THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

Order under Regulation 41.

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 41 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

The Food Production (Estates) Order, 1942, published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 8,857 of February 2, 1942, is hereby amended as follows:

- (1) in paragraph 2 of that Order-
- (a) by the substitution in sub-paragraph (1) of that paragraph, for the definition of "estate to which this

Order applies", of the following:-

- " estate to which this Order applies" means any land of which not less than thirty-five acres are actually cultivated, and includes any area which is deemed under sub-paragraph (3) to be a separate estate for the purposes of this Order; '; and
- (b) by the addition, immediately after sub-paragraph (2) of that paragraph, of the following sub-paragraph:
 - "(3) Where any estate to which this Order applies is cultivated partly with tea and partly with any other plant or plants whatsoever, (a) the aggregate of the areas of that estate which are cultivated mainly with tea, and (b) the remaining portion of that estate, shall each be deemed, irrespective of the extent thereof, to be a separate estate for the purposes of this Order. "; and
- (2) in paragraph 3 of that Order by the omission, from sub-paragraph (2) of that paragraph, of the word "mainly" wherever that word occurs in that sub-paragraph.

BREAD.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, William Holmes, Deputy Controller of Prices, Hambantota District, do, by this Order—

(i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum retail price per 16 oz. loaf of bread, maximum retail price per 8 oz loaf of bread and the maximum retail price of any loaf of any other weight or any part of a loaf, above which bread shall not be sold within the area mentioned

in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;

(ii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(iii.) direct that the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper, if any, in which the

- bread is sold;
- (iv.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells bread shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that bread;

 (v.) direct that every trader who sells bread shall give the purchaser of that bread a receipt in which there shall be

set out-

(a) the date of the sale;

(b) the quantity of bread (in weight);

(c) the description and grade of bread sold; (d) the price paid for the quantity of bread sold.

KEROSENE OIL.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order. .

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, William Holmes, Deputy Controller of Prices, Hambantota District, do, by this Order—

(1.) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum price per bottle above which kerosene oil of the brands specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;

(ii.) direct that every trader who, at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Scoond Schedule hereto, sells any korosene oil of the brand specified in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order

for kerosene oil of that brand;
(iii) direct that no trader shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in the First Schedule hereto which is

adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;

(iv.) direct that every trader who sells kerosene oil of any brand specified in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that kerosene oil, on demand, a receipt on which shall be set out—

(a) the brand of the kerosene oil sold;

(b) the quantity of kerosene oil sold;
(c) the price paid; and
(d) the date of sale;

(v.) direct that for the purposes of this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (4th) of an Imperial gallon.

ELECTRIC TORCH BATTERIES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, William Holmes, Deputy Controller of Prices, Hambantota District, do, by this Order—

(i.) fix the price, which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices, as the maximum retail price per battery above which batteries of the description and size specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, increased by the amount specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, to be the maximum retail price per battery above which batteries of that description and size shall not sold within the limits of the Revenue District of Hambantota;

(ii.) direct that, for the purposes of this Order, any sale of any battery for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

a sale by retail;

(ii.) direct that every trader, who at any premises within the limits of the Revenue District of Hambantota, sells batteries of the description and size specified in column I of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for batteries of that description and size;

(iv.) direct that every person, who sells batteries of the description and size specified in column I of the Schedule hereto, shall give to every purchaser of batteries a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the quantity, description and size of the batteries sold;
 (b) the price paid for the quantity of batteries sold; and
- (c) the date of the sale.
