THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,
1939 AND 1940.

Regulation.

(1) The punishment of whipping prescribed in Cap. 15. section 368 of the Penal Code as a punishment for an offence under that section may, notwithstanding Cap. 16. anything in section 15 (c) of the Criminal Procedure Code, be imposed by a Magistrate on any male person convicted of any such offence by the Magistrate, irrespective of the age of such person.

(2) Nothing in the Proviso to sub-section () of section 316 of the Criminal Procedure Code or in sub-section (2) of that section shall apply in any case where a sentence of whipping is imposed by any court on any person convicted of an offence under section 368 of the Penal Code.

Civil Service candidates offering Sinhalese or Tamil at the Second Examination should state whether they are entering for the Lower Paper or the Higher Paper.
