(6) direct that the price for any quantity of sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is less than one pound in weight shall be reckoned from the price per pound;

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939. Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordmance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Samson Felix Amerasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do, by this Order-

(I) revoke with effect from this day my Order fixing the maximum retail price of bread, within the Revenue District of Kegalla, dated November 3, 1942, and published in the Government Gazette No. 9,030 of November 6, 1942;

(2) fix the price, mentioned in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price of bread of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the said Schedule, above which bread of that description and grade shall not be sold within the Revenue District of Kegalla;

- (3) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.
  - (b) a loaf of bread shall weigh 16 oz or 8 oz. or any weight less than 8 oz.;
- (4) direct that when bread of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule heroto is sold within the Revenue District of Kegalla, the maximum price fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper, if any, in which such bread is sold:
- (5) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the Revenue District of Kegalla, sells bread of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises (store or boutique) a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices set out by this Order in respect of bread of that description and grade.
  (6) direct that every trader, who sells bread of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that bread, on domaind, a receipt on which there shall be set our....

(a) the date of the sale;

(b) the quantity of bread (in weight) sold;

(c) the description and grade of bread sold; and (d) the price paid for the quantity of bread sold.
