THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE.

Notification.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 1 of the regulations under sections 2 and 3 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance (Chapter 173), published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 7,481 of August 28, 1925, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification confirm the declaration of the "diseased localities" specified in the Schedule hereto, made by the Chairman of the Trincomalee Urban Council, the proper authority in that behalf, on January 13, 1943.

## Schedule.

1. The area within Ward No. 2 of the Trincomalee Urban Council Limits, bounded as follows:

North-East: Mudaliyar street.

South-East: Gael read. South-West: Inner Harbour road (excluding Kachcheri oremises).

North-West: Kacheheri road (excluding Kacheheri premises and Police Office).

2. The area within Ward No. 2 of the Trincomalce Urban Council Limits, bounded as follows :--

North-East: Court road. South-East: Dock Yard road. South-West: Kirby street. North-West: Gaol road.

3. The area within Ward No. 1 of the Trincomalee Urban Council Limits, south of Dyke street in Assessment Division No. 3, excluding the Civil Hospital premises, bounded as follows :-

North: Portion of Dyke street (Southern Section), lane leading to Dutch Bay and Dutch Bay.

East: Dutch Bay.

South: War Department Boundary, Dhoby Pond and Nevils road.

West: Dyke street and Nevils road.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

## Regulation.

The Defence (Restriction of Meals) (No. 2) Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 9.037 of November 20, 1942, are horeby amended as follows:--

(1) in regulation 2 (I)-

(a) by the insertion, immediately after the word "cheese" in the definition of "specified food", of the following:-

"(h) sweets or pudding (other than a pudding containing meat, poultry, game or fish);"

(b) by the substitution, in the definition of "subsidiary dish", for the words "which contains" of the words "which consists of or contains"; and

(2) in regulation 3 (I), by the substitution for sub-paragraph (a), (b), and (c) thereof, of the following:—

"(a) one main dish and two subsidiary dishes, or

(b) three subsidiary dishes, or (c) one rice dish and one subsidiary dish."

CYCLE TUBES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939. Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amonded by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingled w, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order-

(i.) fix the price specified in the Schedule heroto to be the maximum retail price per tube above which tubes of the description and size specified in the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail in Ceylon;

(ii.) direct that, for the purposes of this Order, any sale of any tube for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be

a sale by retail;

(iii.) direct that every authorised dealer, who at any premises in Ceylon sells tubes of the description and size specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum price fixed by this Order for tubes of that description and size;

(iv.) direct that every person, who sells tubes of the description and size specified in the Scheduld hereto, shall give to every purchaser of tubes a receipt in which there shall be set out—

(a) the quantity, description and size of the tubes sold;

(b) the price paid for the quantity of the tubes sold; and

(c) the date of the sale.

## ELECTRIC LAMPS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

#### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) do by this Order Articles), do, by this Order-

- (i.) fix the prices specified in the Schedule heroto to be the maximum retail price per electric lamp above which electric lamps of the description specified in the Schedule heroto shall not be sold by retail in
- (ii.) direct that, for the purposes of this Order, any sale of any electric lamps for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iii.) direct that every dealer, who at any premises in Ceylon sells any electric lamps of the description specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order;
- (iv.) direct that every person, who sells any electric lamps of the description specified in the Schedule heroto, shall give to every purchaser of such electric lamps a receipt in which there shall be set out—

  - (a) the description of the electric lamps sold;(b) the quantity of such electric lamps sold;(c) the price paid for the quantity of such electric lamps sold;

(d) the date of sale.

## COUNTRY-PADDY.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, William Holmes, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Hambantota District, do, by this

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum (wholesale and retail) price per bushel and the maximum retail price per measure above which paddy of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;
- (ii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale or any sale of any paddy in a quantity of 4 bushels or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

- (b) any sale of any quantity of paddy less than 4 bushels for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail:
- (c) a "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale paddy of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto;
- (iii.) direct that no person shall sell paddy of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with paddy of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (iv.) direct that any person who, at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, sells paddy of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit, in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order for paddy of that description and grade;
- (v.) direct that every person who sells by wholesale paddy of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall, and overy person who sells by retail paddy of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out
  - (a) the date of the sale;
  - (b) the description and grade of paddy sold;

(c) the quantity of paddy sold;

(d) the price paid for the quantity sold; and (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
