THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulation.

The Defence (Rice Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 8,957 of June 26, 1942, are hereby amended as follows :—

- (1) in regulation 2 (1), by the substitution in the definition of “proper authority”, for the words “a Deputy Food Controller”, of the words “a Deputy or Assistant Food Controller”; and
- (2) by the addition, at the end of those Regulations, of the following new regulation :—

“8. (1) Within seven days of the death of the holder of a rice ration book—

- (a) the occupier of the house or premises, or the person in charge of the prison, hospital or other institution, in which the death occurred, or
- (b) any person giving information of the death to a Registrar of Deaths

shall, if such occupier or person is in possession of the rice ration book issued to the deceased, deliver such ration book to the proper authority of the Province, District or area in which the death occurred, or, if such occupier or person is not in possession of such ration book, shall furnish to the proper authority all such information at his disposal as may be likely to facilitate the recovery of such ration book by the proper authority.

(2) Where any person, other than any of the persons mentioned in paragraph (1) of this regulation, is in possession of the rice ration book issued to a person who has died, he shall, within seven days of the death, deliver such ration book to the proper authority of the Province, District or area in which the death occurred or, if he resides in any other Province, District or area, to the proper authority of such other Province, District or area.”

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, published in *Gazette* No. 8,338 of December 17, 1937, are hereby amended in regulation 22, by the substitution, for the words “purpose of slaughter.”, of the words “purpose of slaughter, except at the port of Kays.”.

PEDAL CYCLE TYRES AND TUBES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date Order dated October 22, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,024 of October 23, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum price fixed in respect of Goodyear Takat Tyres, 28 by 1½, mentioned in Schedule I. thereto;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in the Schedules I. and II. hereto to be the maximum retail price per tyre or the maximum retail price per tube, as the case may be, above which tyres or tubes of the descriptions and grades specified in those Schedules shall not be sold by retail in Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that, for the purposes of this Order, any sale of any tyre or tube for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iv.) direct that every trader who, at any premises in Ceylon sells tyres or tubes of any description and grade specified in the Schedules I. and II. hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for tyres and tubes of that description and grade;
- (v.) direct that every person, who sells tyres or tubes of any description and grade specified in the Schedules I. and II. hereto, shall give to every purchaser of tyres or tubes, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity, description, and grade of the tyres or tubes sold;
 - (b) the price paid for the quantity of the tyres or tubes sold; and
 - (c) the date of sale.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Henry David Manders, Deputy Controller of Prices, Matale District, do, by this Order—

- (1) rescind my Order dated January 13, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,071 of January 22, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale and retail prices fixed in respect of rice for the areas specified in the Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure, respectively, above which any variety of rice of any description and grade shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that paragraphs 2, 3, 4 and 5 of my Order dated January 13, 1943, relating to prices of rice in Matale District, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,071 of January 22, 1943, shall apply in the case of any sale either by wholesale or by retail of any variety of rice within any area specified in the Schedule hereto as though those paragraphs were incorporated in this Order.

CANE JAGGERY (SAKKARAI).

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39, OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Chinnappa Coomaraswamy, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Badulla District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight and the maximum retail price per pound above which the article of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (2) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one hundredweight or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity less than one hundredweight of any article for the purpose of consumption or use by a purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) an "importer" shall mean any person who has cleared from the Customs in his name any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - (d) a "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
 - (e) "importer's maximum price" shall apply to the sale (by wholesale) of any article by an importer to a wholesale dealer;

- (f) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
- (g) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;

- (3) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description or grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (4) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- (5) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale,
 - (b) the description and grade of the article sold,
 - (c) the weight of the quantity sold,
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity sold, and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (6) direct that every importer of, and wholesale dealer in the article specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, who has his place of business or store within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall furnish to the Controller of Prices, 111, Dam street, Colombo, on or before February 10, 1943, returns (sent separately in respect of each store), which shall specify—
 - (a) the address of every premises containing stocks of the article specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto in his possession or under his control;
 - (b) the quantity of the article specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto which is contained in those premises.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Chinnappa Coomaraswamy, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Badulla District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated December 11, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,052 of December 15, 1942, so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed for sales of sugar within the Province of Uva ;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the First Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per bag (wholesale and retail) and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the said Schedule shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule ;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per bag (wholesale and retail) and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule ;
- (4) fix the price specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Third Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per bag (wholesale and retail) and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the Third Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule ;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
 - (c) " sugar " shall exclude all forms of jaggery ;
- (6) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the Schedules hereto which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality ;
- (7) direct that every trader who at any premises within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedules hereto sells sugar of any description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the Schedules hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade ;
- (8) direct that every trader who, within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedules hereto, sells any sugar of the description and grade mentioned in column 2 of the Schedules hereto, shall give the purchaser of that sugar, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale ;
 - (b) the quantity of sugar sold (by weight) ;
 - (c) the description and grade of sugar sold ;
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold ; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Chinnappa Coomaraswamy, Deputy Controller of Prices (Misc. Articles), Badulla District, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum retail price half bottle and the maximum retail price per quarter bottle above which kerosene oil of the brand specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;

- (iii.) direct that no trader shall sell Cane Jaggery of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description, grade or quality;
- (iv.) direct that every trader who at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto sells Cane Jaggery of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of Cane Jaggery of that description and grade;
- (v.) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity of Cane Jaggery sold (by weight);
 - (c) the description of Cane Jaggery sold;
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity of Cane Jaggery sold; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

- (1) revoke my Orders dated September 15, 1942, and November 18, 1942, published in *Government Gazettes* No. 9,009 of September 18, 1942, and No. 9,038 of November 21, 1942, respectively, regarding Sugar;
- (2) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum wholesale price per bag above which Sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale price per bag above which Sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (3) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by the Order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum retail price per pound above which Sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Third Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price per pound above which Sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) "Maximum Wholesale Price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale;
 - (d) "Wholesale Dealer" shall mean any person who has been appointed a wholesale dealer for Sugar, by the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency);
 - (e) "Retail Dealer" shall mean any person who sells any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of consumption or use;
 - (f) the maximum price which may be demanded by a Wholesale Dealer from any Retail Dealer for any quantity of Sugar which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
 - (g) the weights of the bags of the varieties of Sugar shall be—

- (5) direct that no trader shall sell Sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or Sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every trader who sells Sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto (by wholesale or retail) shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of Sugar of that description and grade;
- (7) direct that every person who sells by wholesale Sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail Sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that Sugar a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the description and grade of Sugar sold;
 - (c) the weight of the quantity sold;
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity sold;
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail.
