BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, Î, William Oswald Stevens, Deputy Controller of Prices, Galle District, do, by this Order—

(1) fix the prices, which are for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, as the maximum retail price per bag above which any article mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto as the maximum retail prices, respectively, above which any article of the description and grade in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold within the Galle District;

- (2) direct that every trader, who exposes for sale any article mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule at any premises within the Galle District, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (3) direct that no trader shall sell any article mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any other article or with any article of any inferior description and grade;
- (4) direct that where any articles mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto is sold by retail the sale shall be made according to the weights specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the Schedule, respectively;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (6) direct that every trador, who sells any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that article, on domand, a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and grade of the cement sold,
 - (b) the quantity of the cement sold,
 - (c) the date of the sale,
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold.



N.B.—These prices do not constitute fixed prices at which the above articles must be sold; but they are the MAXIMUM prices above which sales cannot take place.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices, by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices, Jaffina District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag, and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or retail, as the case may be, within the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (11.) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by rotall;
- (iii.) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the Schodule hereto which is adulterated with any article or sugar of an inferior description or grade of quality;
- (iv.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the limits of any area specified in the Schodule hereto, exposes for sale sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade;

 (v.) direct that every trader, who sells sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that sugar a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity of sugar sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail; and
 - (e) the description and grade of sugar sold.
