

Interest.—The amount of interest collected during the year amounted to Rs. 452,809.11 as against Rs. 434,715.57 in 1940. The interest collected was insufficient for the payment of two half-yearly dividends of 2 per cent. each, and therefore a sum of Rs. 590.30 had to be withdrawn from Profits Account to allow the payment of these dividends.

#### STATUTE V.

Constitution, &c., of the Facultie's. (Section 22 (2) ).

1. Each Faculty shall consist of-

#### Ex-officio members-

(a) The professors, Readers and Lecturers of the Departments of Study comprised in the Faculty, and such other persons as may be specially declared by Statute to be ex-officio members of any particular Faculty.

. Other members

- (b) Such teachers of the University as may be appointed to the Faculty by the Council on the recommendation of the Senate.
- (c) Such other persons as may be appointed by the Council on the recommendation of the Senate or specially declared by Statute to be members of, or to be included in, any particular Faculty.
- 2. The total number of members of each Faculty shall not in the case of the Faculties of Arts, Science and Medicine exceed thirty, and in the case of any other Faculty fifteen, unless it shall be otherwise prescribed in the Statutes m respect of any Faculty.

3. Nothing contained in this Statute shall prevent any officer of the University or other person from being a member of two or more Faculties at any one time:

Provided that no person shall at any one time be the Dean of more than one Faculty.

The Vice-Chancellor shall be an ex-officio member of

all Faculties. The Director of Public Works shall be an ex-officio

member of the Faculty of Engineering, if and when a Faculty of Engineering is established.

6. The Director of Agriculture shall be an ex-officio member

of the Faculty of Agriculture, if and when a Faculty of Agriculture is established.

The Archaeological Commissioner shall be an ex-officio member of the Faculty of Arts.

- The Faculty of Medicine shall include the Director of Medical and Santary Services and three mombers of the Ceylon Medical Council nominated from time to time by the said Council.
- The Faculty of Law shall include three members of the Council of Legal Education nominated from time to time by the said Council.

10. The term of membership of every member of a Faculty other than the ex-officio members shall be three years:

Provided that a member of a Faculty appointed or nominated under the provisions of clauses 1 (b), 8 or 9 shall retain his membership for so long only within the said term of three years as he continues to perform the functions of the post or retains the membership m virtue of which he was eligible for appointment or nomination as a member of such Faculty.

11. An appointed or nominated member of a Faculty who retires shall, subject to the proviso to clause 10, be eligible for

re-appointment or re-nomination, as the case may be.

12. The Dean of the Faculty shall preside at all meetings of the Faculty:

Provided that in the absence of the Dean the members present shall elect a chairman from among themselves.

13. The proceedings of every meeting of a Faculty shall be communicated by the Registrar to the Senate.

14. Five members of a Faculty shall form a quorum.

- (iii.) direct that, for the purposes of this Order, any sale of any tyre or tube for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iv.) direct that every trader, who at any premises in Ceylon sells tyres or tubes of any description and grade specified in the Schedules I. and II. hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for tyres and tubes of that description and grade;
- (v.) direct that every person, who sells tyres or tubes of any description and grade specified in the Schedules I. and II. hereto, shall give to every purchaser of tyres or tubes a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the quantity, description, and grade of the tyres or tubes sold;
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of the tyres or tubes sold; and
  - (c) the date of the sale;
- (vi.) direct that every trader, who sells or has at any time during the three months prior to this date sold any article mentioned in the Schedules hereto, and has for the time being no stocks of that article available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the effect that stocks of that article are not available for sale for the time being.

#### **EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE)**

ORDER IN COUNCIL CONTINUING IN FORCE THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACT, 1939 AS AMENDED BY SUBSEQUENT ENACTMENTS.

#### At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 6th day of August, 1942.

Present:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by subsection (1) of section eleven of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939 as amended by subsection (3) of section one of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1940 the first mentioned Act was limited to expire at the end of a period of two years beginning with the twenty-fourth day of August nineteen hundred and thirty-nine unless continued in force in accordance with the said subsection (1):

And whereas by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the said subsection (1), the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939 as amended by any subsequent enactment was continued in force for the further period of one year beginning with the twenty-fourth day of August, nincteen hundred and forty-one:

Any whoreas an Address has been presented to His Majesty by each House of Parliament in pursuance of the said subsection (1) praying that the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939 as amended by any subsequent enactment be continued in force

The hard of the year beginning with the twenty-fourth day of August nineteen hundred and forty-two:

Now therefore His Majesty in pursuance of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered that the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939 as amended by any subsequent enactment shall continue in force for the further period of one year beginning with the twenty-fourth day of August nuneteen hundred and forty-two.
