- (7) direct that every authorised distributor who sells whole wheat or wheat flour shall, if demanded, give the purchaser of that whole wheat or wheat flour a receipt, in which there shall be set out the particulars mentioned in the preceding clause; and
- (8) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat or wheat flour for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.
 - deemed to be a sale by retail;
 (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel:
 - (c) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy
 Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a
 distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of
 - '(d) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food
 Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a
 distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots:
 - distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
 (e) the "wholesale dealer's maximum prices" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor:
 - (f) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for a bag of whole wheat or of wheat flour, which contains more or less than 80 measures of whole wheat or 150 pounds of wheat flour, shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order.
 - (g) the maximum price fixed by this Order for wheat flour sold by a wholesale dealer shall include the price of the container in which such wheat flour is sold.

Abstract.—The invention relates to the production of plasticised rubber from pure latex in such a form as to be capable of incorporating fillers without undue mastication and without imparing its vulcanising properties.

According to the invention, pure latex is first mixed with specified quantities of oxidising agents such as alkaline peroxides, peroxides of the heavy alkaline earths, stable compounds of hydrogen peroxides, e.g., urea peroxide or mixtures thereof which are stable in tropical climates, and afterwards coagulated and dried at a comparatively high temperature.

Alternatively, the oxidising agent can be added simultaneously with magnesium sulphate or chloride to effect

coagulation.

The inventor claims that in the manufacture of tyres from rubber treated in the above manner, not only would there be a saving in time and cost, but also that the mechanical properties of the tyre tread would be rendered superior to that produced from ordinary smoked ribbed sheet with the aid of softeners and mastication.

Property Rate for 1943.

The Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939.

IT is hereby notified that the Weligama Urban Council has, in terms of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, imposed for the year 1943 the following rate, being the same as was in force during the preceding year, within the administrative limits of the Council:-

Under section 173, a rate of 10 per centum per annum on the annual value of all immovable property within the adminis rative limits of the said Council, payable on March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31, for the quarter ending on the said days respectively, subject however to the condition that the properties described in the Schedule hereto shall be exempted from a defined portion, namely 2 per centum per annum, of the said rate, declared by resolution of the said Council to be levied for the purposes of the conservancy service.

AUSTRALIAN WHEAT FLOUR (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL).

The Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939.

Order.

By virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kalutara District, do by this Order:-

- (1) revoke my Order dated June 28, 1942, published in Government Gazette No. 8,965 of July 10, 1942. in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale and retail prices of wheat flour fixed in respect of the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag and the authorized distributor's retail price per pound above which Austrahan wheat flour shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that wholesale dealers and authorized distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous place at their premises (store or boutique) a notice, in which there shall be set out the maximum prices of wheat flour fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorized distributor shall sell. Australian wheat flour which is adulterated with any article or with flour of an inferior description and grade or quality
- (5) direct that every wholesale dealer and authorized distributor who sells wheat flour shall give the purchaser of that wheat flour a receipt, in which there shall be set cut-
 - (a) the quantity of wheat flour sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold;
 - (c) the date of the sale;
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) a bag of wheat flour shall contain 150 lb.;
 - (a) a pag of wheat four shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 (b) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 (c) "pound" shall be deemed to be the standard pound, avoirdupois weight, equivalent to one-hundredand twelfth part of a hundredweight;

(d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of wheat flour which is more or less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
(e) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5, Part III., Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
(f) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5, Part III., Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
(g) the "maximum wholesale price" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor;
(h) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for wheat flour sold by a wholesale dealer shall include the price of the container in which such wheat flour is sold.

WHOLE WHEAT.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939. I, Alfred Silva Kohomban-Wickrema, Assistant Controller of Prices, Matara District, do by this Order

- (1) revoke my Order dated November 15, 1942, published in Gazette No. 9,037 of November 20, 1942, prescribing the maximum prices for rice, whole wheat and paddy within the Revenue District of Matara, in so far as it relates to prices of whole wheat;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price which is for the time being fixed by me at the Supply Stations as shown in the Second Schedule hereto increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 or 3 (as the case may be) of the First Schedule hereto as the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag above which whole wheat of the description and grade specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 2 to 10 of the Third Schedule hereto to be the authorised distributor's maximum retail price per measure above which whole wheat of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail in respectively the 9 areas mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto;
- (4) direct that every trader, who sells whole wheat of the description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at these premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for whole wheat of that description and grade;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell whole wheat of any description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto which is adulterated with whole wheat of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer, who sells whole wheat of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that whole wheat a receipt in which there shall be set out-
 - (a) the description and grade of whole wheat sold;
 - (c) the quantity of whole wheat sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat sold;
- (d) the date of sale;
 (7) a bag of whole wheat shall contain 80 cut measures;
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart equivalent to 1/32 part of a bushel;
 - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded from an authorized distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of whole wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices, by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy of Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do, by this Order:—

- ,(1) revoke with effect from December 7, 1942, my Order dated June 17, 1942, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No 8,957 of June 26, 1942, relating to wheat flour (retail);
- (2) fix the maximum retail price per pound of wheat flour as follows:-

Retail dealers in wheat flour, in the areas mentioned in column 1 of Schedule hereto, shall not sell wheat flour above the maximum retail price per pound specified in column 2 of the said Schedule against the area in which their boutiques or stores are situated;

- (3) direct that every retail dealer in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall set out the maximum price fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no retail dealer in wheat flour shall sell wheat flour which is adulterated with any other substance;
- (5) prescribe that every retail dealer, who sells wheat flour, shall give to the purchaser of that wheat flour a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of wheat flour sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold;
 - (c) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of consumption or uso shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939. Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control. of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do by this Order:-

- (1) revoke with effect from December 7, 1942, my Order dated July 16, 1942, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 8,979 of July 31, 1942, relating to retail prices of whole wheat;
- (2) fix the maximum retail price per measure of whole wheat from December 7, 1942, as follows:-

The authorized distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not sell whole wheat above the maximum retail price per measure specified in column 2 of the said Schedule against the area in which their boutiques or stores are situated;

- (3) direct that every authorized distributor in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no authorized distributor shall sell whole wheat which is adulterated with any other substance;
- (5) prescribe that every authorized distributor who sells whole wheat shall give to the purchaser of that whole wheat a receipt in which there shall be set out-
 - (a) the quantity of whole wheat sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat sold; (c) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a
 - sale by retail; measure "shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
 - (c) "authorized distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E, of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from December 7, 1942, my Order relating to wholesale prices of Wheat Flour (Australian) dated June 27, 1942, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 8,965 of July 10, 1942;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price of wheat flour from December 7, 1942, as follows:—

The wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not sell wheat flour above the maximum wholesale price per bag specified against their areas in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the said Schedules:

- (3) direct that the wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which there shall he set out the maximum price of wheat flour fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell wheat flour which is adulterated with any other substance;
- (5) prescribe that every wholesale dealer who sells wheat flour shall give to the purchaser of that wheat flour a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity of wheat flour sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold;
 - (c) the date of sale;
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer for any quantity of wheat flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (c) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for wheat flour which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such wheat flour is sold.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordmance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulier, Controller of Prices, do, by this Order:—

- (1.) revoke with effect from this date the Order dated October 29, 1942, published in Government Gazette No. 9,027 of October 30, 1942, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and brand specified in the Schedule thereto:
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in the Schedule heroto to be the maximum prices above which the articles specified therein shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;

- (vi.) direct that every trader, who sells any article specified in the Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of such article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity, description and grade of the article sold;
 - (b) the price paid;

QUININE.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices, by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939 I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulier, Controller of Prices, do, by this Order:—

- (i.) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which quinine of the description mentioned in the corresponding entries of column 1 of that Schedule, shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (ii.) direct that every person who sells at any premises any quinine of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of quinine of that description;
- (iii.) direct that any person, who at any premises deals or has at any time during the three months prior to this date dealt in quinine of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of it available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice to the effect that he has no stocks available for sale for the time being;
- (iv.) direct that no person shall sell any quinine of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with quinine of an inferior description or grade or quality;
- (v.) direct that every person; who sells any quinine of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that quinine, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the description of the quinine sold;
 - (c) the quantity of quinine sold; and
 - (d) the price paid; and
- (vi.) direct that every person who carries on business as an importer or wholesale trader in quinino of any of the descriptions mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall furnish to the Controller of Prices, 111, Dam street, Pettah, on or before December 16, 1942, a return stating—
 - (a) the address of every premises in which are contained any of these quitine in his possession or under his control;
 - (b) the quantity and description of quinine in each store.
