THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

Order.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

(1) rescind the Order under the aforesaid regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,613 of May 10, 1940;

(2) in any case where a patent, or a registered design or a registered trade mark is in the proprietorship of an enemy, whether alone or jointly with another, authorise the payment to the Registrar of Patents or the Registrar of Designs or the Registrar of Trade Marks, as the case may be, of any fee payable in Ceylon for obtaining the renewal of the patent, or the renewal of the registration of the design or the trade mark, by or on behalf of a person who, not being an enemy, is—

- (a) the holder of a licence under the patent or a licence for the application of the registered design, or
- (b) the proprietor jointly with an enemy of the patent or the registered design or the registered trade mark, or
- (c) a person in whose favour an order in respect of the registered trade mark has been made by the Registrar, under section 5 of the Patents, Designs, Copyright and Trade Marks (Emergency) Ordinance, No. 32 of 1942;

and

(3) further authorise the payment to such person as aforesaid of the charges and expenses incurred by him in making the payment authorised by the preceding paragraph of this Order.

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

Regulations for the Kataragama Ilmaha Kachchi Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Ilmaha Kachchi Festival commencing in November, 1942.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations "camp area" includes—
 - (a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Dewale at Kataragama; and
 - (b) the area within a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama.
2. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Ilmaha Kachchi Festival, 1942, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to three days, namely, November 21 to 23 inclusive.
 - (b) No pilgrims shall arrive before November 21 or stay after November 23 in the camp area.
3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.
4. (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—
 - (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water, for drinking and for natural offices;
 - (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
 - (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
 - (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
 - (e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

(2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).

5. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by or with the approval of the Government Agent.

6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Government Agent.

7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer.

8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorised by him to issue such permits.

9. Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.

10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

11. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.

(2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Chief Officer of Police.

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Assistant to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer, or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Chief Officer of Police.

12. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the Sanitary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purpose of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be

deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

16. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,
1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Restriction of Meals) (No. 2) Regulations, 1942.

2. (1) In these regulations—

“catering business” means the business or undertaking of an hotel, restaurant, resthouse or other place of refreshment open to the public, or of any club, boarding-house, refreshment contractor or canteen, but does not include the business of an itinerant hawker;

“controlled dish” means a main dish or a subsidiary dish or a rice dish;

“dish” means any edible substance, or any combination or assortment of edible substances, which in the normal practice of serving meals is served at the same time as part of the same course;

“egg” means the egg of the domestic fowl including the domestic duck;

“fish” includes any part of a fish and any lobster, crab, crayfish or prawn, but does not include an oyster;

“game” includes rabbits and hare;

“main dish” means any dish (other than a rice dish) which contains meat, poultry or game;

“meat” means beef, mutton, lamb, veal and pork whether fresh, chilled, frozen or solid, ham, sausages, and the bones of any such meat provided in the ordinary course as part of any dish, edible offals, canned meat or canned meat products, cooked meats, galantines, brawn, jellied veal and any other meat and any mixture of such meat and any kind or variety of manufactured meat products including preserved or potted meats, meat pies, meat pastes and meat puddings;

“poultry” includes any kind of bird used for human food;

“public function” means any banquet, dinner, supper, lunch, breakfast or party at which six or more persons (not being members of the same family or household) partake of any food or refreshment;

“rice dish” means rice, or rice together with one or more curries or other preparations;

“specified food” means any one of the following foods:—

(a) meat,

(b) poultry,

(c) game,

(d) fish,

(e) one or two eggs (other than in the form of an omelette or scrambled eggs) with or without bacon or ham;

(f) omelette or scrambled eggs containing one or more eggs;

(g) cheese;

and includes any other food declared by the Food Controller by notification in the *Gazette* to be a specified food for the purposes of these regulations;

“subsidiary dish” means any dish (not being soup or a rice dish) which contains any specified food or foods other than meat, poultry or game.

(2) For the purposes of these regulations, a soup shall not be deemed to be a main dish unless five per centum or more of the weight thereof is solid meat, poultry or game.

3. (1) No person shall, at or in connexion with any catering business, or at any public function, obtain or consume, or attempt to obtain or consume, or supply for consumption, or offer or attempt to supply for consumption, at or for the purposes of any single meal, more controlled dishes than—

(a) one main dish and one subsidiary dish, or

(b) two subsidiary dishes, or

(c) one rice dish.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (1) of this regulation, where a rice dish consists of rice and two or more curries or other preparations not more than one such curry or preparation shall contain any meat, poultry or game.

4. Nothing in the preceding provisions of these regulations shall apply to any meal served or supplied to any patient in any hospital, nursing home or other similar institution.

5. The Defence (Restriction of Meals) Regulations, 1942 published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,871 of February 24, 1942, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby rescinded.

THE NATIONAL MUSEUMS ORDINANCE, NO. 31 OF 1942.

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Education under section 9 of the National Museums Ordinance, No. 31 of 1942, approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section.

Colombo, 16th November 1942. Minister for Education.*Regulations.*

1. These regulations may be cited as the National Museums Regulations, 1942.

2. The date—

(a) on and after which the Colombo Museum and the Kandy Museum shall, under section 3 (1) of the National Museums Ordinance, No. 31 of 1942, be deemed to be National Museums established under that Ordinance, and

(b) on which the Museum Ordinance shall, under section 14 of the first-mentioned Ordinance, be repealed,

shall be the date on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*.

3. Every National Museum shall be open to the public, free of charge from 10 A.M. to 6 P.M. daily, except on Fridays.

4. Every visitor entering the building of a National Museum with any camera, stick, umbrella, parcel, or other article shall entrust it to the officer or servant appointed as the custodian of articles brought by visitors. Such officer or servant shall issue a ticket, free of charge, to every visitor who entrusts any article to him, and shall, when that visitor leaves such building, return that article to him on his surrendering the ticket so issued.

5. No visitor to a National Museum shall—

- (1) behave in a disorderly manner within the premises of such Museum; or
- (2) bring, or cause or permit to be brought, any dog into such premises; or
- (3) smoke or spit, or chew tobacco or betel, within the building of such Museum; or
- (4) obstruct any officer or servant of such Museum in the discharge of his duties.

6. No person shall, without the written permission of the Director, take a photograph of any book, document, or object kept or preserved in a National Museum.

7. The reading room of a National Museum shall be open on the same days and during the same hours as such Museum: Provided that such reading room shall not be open on any day which is a public holiday under the Holidays Ordinance.

8. Any person may, during the time when the reading room of a National Museum is open, obtain for reference any book or document forming part of the library of such Museum if he produces to the officer-in-charge of such library—

- (1) a reader's ticket, which has been issued to him by the Director and which is in force, or
- (2) a special permit granted to him in that behalf by the Director.

9. (1) A reader's ticket may be obtained by any person by sending to the Director an application in that behalf on a form provided by the Director, together with recommendations from two persons who in the opinion of the Director are of good standing and reputation in the community.

(2) A reader's ticket shall cease to be in force after December 31 of the year in which such ticket has been issued: Provided that the Director may—

- (a) by endorsement on such ticket extend the period during which such ticket is in force; and
- (b) by letter sent to the holder of such ticket terminate the period during which such ticket is in force if such holder contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1), paragraph (2), or paragraph (4) of regulation 10.

10. (1) Every person who on any day obtains for reference any book or document forming part of the library of a National Museum shall—

- (a) in respect of that book or document sign and deliver to the officer-in-charge of such library a receipt on a form provided by such officer;
- (b) use the reading room of such Museum for the purpose of perusing that book or document; and
- (c) return that book or document to such officer within the time when such reading room is open on that day.

(2) No person shall use the reading room of a National Museum on any occasion without signing the book kept for that purpose.

(3) Where any person who obtains for reference any book or document forming part of the library of a National Museum returns that book or document to the officer-in-charge of such library, such officer shall deliver to that person the receipt given by him in respect of that book or document.

(4) No person who obtains for reference any book or document forming part of the library of a National Museum shall—

- (a) write on or mark that book or document; or
- (b) turn over the leaves of that book or document with moistened fingers; or
- (c) except with the written permission of the Director, make any tracing of anything contained in that book or document.

11. (1) The Director shall give to each member of the Advisory Committee of a National Museum at least ten days, written notice of the date, time, place, and business of every meeting of such Committee.

(2) The quorum for a meeting of the Advisory Committee of a National Museum shall be four members of such Committee.

12. The Director shall—

- (1) be the chief executive officer for the purpose of managing and administering National Museums;
- (2) be responsible for the proper care and custody of the books, documents, and objects kept or preserved in National Museums, and for the keeping of proper records of the financial and other transactions relating to such Museums;
- (3) cause inventories of the books, documents, and objects kept or preserved in each National Museum to be prepared, and such books, documents and objects to be appropriately numbered and labelled;
- (4) cause to be kept in a conspicuous place in each National Museum a book in which visitors may enter their names, complaints if any, and suggestions for the improvement of such Museum;
- (5) cause the number of visitors to each National Museum on each day to be recorded;
- (6) cause a statement of the number of visitors to each National Museum in each month, and a list of the exhibits in such Museum which were acquired in that month, to be displayed on the notice board of such Museum in the next following month;
- (7) cause to be kept in the reading room of each National Museum a book in which persons entitled to use such reading room may enter suggestions for the improvement of the library of such Museum;
- (8) publish the journal called and known as "Spolia Zeylanica";
- (9) prepare an administration report for each year, and, on or before the last day of February in the next following year, place before the Executive Committee of Education a copy of such report; and
- (10) assign to the officers and servants attached to each National Museum the duties to be performed by them.

13. The Director may—

- (1) in addition to the journal referred to in paragraph (8) of regulation 12, publish any book or journal dealing with matters relating to or connected with National Museums in Ceylon;
- (2) in his discretion, permit any person to have access, for the purposes of research, to any book, document, or object kept or preserved in such Museum;
- (3) publish in his discretion, in any book or journal which is authorised by these regulations to be published by him, the results of any research based on the exhibits in a National Museum; and
- (4) send to any person, for the purpose of identification, any book, document, or object given to or acquired for a National Museum.

14. An Assistant Director of a National Museum shall—

- (1) supervise the work of the officers and servants, other than the Director, of such Museum;
- (2) be responsible to the Director for keeping a proper record of the financial transactions relating to such Museum; and
- (3) perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Director

15. All regulations made under the Museum Ordinance are hereby rescinded with effect from the date specified in regulation 2.

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.
- (8) direct that every trader who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that article, on demand, a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of article sold ;
 - (b) the quantity of the article sold ;
 - (c) the date of the sale ;
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold ; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be.

RICE, WHOLE WHEAT AND PADDY.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Alfred Silva Kohomban Wickrema, Assistant Controller of Prices, Matara District, do by this Order:—

- (1) revoke my Order dated August 2, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 8,987 of August 14, 1942, prescribing the maximum prices for rice, wheat and paddy within the Revenue District of Matara;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price which is for the time being fixed by me at the Supply Stations as shown in the Second Schedule hereto increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 or 3 (as the case may be) of the first Schedule hereto as the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag above which rice, whole wheat or paddy of the description and grade specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the first Schedule hereto;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 2 to 10 of the Third Schedule hereto to be the authorized distributor's maximum retail price per measure above which rice, whole wheat or paddy of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail in respectively the 9 areas mentioned in the fourth Schedule;
- (4) direct that every trader who sells rice, whole wheat or paddy of the description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at these premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this order for rice, whole wheat or paddy of that description and grade;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell rice, whole wheat or paddy of any description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto which is adulterated with whole wheat, rice or paddy of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells rice, whole wheat or paddy of any description or grade mentioned in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that whole wheat, rice or paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of rice, whole wheat or paddy sold;
 - (b) the quantity of whole wheat, rice or paddy sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat, rice or paddy sold; and
 - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) a bag of paddy, whole wheat or rice (other than raw rice) shall contain not less than 76 cut measures;
 - (a) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 112 cut measures;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of rice, paddy or whole wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart equivalent to 1/32 part of a bushel;
 - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded from an authorized distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of rice, whole wheat or paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order.
