## THE INDIAN IMMIGRANT LABOUR ORDINANCE.

*Notification No. 333.*

IT is hereby notified that in pursuance of the powers vested in him by regulation 1A of Chapter 1 of the regulations made under section 14 of the Indian Immigrant Labour Ordinance (Chapter 111), and published in *Gazette* No. 7,339 of July 13, 1923, as amended by the regulation published in *Gazette* No. 7,358 of October 26, 1923, the Governor has been pleased to direct that the quarterly instalments of acreage fees payable to the Controller of Labour by employers of Indian immigrant labourers on estates of the description named in Schedule A attached to the said regulations shall, in respect of the quarter ending on December 31, 1942, and of all subsequent quarters in respect of which this Notification remains in force, be determined in accordance with the following scale:—

- (vi.) direct that every trader, who at any premises within the Urban Council limits of Trincomalee, or in the District of Trincomalee, sells sugar of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade ;
- (vii.) direct that every person, who sells by wholesale any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule, shall, and every person who sells by retail any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto, shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—
- the date of the sale ;
  - the description and grade of the article sold ;
  - the weight of the quantity sold ;
  - the price paid for the quantity sold ; and
  - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail

(1) revoke with effect from this date—

- (a) Orders dated August 11, 1942, and published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,991 of August 21, 1942 fixing the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which whole wheat shall not be sold within the Puttalam-Chilaw Districts, and
- (b) Orders dated August 25, 1942, and published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 9,001 of September 4, 1942, fixing the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per pound above which wheat flour shall not be sold within the Puttalam-Chilaw Districts ;

(2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag above which whole wheat and wheat flour shall not be sold in the villages mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto ;

(3) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the authorised distributor's maximum retail price per measure and per pound, respectively, above which whole wheat and wheat flour shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto ;

(4) direct that wholesale dealers and authorised distributors in the Puttalam-Chilaw Districts shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices for whole wheat and wheat flour fixed by this Order ;

(5) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorised distributor shall sell whole wheat or wheat flour which is adulterated with any other article ;

(6) direct that every wholesale dealer who sells whole wheat or wheat flour shall give the purchaser of that whole wheat or wheat flour a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the quantity of whole wheat or wheat flour sold ;
- (b) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat or wheat flour sold ; and
- (c) the date of sale ;

(7) direct that every authorised distributor who sells whole wheat or wheat flour shall, if demanded, give the purchaser of that whole wheat or wheat flour a receipt, in which there shall be set out the particulars mentioned in the preceding clause ; and

(8) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

- (a) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat or wheat flour for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
- (b) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel ;
- (c) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people ;
- (d) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots ;
- (e) the "wholesale dealer's maximum prices" shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor ;
- (f) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for a bag of whole wheat or of wheat flour, which contains more or less than 80 measures of whole wheat or 150 pounds of wheat flour, shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
- (g) the maximum price fixed by this Order for wheat flour sold by a wholesale dealer shall include the price of the container in which such wheat flour is sold.

"Improvements in or relating to the manufacture of rubber."

*Abstract.*—The invention relates to the production of plasticised rubber from pure latex in such a form as to be capable of incorporating fillers without undue mastication and without impairing its vulcanising properties.

According to the invention, pure latex is first mixed with specified quantities of oxidising agents such as alkaline peroxides, peroxides of the heavy alkaline earths, stable compounds of hydrogen peroxides, e.g., urea peroxide or mixtures thereof which are stable in tropical climates, and afterwards coagulated and dried at a comparatively high temperature.

Alternatively, the oxidising agent can be added simultaneously with magnesium sulphate or chloride to effect coagulation.

The inventor claims that in the manufacture of tyres from rubber treated in the above manner, not only would there be a saving in time and cost, but also that the mechanical properties of the tyre tread would be rendered superior to that produced from ordinary smoked ribbed sheet with the aid of softeners and mastication.

- a bag of whole wheat shall contain not less than 80 measures;
  - any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
  - the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of whole wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
  - "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
  - "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots.

### AUSTRALIAN WHEAT FLOUR (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL).

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

#### Order.

By virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kalutara District, do by this Order:—

- (1) revoke my Order dated June 28, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,965 of July 10, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale and retail prices of wheat flour fixed in respect of the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the wholesale dealer's maximum price per bag and the authorized distributor's retail price per pound above which Australian wheat flour shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that wholesale dealers and authorized distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous place at their premises (store or boutique) a notice, in which there shall be set out the maximum prices of wheat flour fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorized distributor shall sell Australian wheat flour which is adulterated with any article or with flour of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (5) direct that every wholesale dealer and authorized distributor who sells wheat flour shall give the purchaser of that wheat flour a receipt, in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the quantity of wheat flour sold;
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold;
  - (c) the date of the sale;
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
  - (a) a bag of wheat flour shall contain 150 lb.;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (c) "pound" shall be deemed to be the standard pound, avoirdupois weight, equivalent to one-hundred-and-twelfth part of a hundredweight;

- (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of wheat flour which is more or less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
- (e) " authorised distributor " means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5, Part III., Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people ;
- (f) " wholesale dealer " means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5, Part III., Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots ;
- (g) the " maximum wholesale price " shall apply only to sales by a wholesale dealer to an authorised distributor ;
- (h) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for wheat flour sold by a wholesale dealer shall include the price of the container in which such wheat flour is sold.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

*Order.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated September 29, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,017 of October 2, 1942, relating to the prices of Australian wheat flour in Matale District;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per bag of 150 lb. and the maximum retail price per pound, respectively, above which Australian wheat flour shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in the Schedule hereto, sells wheat flour shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Australian wheat flour;

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do, by this Order—

- (4) direct that every person who sells by wholesale soap of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail soap of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that soap a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the date of the sale;
  - the description and grade of soap sold;
  - the quantity of soap sold;
  - the price paid for the quantity of soap sold, and
  - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (5) direct that every trader who has at any time during the three months prior to this date sold any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of that article available for sale shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the effect that stocks of that article are not available for sale for the time being;
- (6) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated October 15, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,024 of October 23, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of soaps of the descriptions and grades specified in column 1 of the Schedule thereto.

  - (b) the quantity of whole wheat sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat sold;
  - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) a bag of whole wheat shall contain not less than 80 measures;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;
  - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of whole wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
  - (e) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
  - (f) "wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots.

## WHEAT FLOUR (RETAIL).

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices, by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy of Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do, by this Order:—

(1) revoke with effect from December 7, 1942, my Order dated June 17, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,957 of June 26, 1942, relating to wheat flour (retail);

(2) fix the maximum retail price per pound of wheat flour as follows:—

Retail dealers in wheat flour, in the areas mentioned in column 1 of Schedule hereto, shall not sell wheat flour above the maximum retail price per pound specified in column 2 of the said Schedule against the area in which their boutiques or stores are situated;

(3) direct that every retail dealer in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall set out the maximum price fixed by this Order;

(4) direct that no retail dealer in wheat flour shall sell wheat flour which is adulterated with any other substance;

(5) prescribe that every retail dealer, who sells wheat flour, shall give to the purchaser of that wheat flour a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- the quantity of wheat flour sold;
- the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold;
- the date of sale;

(6) direct that for the purpose of this Order any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3) ) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do, by this Order :—

- (1) revoke with effect from December 7, 1942, my Order relating to whole wheat (wholesale) dated August 1, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,987 of August 14, 1942 ;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price of whole wheat from December 7, 1942, as follows :—The wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not sell whole wheat above the maximum wholesale price per bag specified against their areas in column 2 of the said Schedule ;
- (3) direct that the wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price of whole wheat fixed by this Order ;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell whole wheat which is adulterated with any other substance ;
- (5) prescribe that every wholesale dealer who sells whole wheat shall give to the purchaser of that whole wheat a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the quantity of whole wheat sold,
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of whole wheat sold,
  - (c) the date of sale ;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) no wholesale dealer shall sell whole wheat in bags containing less than 80 measures, when such whole wheat has been supplied by the Food Controller or by me in bags containing not less than 80 measures ;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of whole wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel ;

- (d) the maximum price, which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of whole wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ;
- (e) " authorised distributor " means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people ;
- (f) " wholesale dealer " means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III, under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots ;
- (g) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for whole wheat which is sold wholesale shall not include the container in which such whole wheat is sold.

**WHEAT FLOUR (WHOLESALE).**  
THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

*Order.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from December 7, 1942, my Order relating to wholesale prices of Wheat Flour (Australian) dated June 27, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,965 of July 10, 1942;
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price of wheat flour from December 7, 1942, as follows :—

The wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not sell wheat flour above the maximum wholesale price per bag specified against their areas in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the said Schedules;

- (3) direct that the wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum price of wheat flour fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell wheat flour which is adulterated with any other substance;
- (5) prescribe that every wholesale dealer who sells wheat flour shall give to the purchaser of that wheat flour a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the quantity of wheat flour sold;
  - (b) the price paid for the quantity of wheat flour sold;
  - (c) the date of sale;
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer for any quantity of wheat flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
  - (c) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for wheat flour which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such wheat flour is sold.

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date the Order dated October 29, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,027 of October 30, 1942, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and brand specified in the Schedule thereto;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which the articles specified therein shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of ten or more packets of any one brand to any one person in the course of one transaction, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

- (v.) direct that every trader, who deals or who has at any time during the three months prior to this date dealt in any brand of razor blade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of it available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the effect that he has no stocks of such razor blade available for sale for the time being;
- (vi.) direct that every trader, who sells any article specified in the Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of such article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the quantity, description and grade of the article sold;
  - (b) the price paid;
  - (c) the date of the sale; and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

- (iv.) direct that no person shall sell any quinine of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with quinine of an inferior description or grade or quality;
- (v.) direct that every person, who sells any quinine of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that quinine, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale;
  - (b) the description of the quinine sold;
  - (c) the quantity of quinine sold; and
  - (d) the price paid; and
- (vi.) direct that every person who carries on business as an importer or wholesale trader in quinine of any of the descriptions mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall furnish to the Controller of Prices, 111, Dam street, Pettah, on or before December 16, 1942, a return stating—
  - (a) the address of every premises in which are contained any of these quinine in his possession or under his control;
  - (b) the quantity and description of quinine in each store.
