The regulations set out in the Schedule to the Colombo Municipal Council Waterworks Ordinance (Chapter 161), are hereby amended as follows :-

- (1) in regulation 30, by the substitution, for paragraph (b), of the following new paragraph:-
 - "(b) for the purposes of hotels, of restaurants or of lodging houses, or of private boarding houses other than school boarding houses, educational hostels, religious hostels and refreshment rooms, and restaurants not
- open to the general public; ";
 (2) in regulation 32 (1), by the addition, immediately after paragraph (c), of the following new paragraph (d):-
 - "(d) for water supplied to premises, occupied wholly or in part, for domestic purposes and used through an external tap for horses or cattle or for washing vehicles, 50 conts per 1000 gallons;";
- (3) in regulation 33, by the addition, immediately after paragraph (6), of the following new paragraph (7):
 - "(7) For water supplied for domestic purposes and used through an external tap for washing vehicles-

SCHEME in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VI of the Irrigation Ordinance (Chapter 312), approved under section 8 (1) (h) at a meeting duly held on August 26, 1942,

by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the urigable area' of the Idallawella Ameut irrigation work in the Colombo District and sanctioned by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 41 of the Ordinance.

 - (2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part agree to pay, from the date on which the construction of the said works is completed, an irrigation rate in perpetuity which shall be Rs. 2 per acre per annum for the first five years and which shall thereafter be subject to periodical revision by the Governor.

(3) The proprietors further agree that on the completion of the work, the construction of log amunas across the Attanagala Oya and the Diya Ela Oya are to be prohibited, and the control of the irrigation system is to be assumed by Government in the interests of the cultivators.

The Code of Regulations for Assisted English Schools published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 7,728 of August 16, 1929, is hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) in Appendix A by the substitution, for the heading "class IV.—Vernacular Teachers (clause 30 (b) and (c)", of the following:—"class IV.—Vernacular Teachers";

- 2. Every application for a road service licence shall be signed by the person requiring such licence. licence is required by a body corporate or a firm, the application shall be signed by the Manager or Secretary of such body or by any other officer duly authorised in that behalf by such body, or by a partner of the firm, as the case may be.
- 3. Every application for a road service licence shall be transmitted to the Commissioner so as to reach him—
- (a) not less than eight weeks before the date on which it is desired to commence the service, or
- (b) where such licence is for the purpose of continuing an existing service, not less than eight weeks before the date of expiration of the licence authorising the provision of such existing service:

Provided, however, that the Commissioner may, in his discretion, accept and deal with any such application received by him after the time limit prescribed by the preceding provisions of this regulation.

- 4. The Commissioner may, in providing the form for any application for a road service licence for continuing an existing regular service or for a service other than a regular service, specify in the form the amount of the fee payable under section 9 of the Ordinance for that licence and require the fee to be paid at the time of the application, and in every case where the Commissioner requires payment to be so made, the application shall-be accompanied by the fee so specified by the Commissioner.
- 5. Where a change in the address of the holder of a road service licence occurs during the time when the licence is in force, the holder shall, within seven days from the date of the change, notify his new address in writing to the Commissioner and, simultaneously with such notification transmit the licence to the Commissioner who shall endorse the new address upon the licence and forthwith return the licence to the holder.
- 6. The holder of a road service licence shall, when required so to do by any police officer not below the rank of sergeant, any examiner of motor cars appointed or deemed to be appointed under the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, or any person authorised in writing by the Commissioner to inspect such licences, produce the licence for inspection by such officer, examiner, or authorised person at the principal place of business of such holder.
- 7. (1) Where an order of revocation or suspension of a road service licence is served under section 12 of the Ordinance on the holder of the licence, he shall, within five days from the date of service of such order, transmit the licence to the Commissioner.

- (2) Upon receipt of a road service licence transmitted to the Commissioner under paragraph (1) of this regulation, the Commissioner shall-
 - (a) where he has made an order of revocation, cancel the licenco forthwith and dispose of it thereafter in such manner as he may deem expedient; and

 (b) where he has made an order of suspension, retain the
 - licence in his custody until the termination of the period of suspension, and shall return the licence forthwith thereafter to the holder thereof, or, if the licence expires on the termination of that period, dispose of the licence in such manner as he may deem expedient.
- 8. It shall be the duty of the Commissioner, within seven days of the revocation of a road service licence in respect of any route, to publish in at least two newspapers a notice calling for applications for a new road service licence in respect of that route.
- (1) Where any variation of the conditions attached to a road service licence is proposed to be made under section 6 (2) of the Ordinance, the Commissioner shall cause a preliminary notice of such proposed variation to be served in writing on the holder of such heence and on any other person or body of persons, who may, in the opinion of the Commissioner, be affected by such variation.
- (2) Where a preliminary notice of any proposed variation of the conditions attached to a road service licence is on any date served under paragraph (1) of this regulation on the holder of the licence or on any other person or body of persons—
 - (a) such holder may object to the proposed variation by giving written notice of objection to the Commissioner within seven days from that date; and
 - (b) such other person or body of persons may object to the proposed variation by giving written notice of objection to the Commissioner, and to the holder of the licence, within seven days from that date.
- (3) Every notice of objection under paragraph (2) of this regulation shall contain a statement of objections and the specific grounds on which they are based and shall be signed by the objector. Where notice of objection is given by a body corporate or a firm, such notice shall be signed by the Manager or Secretary of such body or by any other officer duly authorised in that behalf by such body, or by a partner of the firm, as the case may be.
- 10. Before deciding to give effect to any proposed variation 10. Before deciging to give effect to any proposed variation of the conditions attached to a road service licence, the Commissioner shall consider the objections to the proposed variation which may be raised in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (2) and paragraph (3) of regulation 9: Provided, however, that the Commissioner may, in his discretion, consider any other objection notwithstanding that

notice of such objection has not been given in accordance with the provisions of the aforesaid paragraphs.



3. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 23 years of age on January 16, 1943, must be attached to the form of application. Candidates will, in the first place, be required to appear before a Board of Selection, at their own expense, for a general oral examination as to suitability and for a colloquial test in one of the vernacular languages. 5. In order to qualify, candidates must obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. of the marks in each subject, and the order of merit will be determined taking into account the marks obtained in all the subjects. The number to be selected for appointment on the results of each examination will be at the discretion of the General Manager.



By virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Contoller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordmance, No. 39 of 1939, I. Patrick Mur Renison, Deputy Controller of Prices, Trincomalee District, do, by this Order-

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated July 21, 1942, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 8,979 of July 31, 1942, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and grade mentioned in column I of the First Schedule heroto;
- (ii.) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum wholesale price above which the articles of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the Town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the said Schedule, as the maximum wholesale price above which the articles of that description and grade, shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto;
- (iii.) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum retail price above which the articles of the description and grade mentioned m column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the Town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 3 of that Schedule, as the maximum retail price above which the articles of that description and grade shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto;
- (iv.) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum retail price above which the articles of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the Town of Colombo increased by the amounts specified in columns 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of that Schedule, as the maximum retail price per pound or measure above which the articles of that description and grade shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in columns 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of that Schedule;
- (v.) direct that for the purposes of this Order
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one hundredweight or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity less than one hundredweight of any article for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be doemed to be a sale by rotail;
 (c) a "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale any article men-
 - tioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;
 "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale
 - dealer:
 - "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;
- (vi.) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description or grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (vii.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the Urban Council limits of Trincomalee or in the District of Trincomalee, sells any article of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (viii.) direct that any trader who sells any article of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that article, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out-
 - (a) the date of the sale,

Column 1.

- (b) the description and grade of the article sold,
- (c) the weight of the quantity sold,
- (d) the price paid for the quantity sold, and
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kalutara District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which any bricks of the description and dimensions specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the said Schedule shall not be sold for delivery at any kiln (including delivery to the nearest ferry or roadway) which is situated within the limits of the Kalutara District;
- (2) fix the prices specified in column 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which any bricks

 - (c) the description and dimensions of the bricks sold;
 - (d) the price paid for the bricks sold;
 - (e) the place of delivery of the bricks sold.
