## THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

## Delegation of Powers under Regulation 35.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of Regulation 35 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby delegate to every Government Agent within his province and every Assistant Government Agent within his district the power under paragraph (1) of that Regulation to authorise the use of any land (other than a land on which there is an established range) for field firing and artillery practice by military forces, subject to the restriction that the said power shall be exercised by any such Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent only in respect of land situated in an area which is uninhabited or which, in the opinion of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, as the case may be, is so sparsely populated that sufficient warning can be given to every inhabitant of the area to enable him to leave the area prior to the commencement of any firing practice on the land.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies to sanction the following amendments to the Minutes of the Ceylon Civil Service dated January 13, 1932:—

- (a) The addition of the post of Commissioner for Development, of Agricultural Marketing and the post of Public Trustee to the list of posts in Class I. included in paragraph 6 of the Minutes; and the transfer of the post of Secretary to the Governor from Class II. to Class I.
- (b) The alteration of the designation of the post of Registrar-General and Director of Commercial Intelligence to Registrar-General.
- (c) The deletion of the existing paragraphs 16 to 22 of the Minutes and the substitution of the following paragraphs therefor:

EXAMINATIONS FOR CADETS BEFORE PROMOTION  
OVER THE 1ST EFFICIENCY BAR AND FOR  
CLASS II. OFFICERS BEFORE THE  
2ND EFFICIENCY BAR.

## First Examination.

16. Every Cadet will be required, before he can receive a substantive appointment, to pass an examination in the subjects hereinafter specified; provided that a Cadet who is (a) a qualified Barrister-

at-law or an Advocate of the Scottish Bar, or (b) a qualified Advocate of the Supreme Court of Ceylon, or (c) a qualified Proctor of the Supreme Court of Ceylon, shall be exempted from passing the prescribed examination in law.

17. Any Cadet who is of Ceylonese descent will be required to take up for his examination whichever of the Ceylon languages has not been spoken by, or familiar to, him as a child.

## Second Examination.

18. Gentlemen in the Civil Service are required, before they can be promoted over the 2nd Efficiency Bar, to pass a second examination of the character hereinafter described; provided that an officer who is (a) a qualified Barrister-at-law or an Advocate of the Scottish Bar, or (b) a qualified Advocate of the Supreme Court of Ceylon, or (c) a qualified Proctor of the Supreme Court of Ceylon, shall be exempted from passing the prescribed examination in law.

## Scheme of Examination.

19. The subjects of examination are the Sinhalese and Tamil languages, Law, the System of Accounts employed in the Government offices, History and Geography of Ceylon, the Statement of Administrative Procedure and the Public Service Regulations of the Ceylon Government.

20. At their first examination candidates are examined in Sinhalese or Tamil (lower standard), selecting whichever language they may prefer, subject to the rule in section 17, in Law, in Accounts and in the History and Geography of Ceylon; at their second, in Law, in Accounts, the Public Service Regulations, the Statement of Administrative Procedure and both languages. In their first examination, candidates are required to sit for all four subjects at the same time, but should they pass in any one or more subjects and fail in the remainder, they are not required to sit again for the subjects in which they have passed. Attention is drawn to the provisions of Financial Regulation 1239. In the second examination candidates may take up various subjects if they so desire, in four sections on four separate occasions; section (a) consisting of Law; section (b) consisting of a paper on Accounts and a paper on the Public Service Regulations and Statement of Administrative Procedure; section (c) consisting of a higher standard examination in the language taken up by them at the first examination; and section (d) consisting of the second language (lower standard).

21. The subjects and scheme of both the first and second examinations are as follows:—

## I.—Languages.

(i) In the first examination the candidate is required to write an English translation of two out of three short Sinhalese or Tamil letters or reports from headmen written in different running hands. He is required to translate a short passage from an official paper or document into Sinhalese or Tamil; to dictate offhand the translation into Sinhalese or Tamil of an English letter, report, or other official paper to a Sinhalese or Tamil, who will take it down in writing; to read and translate an extract from a Sinhalese or Tamil newspaper, and from a letter or petition in Sinhalese or Tamil put into his hands for the first time; to answer in writing a paper on elementary grammar in which particular stress will be laid upon syntax and idiom; and to be tested in conversation so as to satisfy the examiner as to his power of understanding Sinhalese or Tamil of different classes, and of making himself understood by them, both in common conversation and in the usual course of official business.

(ii) The marks required for a pass in this first examination will be 50 per cent. in conversation and a total of 45 per cent. in all subjects.

(iii) The second or higher standard examination in the language will be similar in its nature to the first, but more difficult in degree. The candidate will be required to act as an interpreter between the examiner and Sinhalese or Tamils entirely ignorant of English.

(iv) The marks required for a pass in this second examination will be 65 per cent. in conversation and a total of 50 per cent. in all subjects.

(v) The examination in the second language (see Section 20 (d)) will be of the same standard as the first examination in the first language; the marks required for a pass will be 50 per cent. in conversation and 45 per cent. in all subjects.

- (1) Penal Code.
- (2) Criminal Procedure Code.

(ii) Candidates will be required to obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. of the marks in each subject in both examinations, and a minimum of 40 per cent. of the total marks in the first examination and 50 per cent. of the total marks in the second examination, for a pass.

## III.—Accounts.

(i) The subjects of examination will be for both the First and Second Examination—

(1) The Financial Regulations of the Ceylon Government except Chapters VI., XI.—XIX., and XX., sections 6 to end.

(2) The Estimates of the current year, e.g., their arrangement, the heads of revenue, &c.

(3) Ordinances relating to specific accounts dealt with in Kachcheres.

(ii) Candidates will be required to obtain 40 per cent. of the total marks for a pass in the first examination and 75 per cent. in the second examination.

(iii) A candidate who obtains 75 per cent. of the total marks in the first examination will be excused from appearing for the second examination.

## IV.—History and Geography of Ceylon.

(i) At their first examination candidates will be examined in the history of Ceylon and will be expected to display general knowledge of the Island, including its geography. Those members of the Civil Service who were appointed before September 1, 1938, will be exempted from this section of the examination.

## V.—Public Service Regulations.

(i) At their second examination candidates will be examined in the Public Service Regulations and Statement of Administrative Procedure contained in the Ceylon Government Manual of Procedure. Those members of the Civil Service who were appointed before September 1, 1938, will be exempted from this section of the examination.

(ii) Candidates will be required to obtain 50 per cent. of the total marks for a pass.

2. As recommended in the Report of the Select Committee of the Legislative Council on the Police Force (see Sessional Paper XI.—1926), Ceylonese candidates for appointment as Police Probationers will undergo a qualifying literary examination and will be selected by the Governor.

All candidates will be required to obtain a nomination from the Governor in terms of section (4) (a) of these regulations.

3. The qualifying literary examination will be held in Colombo. The examination will be held in May, 1943. Candidates will be informed of the exact date later.

4. *Method of Application.*—(a) Candidates must obtain the permission of the Governor before they can become eligible to sit at the examination. Application, on forms which can be obtained from the Chief Secretary's Office, must be sent in time for delivery to the Chief Secretary not later than Monday, November 30, 1942. No applications received after that date will be considered.

(b) On the forms supplied the candidate must fill in full particulars regarding his career and qualifications. He must name on the form two referees who can answer from personal knowledge for his character and ability. He must also obtain a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner giving his height and chest measurement. Any special remarks as to physical development, &c., should be made in the appropriate cage of the form of application.

The form when completed should be sent to the Chief Secretary's Office accompanied by the following documents (with copies):—

- (i.) birth certificate (or a certified copy). Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted.
- (ii.) the educational certificate required by section 5 (iv.)
- (iii.) testimonials (not more than six), including those from schools.
- (iv.) certificates from referees. These should not be seen by the candidates and should be enclosed in a sealed envelope. The testimonials referred to in (iii.) above can also be sent in this way if the candidate so desires.

The original documents will be returned, copies being retained in the Secretariat.

(c) Applications from candidates already in Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving.

5. *Conditions of Eligibility.*—(i.) Every candidate must be a Ceylonese. For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

- (a) a British subject born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (b) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a); or
- (c) a British subject deemed by the Governor, with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

(ii.) He must have been educated either in Ceylon or in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

(iii.) He must have been born not later than August 1, 1924, and not earlier than August 1, 1917.

(iv.) He must have passed the Intermediate Examination in Arts or Science of the University of London or any examination which the Chief Secretary may hold to be equivalent, provided that in the case of a Sub-Inspector or an Inspector in the Ceylon Police who joined the Force prior to October 1, 1937, the educational standard will be the London Matriculation Examination or the Cambridge Senior Examination with exemption from the London Matriculation.

(v.) He must be of good character.

(vi.) He must be unmarried.

(vii.) He must be of sound constitution, and physically fit for service in any part of the Island.

(viii.) His minimum eye-sight must be 6/6 and 6/12, and colour vision must be normal. A candidate who requires the use of glasses will not be eligible.

*Note.*—No person will be deemed eligible as a candidate for examination who has not furnished satisfactory proof that he possesses all the qualifications set forth above.

6. *Permission to sit at the Examination.*—Candidates who have complied with the above instructions will be informed in due course whether they have been granted permission to sit at the examination. The grant of such permission will be at the absolute discretion of the Governor and he will not be prepared to give reasons for his decision on any application.

7. *Selection after the Examination.*—Qualification in the literary examination will not in itself imply that a candidate will be ultimately selected for appointment. Candidates who have qualified in the literary examination will be required to appear before a Selection Board at their own expense.

Those candidates will be selected who appear to the Governor to be most suitable on grounds of character, personal fitness, general education, and subsequent training and experience (if any).

The selection of the candidate will be at the absolute discretion of the Governor and he will not be prepared to give reasons for his decision on any application. Any attempt to interview any public servant or any member of the Selection Board on behalf of any candidate will render the candidate liable to disqualification.

8. *Reserve List.*—When a candidate has been selected to fill the existing vacancy, it will be at the discretion of the Governor to place certain of the unsuccessful candidates who have qualified in the literary examination on a reserve list. From this list candidates will be selected to fill any further vacancies that may occur during the course of the year 1943. No indication can be given, however, as to the possible occurrence of such vacancies.

9. *Medical Examination.*—Selected candidates will be required to undergo a medical examination as to physical fitness for service as a Police Officer in any part of the Island. No candidate will be finally selected who does not pass this medical examination.

10. *Scheme of Examination.*—The following are the subjects of the qualifying examination:—

Candidates may not offer more than two subjects in Part II. They must offer English and General Knowledge in Part I.

Successful candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the whole examination as to satisfy the examiners.

*Fee.*—Each candidate who sits for the examination should pay a fee of £5, which amount is due to the Civil Service Commissioners, and an additional local fee of Rs. 20 to meet the cost of supervision and other incidental expenses in connection with the examination. Instructions with regard to the manner in which the fee is to be paid will be sent with the Order for Admission to the examination which, together with a Time Table, will be forwarded in time to reach candidates about a fortnight before the examination.

11. The present establishment of the Ceylon Police Force is given below:—

*Note.*—Every Ceylonese Probationer will be subject to any regulations concerning Probationers (not inconsistent with this

paper) which may from time to time be made by the Ceylon Government, including regulations as to examinations in vernacular languages, riding test, &c.

Any probationer who may fail to pass the prescribed examinations within four years, or may be found unfit for Police duties, will be liable to removal from the service.

Before an officer's salary reaches Rs. 4,200 per annum and again before it reaches Rs. 4,800 per annum, Rs. 6,900 per annum, Rs. 9,000 per annum, and Rs. 10,125 per annum, there is a strict efficiency bar; an officer will not be permitted to draw further increments beyond this bar unless his service is thoroughly satisfactory in every respect, and until he has shown sufficient ability, initiative and promise to justify the expectation that he will be fully capable of carrying out efficiently and will accept the further responsibility of his new rank.

#### Pension.

Subject to the exceptions and provisions contained in the Government Pension Minute, pension may be paid as follows to Officers who retire from Service owing to ill-health on being condemned by a Medical Board or on attaining the age of 55 years:—

- (a) After 10 years' service, one quarter of the officer's salary.
- (b) 1/720th of the officer's salary is added for each additional month's service
- (c) The maximum amount payable is  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the salary which can be drawn after 35 years' service.

Note.—(i.) If an officer retires before the completion of 10 years' service on being condemned by a Medical Board, he may be granted a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/12th of a month's salary for each month of service.

(ii.) If an officer confirmed in a pensionable post dies while in service after the completion of 5 years' service (which may include service in any territory under His Majesty's protection) his dependent or dependents may be paid, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, a gratuity not exceeding one year's pensionable emoluments.

#### Widows' and Orphans' Pension Scheme.

An officer's widow and orphans are eligible for a pension from the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund to which every officer contributes monthly 4 per cent. of his salary from the date of confirmation.

13. In the case of any candidate appointed on or after the date on which a new scale of salary and conditions of service are adopted as a result of the recommendations of the Select Committee on the Reports of the Retrenchment Committee such new salary scales and conditions of service will be applicable. Such a candidate will have no claim to the salary scale and conditions of service set out above.

#### II.—SYLLABUS.

*Handwriting.*—Deductions for handwriting which is at all difficult to read will be made up to 20 per cent. of the maximum marks for the written subjects,

1. *English.*—The tests in English will be designed to value understanding and command of the language. A passage will be set for summary or précis.

In English, and in every other subject, deductions for bad English spelling will be made up to 10 per cent. of the maximum mark.

2. *General Knowledge.*—The questions in General Knowledge will be designed to test the knowledge and interest of candidates (1) in the more important topics of the day, (2) in literary, geographical, and other questions.

3. *Latin.*—Translation and prose composition.

4, 5. *French, German.*—Translation from the language; set composition; free composition. For German composition candidates may use either German or English characters.

6. *Modern History.*—British history, including British colonial history, from 1660 to the present day, together with European history during the same period. European history will be treated mainly as affecting British history, and with special reference to the following subjects:—Decline of the power of Holland. The ambitions of Louis XIV. The rivalry of England and France for colonial empire in India and America. Frederick the Great and the rise of Prussia. The French Revolution and the First Empire. The unification of Italy. Bismarck and the Union of Germany. The action of Russia in the Near East, Middle East, and Far East. The causes and results of the Great War (1914-1918). Such knowledge of geography as is necessary to make the history comprehensible will be required.

7. *Lower Mathematics: Arithmetic.*—Arithmetic, including simple methods of dealing with statistical data. The mensuration of plane areas and simple solid bodies. The determination of area, volume, and density by displacement, by weighing, &c.

*Geometry.*—The substance of Euclid's six books. Elementary ideas in solid geometry treated informally: straight lines, planes, rectangular blocks, wedges, pyramids, cylinders, cones, and spheres. The construction of plans and elevations.

*Algebra.*—Formulas, their evaluation and transformation; the notion of a function; rate of change. The gradient and area of a graph. The solution of equations, linear and quadratic, simple and simultaneous. The use of logarithms; the meaning and simplest properties of negative and fractional indices. Arithmetical and finite geometrical sequences.

*Trigonometry.*—Solution of plane triangles; graphs of trigonometrical functions; use of four-figure tables; addition theorems.

*Mechanics.*—The lever, the inclined plane, the pulley, the balance, and other simple machines; the composition and resolution of forces in one plane; moments; simple graphical methods; simple cases of equilibrium; properties of the centre of gravity; work; velocity ratio, mechanical advantage, and efficiency of a machine. The composition and resolution of velocities and accelerations in one plane; rectilinear motion under uniform acceleration; the conservation of linear momentum; work, energy, and power; graphical treatment of varying velocities, accelerations, and forces. Proofs of the parallelogram and triangle of forces, and of the principle of moments will not be asked for. Questions will not be set on curvilinear motion.

8. *Higher Mathematics.*—Includes Lower Mathematics, together with:—

*Geometry.*—Elements of solid geometrical drawing.

Equations to the straight line, circle, ellipse, parabola, hyperbola, and other simple curves, in rectangular co-ordinates. Acquaintance is expected only with the simplest theorems about the curves. Candidates are free to use the methods of the infinitesimal calculus.

*Algebra.*—Elementary knowledge of the use of indeterminate coefficients, especially with partial fractions. Easy computation, including the numerical solution of equations.

*Calculus.*—Differentiation and integration of simple standard forms and other forms depending on them; application to easy geometrical, mechanical, and physical problems, to turning values and the expansion of simple algebraic and trigonometrical functions. A working knowledge (without rigorous fundamental demonstrations) of the elementary infinite series for  $(1+x)^n$ ,  $e^x$ ,  $\log_e(1+x)$ , and their use in approximate calculations.

*Mechanics.*—The equilibrium of bodies in two dimensions; link polygons. Harmonic motion. Simple and conical pendulums. Projectiles. Simple cases of linked mechanisms. The rotation of a rigid body about a fixed axis. The action of such mechanical devices as crank mechanisms, engine governors, cranes, brakes.

9. *Physics-Plus-Chemistry.*—Two question papers will be set. One paper will be two-thirds Electricity and one-third Chemistry, and the other paper two-thirds Physics other than Electricity and one-third Chemistry. In each paper candidates will be required to answer a question in Chemistry in order to obtain full credit.

*Electricity.*—The fundamental ideas concerning electric currents, difference of potential resistance; construction and mode of action of the commoner primary batteries. The fundamental laws of electrolysis, and their application in secondary cells and electro-plating. Heating effect of a current; its application in incandescent and arc lamps, electric welding, cooking, &c. The phenomena of permanent and induced magnetism in iron; fields of magnetic force; the magnetic field associated with an electric current. The construction and action of an electro-magnet; application in electric bells and telephones. The simpler phenomena of electro-magnetic induction; broad principles and applications of the induction coil, magneto, dynamo, and motor. The fundamental ideas concerning wireless telegraphy. The simpler methods of measuring electric current, difference of potential, and resistance; practical definitions of ampere, volt, and ohm. Ohm's law. Construction and mode of action of simple measuring instruments; electric transmission of power by direct current; joule, watt, Board of Trade unit of electric energy.

*Physics other than Electricity: General.*—Principles of measurement. Solids, liquids, and gases.

*Hydrostatics.*—Fluid pressure; floating bodies. Determination of specific gravity. Gaseous pressure. Boyle's law. Atmospheric pressure; barometers. Air and water pumps and other simple instruments.

*Heat.*—Temperature; thermometers, Specific heat, latent heat calorimeters. Expansion; measurement and simple illustrations. Transmission of heat; convection, conduction, and radiation; application to heating and ventilating. Vaporization; distillation; humidity, fog and cloud. Heat considered as energy; mechanical equivalent. Generation of heat; calorific values.

*Optics.*—Transmission, reflexion, refraction of light. Prisms and lenses; the formation of images. Construction of simple telescopes and microscopes. The eye; spectacles; intensity; principles of illumination; photometry. Dispersion; spectroscopes; colour.

*Chemistry: General Chemistry.*—Elements, compounds, and mixtures. Laws of chemical combination. Equivalents, molecular and atomic weights. Structural formulae and valency. Outlines of the properties of solutions. Heat of reaction.

*Inorganic Chemistry.*—The chemical properties of oxygen, hydrogen, nitrogen, chlorine, carbon, sulphur, phosphorus, and their common compounds. The general characteristics and behaviour of the metals potassium, calcium, aluminium, copper, zinc, mercury, tin, lead, and iron. The preparation (without technical details) and uses of chemicals of industrial importance, such as oxygen, soda, sulphuric acid, coal gas, and of the more important metals.

*Organic Chemistry.*—Outlines of the chemistry of the simple compounds of carbon, containing not more than two carbon atoms directly connected. An elementary knowledge of the properties of benzene and its simpler derivatives. The part played by carbon compounds in the life of animals and plants; fats, soap, starch, and sugars, treated descriptively. Carbon compounds as sources of energy.

In Chemistry a choice of questions will be given so that full marks may be scored without a knowledge of organic chemistry.

10. *Biology.*—(1) The contrast, with respect to energy, between living creatures and lifeless matter; the broad differences between plants and animals; respiration; anabolism and katabolism. The main types of nutrition and their place in the economy of living nature; nitrifying and nitrogen-fixing organisms, plants, grazing animals, the essential constituents of human food. Asexual and sexual reproduction as illustrated by yeast, common mould, a fern, and the flowering plant (*e.g.*, buttercup). The broad features of the development of the flowering plant (*e.g.*, bean) from the seed. The interaction between plant and animal life as illustrated in simple cases.

(2) A fuller treatment of the growth of plants; experiments upon germination, observations of the structure of seeds and bulbs, the characters of buds. Comparison of the eggs of an animal (*e.g.*, the fowl, the frog) with seeds. The more obvious features of the development of the frog from the ovum to the end of larval life.

(3) A fuller treatment of the physiology of the flowering plant. The chief ingredients of soil and their properties; main types of soil. The work of earthworms, soil bacteria and protozoa. Relations between plants and soil; arrangements subserving the absorption of water by roots and loss by leaves. Experiments on the influence of light upon growth; respiration and assimilation; the structure and functions of the green leaf. Food reserves. The main points in human physiology brought out by comparison and contrast with the physiology of the flowering plant.

(4) A fuller treatment of the reproduction of the flowering plant. The chief features in the structure of flowers; pollination and cross-pollination and the means by which these are effected; fruiting, and the main types of fruits; seed-dispersal.

(5) The broad features of the economy of the more important food-plants; the rotation of crops; the relation of crops to the needs of horses and of animals used for food.

(6) The evidence for the doctrine of biogenesis, and for the connexion of micro-organisms with putrefaction, disease, &c.

(7) The candidates should study some or all of the following types in illustration of the subject:—

Saccharomyces and bacteria; mucor and penicillium or eurotium; a unicellular green plant, *e.g.*, chlamydomonas or haematococcus or protococcus (a comparison of its nutrition with that of plants without chlorophyll); spirogyra, volvox, a moss, *e.g.*, funaria, a fern (a knowledge of the microscopical anatomy of the vegetative organs of the moss and fern is not required); flowering plants, both herbaceous and woody.

Amoeba; paramecium or vorticella; monocystis; hydra; obelia; taenia (externals and life-history); lumbricus; periplaneta; honey bee (externals and life-history); aphid (externals and life-history); scyllium (skeleton); scyllium or a teleost (externals, vascular and respiratory systems); a mammal (rabbit or rat; skeleton, rabbit or dog).

11. *Sinhalese, Tamil, Arabic (Modern).*—Translation from the language; set composition; free composition.

The employment of Ceylonese labour only to carry out the work tendered for or the employment of a definite percentage only of non-Ceylonese labour for such work will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contractor liable to have the contract cancelled and in addition to pay a penalty of Rs. 10 a day for each non-Ceylonese labourer employed by him on work or for each non-Ceylonese labourer employed by him over and above the percentage of non-Ceylonese labour which he is permitted to employ on the work in terms of his contract.

The word "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all persons born in Ceylon and no others.

Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

8. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons whose addresses must be given engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

9. The amount of security required will be Rs. 500 in cash. All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in clause 5 of this notice.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled. The tenderer is required to quote only one flat rate for carrying out the service both in gunny and cor bags. The rate, per 1,000 bags should be quoted separately for each of the following :—

- (a) For transporting bags of salt from the collection centres at Palatupana Lewaya to the Kirinda Stores and stacking the salt naked in the said stores as directed by the officer in charge.
- (b) For transport alone (loading and stacking, &c., at stores done by Salt Department labourers).

The service includes :—

- (i.) stitching bags filled with salt at collection centres, and
- (ii.) prompt removal of emptied bags from Kirinda to Palatupana.



The wastage allowed during transit is 1 per cent. and the value of any excessive wastage will be recovered from the amount due to the contractor. He must also pay overtime fees to the officers of the Salt Department in the event of such officers being called upon to work overtime at his instance.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right without question of rejecting any or all tenders and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

12. No contract may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognise a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

13. The Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota, may for reasons which appear to him sufficient give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

14. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract when applying for tender forms should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

A tenderer who has carried out contracts with the department but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders should state in which division or district or divisions or districts he has held contracts.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should state the name of such department and the district in which the service was rendered.

15. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Head of the Department acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

16. The contractor is liable to the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934.

17. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for.

The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided however that in exceptional circumstances the Head of the Department with whom the contract is entered into may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence is forbidden.

The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all natural born British subjects born of parents domiciled in Ceylon.

The Felling of Trees (Control) Order, 1942, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,985 of August 10, 1942, is hereby amended by the substitution, for paragraph 4 of that Order, of the following paragraph:—

4. Nothing in paragraph 2 shall be deemed to prohibit—

- (a) the felling of any dead tree; or  
 (b) the felling of any tree which is required to be cut down in pursuance of the powers conferred upon any officer of a local authority by any other written law; or  
 (c) the felling of any tree in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Telegraph Ordinance (Chapter 147); or  
 (d) the felling of any tree which has been certified under the hand of the proper officer to be a tree which is dangerous to life or property.
