A PROCLAMATION.

A. CALDECOTT.

KNOW Ye that I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation give notice that, by virtue of the powers in me vested by section 40 of the Colombo Municipal Council Waterworks Ordinance (Chapter 161), I have confirmed the regulation made by the Colombo Municipal Council under section 39 of the Ordinance and set out hereunder.

Regulation.

The regulations set out in the Schedule to the Colombo Municipal Council Waterworks Ordinance (Chapter 161), are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in regulation 30, by the substitution, for paragraph (b), of the following new paragraph:—

"(b) for the purposes of hotels, of restaurants or of lodging houses, or of private boarding houses other than school boarding houses, educational hostels, religious hostels and refreshment rooms, and restaurants not open to the general public;"

(2) in regulation 32 (1), by the addition, immediately after paragraph (c), of the following new paragraph (d):—

"(d) for water supplied to premises, occupied wholly or in part, for domestic purposes and used through an external tap for horses or cattle or for washing vehicles, 50 cents per 1000 gallons;"

(3) in regulation 33, by the addition, immediately after paragraph (6), of the following new paragraph (7):—

"(7) For water supplied for domestic purposes and used through an external tap for washing vehicles—

(4) by the substitution, for regulation 34, of the following new regulation:—

"34. In the case of private boarding houses other than school boarding houses or educational or religious hostels, or in the case of houses taking in paying guests and paying consolidated rates, or a fixed sum in lieu of such rates, the Municipal Council may supply water at the rate of 50 cents per head per month on the average number of boarders or paying guests lodging at each such house during the month."

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation—

Atukorale, southwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundary of Ketakolagahawatta claimed by Podina Gunaratna and others, southwards and south-eastwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundary of Sarakkuwakumbura claimed by Mrs. Don Simon Gunaratna and western and southern boundaries of Davatagahakumbura claimed by N. S. Fernando Wanigasekera, southwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundary of Davatagahakumbura claimed by Dyalage Don Sardiel Appu and the western and southern boundaries of Pahurutotaduwa claimed by Dona Georgina Weerasekera, eastwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the southern boundary of Munamalghakumbura claimed by Don Francis Jayatilake and others and along the southern boundary of the dram which forms part of the southern boundary of the said land till it meets the landmark on the western boundary of Kalu Oya, thence eastwards in a line to the centre of Kalu Oya.

Amaratunga and others till it meets the landmark at the north-eastern corner of Hickgahawatta claimed by Ranemukadawage Simon Fernando and others, thence south-westwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the northern boundaries of Hickgahawatta claimed by Ranemukadawage Simon Fernando and others, Gorakagahawatta claimed by Ranepuradawage Rosa Fernando and others, the path leading to the village, Hickgahawatta claimed by Handunkadawage Bungina Fernando and others, and Kongahawatta claimed by Kaluwadawage Keta Fernando and others till it meets the landmark at the north-western corner of the said Kongahawatta, thence south-westwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundaries of the said Kongahawatta, the path to the west of Aithanpokunagatiya claimed by Endy Fernando and northern boundary of Palawatta claimed by I. Anjo Fernando till it meets the landmark on the eastern boundary of Aithan Ela, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of Aithan Ela which forms the western boundary of the said Palawatta till it meets the landmark at the south-western corner of the said land, thence westwards across the said Ela and along the northern boundary of the said Ela till it meets the landmark which is at a distance of about 1½ chains, thence across the said Ela and the road from Wattala to Kelaniya to the landmark on the southern boundary of the said road, thence south-westwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundary of Pokunagodakumbura claimed by H. Don Pauluappahamy and northern and western boundaries of Pokunagodakumbura claimed by Endy Fernando and brothers, westwards and south-westwards along the said

landmarked Town Survey boundary running through Gal-mangodawatta claimed by H. Don Pauluappahamy and along the northern boundaries of the said land and of Kopyawatta claimed by Algamage Don Jokmappahamy till it meets the landmark at the north-western corner of the said Kopyawatta, thence southwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundaries of the said Kopyawatta and Mullakumbura claimed by D. John Rodrigo, Mullakumbura claimed by Kulatungapatirage Don David and Dunwatta claimed by D. F. M. Kulatunga till it meets the landmark on the eastern boundary of the gravel road from Telengipata to Kelaniya thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road till it meets the 4th landmark on the said road thence southwards across the said road and through Dunwatta claimed by Kulatungapatirage Don David to the landmark on the northern boundary of Mudun Ela, thence in a line to the centre of the said Ela.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Mudun Ela to a point in prolongation of the north-western boundary of the path to the west of Meegahawatta claimed by R. Allis Fernando, thence south-westwards along the said prolongation and the western boundary of the said path and along the landmarked boundary in Town Survey Preliminary Plan 22 forming the western boundary of Meegahawatta claimed by Walmuwidawage Singhoni Fernando and others, and southwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundary of Meegahawatta claimed by Hewadawage Martin Fernando and others till it meets the landmark at the north-eastern corner of Kumbagodayyakumbura claimed by Ranamukadawage Sedris Fernando, thence westwards and south-westwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the northern boundaries of the four allotments of land called Kumbagodayyakumbura claimed by Ranamukadawage Sedris Fernando, Pahindaradawage Engo Fernando and others Mananadawage Mary Fernando and Ranepuradawage Themis Fernando till it meets the landmark on the eastern boundary of Kimbula Ela, thence in a line to the centre of Kimbula Ela, thence north-westwards along the centre line of the said Ela till it meets a point in prolongation of the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the northern boundary of Kirindimulla claimed by the Trustees of Kelani Vihare, thence westwards along the said prolongation and the northern boundary of the said land to the landmark on the boundary of Kelani Ganga, thence in a line to the centre of Kelani Ganga.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the centre of its junction with the Old Canal running from Kelani Ganga to Negombo Lake, thence north-eastwards and north-westwards along the centre line of the said Canal to the starting point of the northern limit of the Urban Council area.

2. The area bounded as follows:—

North: From a point at the centre of Kelani Ganga in prolongation of the northern boundary of Pangaha Ela south-eastwards along the said prolongation and the northern boundary of the said Ela till it meets the western boundary of the Main Road from Colombo to Chilaw, thence across the said road to the northern boundary of the said Ela, thence south-eastwards along the said boundary till it meets the landmarked northern boundary in Miscellaneous Survey Preliminary Plan 24 forming the southern boundary of Lunukumbura claimed by Mrs. G. Peter Peris, thence north-eastwards along the said landmarked boundary till it meets the landmark at the south-eastern corner of the said land.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the landmarked eastern boundary in Miscellaneous Survey Preliminary Plan 24 forming the western boundary of Midellagahakumbura claimed by Ranepuradewage Mary Fernando till it meets the landmark at the south-western corner of the said land, thence southwards along the said landmarked boundary in Miscellaneous Survey Preliminary Plan running through Midellagahakumbura claimed by C. B. Casichetty and Bogahakumbura claimed by Watutantrige Charlotte Alwis till it meets the landmark at the north-western corner of Bogahawatta claimed by C. M. Fernando, thence southwards along the said landmarked boundary in Miscellaneous Survey Preliminary Plan 24 forming the western boundary of the said Bogahawatta till it meets the landmark on the northern boundary of the Main Road from Colombo to Kandy, thence across the said road at the 4th Mile Stone to the landmark on the southern boundary of the said road, thence south-eastwards along the said landmarked boundary in Miscellaneous Survey Preliminary Plan 24 forming the western boundary of Bogahawatta claimed by G. P. Péris till it meets the landmark on the northern boundary of the road from Colombo to Kelaniya, thence across the said road southwards to the landmark on the southern boundary of the said road, thence along the said landmarked boundary in Miscellaneous Survey Preliminary Plan 24 running through Midgahawatta claimed by W. (2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part agree to pay, from the date on which the construction of the said works is completed, an irrigation rate in perpetuity which shall be Rs. 2 per acre per annum for the first five years and which shall thereafter be subject to periodical revision by the Governor.

(3) The proprietors further agree that on the completion of the work, the construction of log amunas across the Attanagala Oya and the Diya Ela Oya are to be prohibited, and the control of the irrigation system is to be assumed by Government in the interests of the cultivators.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Omnibus Service Licensing Regulations, 1942.

2. Every application for a road service licence shall be signed by the person requiring such licence. Where such licence is required by a body corporate or a firm, the application shall be signed by the Manager or Secretary of such body or by any other officer duly authorised in that behalf by such body, or by a partner of the firm, as the case may be.

3. Every application for a road service licence shall be transmitted to the Commissioner so as to reach him—

- (a) not less than eight weeks before the date on which it is desired to commence the service, or
- (b) where such licence is for the purpose of continuing an existing service, not less than eight weeks before the date of expiration of the licence authorising the provision of such existing service;

Provided, however, that the Commissioner may, in his discretion, accept and deal with any such application received by him after the time limit prescribed by the preceding provisions of this regulation.

4. The Commissioner may, in providing the form for any application for a road service licence for continuing an existing regular service or for a service other than a regular service, specify in the form the amount of the fee payable under section 9 of the Ordinance for that licence and require the fee to be paid at the time of the application, and in every case where the Commissioner requires payment to be so made, the application shall be accompanied by the fee so specified by the Commissioner.

5. Where a change in the address of the holder of a road service licence occurs during the time when the licence is in force, the holder shall, within seven days from the date of the change, notify his new address in writing to the Commissioner and, simultaneously with such notification transmit the licence to the Commissioner who shall endorse the new address upon the licence and forthwith return the licence to the holder.

6. The holder of a road service licence shall, when required so to do by any police officer not below the rank of sergeant, any examiner of motor cars appointed or deemed to be appointed under the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, or any person authorised in writing by the Commissioner to inspect such licences, produce the licence for inspection by such officer, examiner, or authorised person at the principal place of business of such holder.

7. (1) Where an order of revocation or suspension of a road service licence is served under section 12 of the Ordinance on the holder of the licence, he shall, within five days from the date of service of such order, transmit the licence to the Commissioner.

(2) Upon receipt of a road service licence transmitted to the Commissioner under paragraph (1) of this regulation, the Commissioner shall—

- (a) where he has made an order of revocation, cancel the licence forthwith and dispose of it thereafter in such manner as he may deem expedient; and
- (b) where he has made an order of suspension, retain the licence in his custody until the termination of the period of suspension, and shall return the licence forthwith thereafter to the holder thereof, or, if the licence expires on the termination of that period, dispose of the licence in such manner as he may deem expedient.

8. It shall be the duty of the Commissioner, within seven days of the revocation of a road service licence in respect of any route, to publish in at least two newspapers a notice calling for applications for a new road service licence in respect of that route.

9. (1) Where any variation of the conditions attached to a road service licence is proposed to be made under section 6 (2) of the Ordinance, the Commissioner shall cause a preliminary notice of such proposed variation to be served in writing on the holder of such licence and on any other person or body of persons, who may, in the opinion of the Commissioner, be affected by such variation.

(2) Where a preliminary notice of any proposed variation of the conditions attached to a road service licence is on any date served under paragraph (1) of this regulation on the holder of the licence or on any other person or body of persons—

- (a) such holder may object to the proposed variation by giving written notice of objection to the Commissioner within seven days from that date; and
- (b) such other person or body of persons may object to the proposed variation by giving written notice of objection to the Commissioner, and to the holder of the licence, within seven days from that date.

(3) Every notice of objection under paragraph (2) of this regulation shall contain a statement of objections and the specific grounds on which they are based and shall be signed by the objector. Where notice of objection is given by a body corporate or a firm, such notice shall be signed by the Manager or Secretary of such body or by any other officer duly authorised in that behalf by such body, or by a partner of the firm, as the case may be.

10. Before deciding to give effect to any proposed variation of the conditions attached to a road service licence, the Commissioner shall consider the objections to the proposed variation which may be raised in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (2) and paragraph (3) of regulation 9:

Provided, however, that the Commissioner may, in his discretion, consider any other objection notwithstanding that notice of such objection has not been given in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid paragraphs.

11. Where the Commissioner by notice served under section 6 (2) of the Ordinance requires the holder of a road service licence to produce such licence for the purposes of the variation of any of the conditions attached to it, such holder shall, within seven days from the date of service of such notice, transmit the licence to the Commissioner, and the Commissioner shall, after endorsing the variation on the licence, return the licence forthwith to the holder.

(1) If the Chairman is of opinion that any existing building or premises used for any purpose whatsoever is from lack of adequate means of drainage likely to expose the inmates of such building or those who use such premises to the risk of disease or to endanger the public health, he may by written notice require the owner of any such building or premises to build any new drain, or to improve, alter, repair, rebuilt, or fill up any existing drain, or to take such other measures for the improvement of the drainage of the building or premises as may be specified in that notice.

(2) If the Chairman is of opinion from an examination of the plans of a building that is to be erected or re-erected that such building is likely to endanger health because the building is inadequately provided with drains, he may by written notice require the owner of such building to provide the building with suitable drains or to take such other measures for the improvement of drainage as may be provided in that notice.”; and

- (3) by the addition, immediately after by-law 7, of the following new by-laws:—

“ 7A. No person shall obstruct or permit any obstruction of any private drain, except with the written consent of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as the Chairman may impose.

7B. - (a) in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent;
- (b) in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent;
- (c) in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent; and
- (d) in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent.

2. (1) For the purpose of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

- (a) to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto; and
- (b) to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose.

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall, within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice.

(3) For the purposes of this by-law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed on a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person.

3. No person shall obstruct any assessor or any person acting under the orders of an assessor, in the lawful discharge of his duties.

- “building” includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure whether used for human habitation or otherwise;
- “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

No testimonial which is not signed by some one who is himself personally acquainted with the candidate will be considered.

3. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 23 years of age on January 16, 1943, must be attached to the form of application. Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools and affidavits will not be accepted.

4. Candidates will, in the first place, be required to appear before a Board of Selection, at their own expense, for a general oral examination as to suitability and for a colloquial test in one of the vernacular languages. Those selected will be required to sit for a written competitive examination in the following subjects :—

- (i.) English composition.
- (ii.) Dictation.
- (iii.) Arithmetic.
- (iv.) One of the following :—
Sinhalese,
Tamil,
Arabic,
English (Special Paper).

Sinhalese must be taken by Sinhalese and Tamil by Tamil candidates. Arabic or English (Special Paper) may be taken only by those candidates whose nationality is neither Sinhalese nor Tamil.

5. In order to qualify, candidates must obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. of the marks in each subject, and the order of merit will be determined taking into account the marks obtained in all the subjects. The number to be selected for appointment on the results of each examination will be at the discretion of the General Manager.

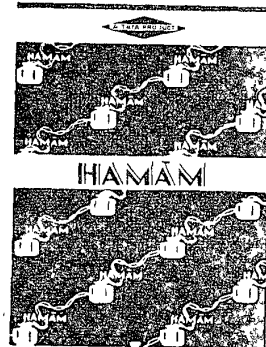

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kalutara District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which any bricks of the description and dimensions specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the said Schedule shall not be sold for delivery at any kiln (including delivery to the nearest ferry or roadway) which is situated within the limits of the Kalutara District;
- (2) fix the prices specified in column 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which any bricks of the description and dimensions specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the said Schedule shall not be sold for delivery at any riverside depot situated at Palatota in Kalutara;
- (3) direct that, where any bricks of the description specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto vary substantially from the dimensions specified in the said column of the said Schedule, the maximum prices of bricks of those dimensions shall be determined by reference to the maximum prices of bricks of the description and dimensions specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and shall be in proportion to the increase or decrease, as the case may be, in cubical content;
- (4) direct that any person who sells any bricks of the description and dimensions specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of such bricks a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the number of bricks sold;
 - (c) the description and dimensions of the bricks sold;
 - (d) the price paid for the bricks sold;
 - (e) the place of delivery of the bricks sold.
