#### THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE.

##### Notification.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 1 of the regulations under sections 2 and 3 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance (Chapter 173), published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,481 of August 28, 1925, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification confirm the declaration of the "diseased locality" specified in the Schedule hereto, made by the Assistant Government Agent, Mannar, the proper authority in that behalf on January 28, 1943.

##### Schedule.

The area bounded as follows :—

- East : A line from Rattakulam Railway Level Crossing to the Giant's Tank Inlet Channel and along the inlet channel to the 13th Mile Sluice ;  
North : A line from the 13th Mile Sluice to the junction at Perichcharkaddu ;  
West : A line from the junction at Perichcharkaddu to the 1st milepost on Murunkan-Silavathurai road ;  
South : A line from the 1st milepost on Murunkan-Silavathurai road to the Rattakulam Railway Level Crossing.

#### THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF EXPORTS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 3 (2) of the Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations.

##### Order.

The Order of Exemptions from the requirements as to a licence under regulation 3 (2) of the Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,062 of January 6, 1943, is hereby amended as follows :—

- (1) in paragraph (a) of that Order, by the addition of the following new item immediately after "plumbago":—  
"mica";
- (2) by the substitution, for paragraph (e) of that Order, of the following new paragraphs :—  
"(e) the despatch by post, to any destination in the British Empire except Canada or Newfoundland, of any commodity produced in Ceylon, not being textiles referred to in paragraph (f), and not being :  
soap ;  
food, including foodstuffs (other than tea not exceeding two pounds in weight) ;  
articles manufactured wholly or mainly out of copper, brass or other alloys of copper ;  
(ee) the despatch by post to Canada, Newfoundland or any country not forming part of the British Empire in any quantity which does not exceed two pounds in weight of any commodity produced in Ceylon, not being textiles referred to in paragraph (f), and not being :  
precious stones, semi-precious stones and pearls whether or not mounted, set or strung ; and articles mounted or set with such precious stones, semi-precious stones or pearls ;

postage stamps of philatelic interest (except stamps in prepayment of postage) ;  
fur skins or goods manufactured or produced wholly or mainly of fur skins ;  
works of art, including paintings in oil or water colours, drawing, sculptures (and castings) in any material whether in the round, in relief, or in intaglio, and hand-engraved or hand-etched blocks, plates, or other material and hand-printed impressions thereof, but not including ordinary decorative articles made by stencilling or photographic, chemical or other industrial or mechanical processes ;  
antiques, that is to say, articles including books and manuscripts made, produced or manufactured not less than 75 years before the date of the proposed exportation thereof ;

soap ;  
food, including foodstuffs (other than tea) ;  
articles manufactured wholly or mainly out of copper, brass or other alloys of copper ;"

and

- (3) by the substitution, for paragraph (f) of that Order, of the following new paragraph :—

"(f) the exportation or re-exportation in such quantity as may be authorised by the Controller of Textiles of any cotton, silk, satin, artificial silk, linen, or woollen or other textile piece goods and all manufactures thereof ;"

### (SUGAR RETAIL).

#### THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

##### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices, by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Colombo District, do, by this Order :—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my order dated December 18, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 9,055 of December 24, 1942, relating to retail prices of sugar ;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, to be the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned at the head of columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, shall not be sold by retail in the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto ;
- (3) direct that every retail dealer, who sells sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for sugar of such description and grade ;
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with sugar of an inferior description and grade ;
- (5) direct that for the purpose of this Order "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery ;
- (6) prescribe that every retail dealer, who sells sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule

(8) direct that every retail dealer, who has no stocks of sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice to the effect that stocks of sugar of such description and grade are not available for sale for the time being.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

SUGAR (WHOLESALE).

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3) ) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Colombo District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated December 18, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 9,055 of December 24, 1942, relating to wholesale prices of sugar ;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 to 14 of the schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per bag above which sugar of the description, grade and weight specified at the head of each column shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto ;
- (3) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
  - (b) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale ;
  - (c) "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who has been selected by me or by an Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) as such ;
  - (d) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer for any quantity of sugar which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order ; if the price so determined for a quantity less than a bag contains a fraction less than half a cent, the fraction shall be rounded off to the nearest half-cent above such fraction ;
  - (e) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery ;
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of the descriptions and grades mentioned in the head of columns 2 to 14 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality ;
- (5) direct that every trader, who sells sugar of the descriptions and grades mentioned in the head of columns 2 to 14 of the Schedule hereto for sale (by wholesale) shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of those descriptions and grades ;
- (6) direct that every trader, who sells (by wholesale) sugar of the descriptions and grades mentioned in the head of columns 2 to 14 of the Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of that sugar a receipt on which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the descriptions and grades of the sugar sold (by wholesale) ;
  - (b) the quantity of sugar sold ;
  - (c) the price paid for the sugar sold ; and
  - (d) the date of sale ;
- (7) direct that every trader who has no stocks of sugar of the descriptions and grades mentioned in the head of the columns 2 to 14 of the Schedule hereto available for sale, shall exhibit at his premises a notice to the effect that stocks of sugar of that descriptions and grades are not available for sale for the time being.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,  
1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

## Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any other law or in any ancient customs relating to irrigation or cultivation of paddy lands—

- (1) it shall be the duty of the owner of any paddy land who does not intend to cultivate that land or cause it to be cultivated during any season or seasons, to give notice in that behalf to the proper authority of the area in which the land is situated, not less than one month before the commencement of the period in which sowing is usually carried out in that area;
- (2) on receipt of the notice given by any person under paragraph (1), the proper authority may take possession of the land referred to in the notice, and certify by writing under his hand that he has so taken possession of the land for the purpose of causing the land to be cultivated with paddy during the season or seasons specified in the aforesaid notice;
- (3) the proper authority shall not be liable to pay any rent in respect of any land of which he takes possession under this Regulation or to deliver any share of the produce of the land, or to pay any part of the profits derived from such produce, to the owner of such land;
- (4) where the expenses incurred by the proper authority in repairing any damage or defect in such land, or the amount which may reasonably be deemed to be the proportionate share of the expenses incurred by him in repairing any channel or irrigation work by which the land is benefited, exceeds the profits derived from the cultivation of the land by the proper authority during any season, the excess shall be recoverable from the owner as a debt due to the Crown: provided, however, that where, at the commencement of the next succeeding season, the aforesaid repairs continue to be effective and such debt remains unpaid, the proper authority may retain possession of the land and cultivate it for a period not exceeding two years from the date of the completion of the aforesaid repairs.

3. It shall be the duty of the owner or cultivator of every paddy land which is cultivated during any season to give to the proper authority of the area in which the land is situated or any person authorised in writing by him, the following information whenever such information is required by such authority or person:—

- (a) the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest on that land;

- (b) the name, situation and extent of the land;

- (c) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land, under any contract or agreement or otherwise; and

(d) the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

4. The proper authority or any person authorised by him in that behalf shall have power—

(a) to enter and inspect any land which is cultivated with paddy or any threshing-floor on which the harvest is stacked or any barn or other place where paddy is stored;

(b) to do all such things as may be necessary to assess the quantity of paddy that is likely to be produced on that land or threshed on such threshing-floor or stored in such barn or other place; and

(c) to require any person present at the time of such inspection or assessment to furnish information as to the names and addresses of the persons who are known to be entitled to shares in such paddy and the respective shares claimed by such persons.

5. In these Regulations, "proper authority" in relation to any land means the Government Agent or Additional Government Agent of the Province, the Assistant Government Agent of the District, or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area, in which the land is situated.

## Regulation.

The Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 9,004 of September 11, 1942, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) in Regulation 2, by the substitution, for the words "authorised officer.", of the words "authorised officer, except under the authority of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to such permit.";
- (2) in Regulation 4, by the omission of paragraph (b) of the proviso to that Regulation;
- (3) in Regulation 5, by the addition, at the end of paragraph (1) of that Regulation, of the following:—

"For the purposes of this paragraph, a person shall not be deemed to acquire any article of food as aforesaid where such article has been grown or cultivated by him or on his behalf."

(4) in Regulation 6—

- (a) in paragraph (1) of that Regulation, by the substitution, for the words "peace officer", of the words "peace officer or any person authorised thereto in writing by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent";
- (b) in paragraph (2) of that Regulation, by the substitution, for the words "peace officer", of the words "peace officer or any person authorised thereto in writing by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent";

(5) by the insertion, immediately after Regulation 6, of the following new Regulations:—

" 6A. (1) Where the Food Controller or a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent has reason to suspect that any road or waterway is being used for the transport of country paddy or country rice in contravention of these Regulations, he may erect across the road or waterway or any part thereof a barrier or barriers of such nature and description as to him may seem necessary for the purpose of stopping vehicles or vessels using such road or waterway or causing such vehicles or vessels to be halted.

(2) Where any barrier has been erected under paragraph (1) across any road or waterway or part thereof, the Food Controller or a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent or a peace officer or any person authorised thereto in writing by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent may—

- (a) give such orders, directions or signals as may be necessary to cause any vehicle or vessel using such road or waterway to stop or to be halted at such barrier;
- (b) inspect and search every vehicle or vessel stopped or halted at such barrier, for the purpose of ascertaining whether country paddy or country rice is being transported in contravention of these Regulations in the vehicle or vessel.

6B. The Food Controller or a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent or a peace officer or any person authorised thereto in writing by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent may seize and detain any country paddy or country rice which he has reasonable cause to believe is being transported in contravention of these Regulations. All such paddy or rice so seized and detained shall be produced before a Magistrate within a reasonable time and shall be disposed of in such manner as the Magistrate may direct in the circumstances of each case."

and

(6) by the substitution, for Regulation 7, of the following new Regulation:—

" 7. The Food Controller shall have power, by notice applicable to any class or description of persons specified therein and published in such manner as he may deem adequate, to require every person of that class or description to furnish to an officer specified in the notice a return or any information relating to the stocks of paddy, rice, kurakkan or any other article of food in the possession of that person.

The power conferred on the Food Controller by the preceding provisions of this Regulation may be exercised by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent within his province, district or area, as the case may be."

### CANE JAGGERY (SAKKARAI).

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

#### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Edward Trevor Dyson, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Kandy District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the importer's maximum price per hundredweight, the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight and the maximum retail price per pound above which the article of the description and grade specified in the corresponding

entry in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Revenue District of Kandy;

(2) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

- (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one hundredweight or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
- (b) any sale of any quantity less than one hundredweight of any article for the purpose of consumption or use by a purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (c) an "importer" shall mean any person who has cleared from the Customs in his name any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
- (d) a "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale any article mentioned in the Schedule hereto;
- (e) "importer's maximum price" shall apply to the sale (by wholesale) of any article by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
- (f) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
- (g) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;

(3) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description or grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality;

(4) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the Revenue District of Kandy, sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;

(5) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of the sale;
- (b) the description and grade of the article sold;
- (c) the weight of the quantity sold;
- (d) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;

(6) direct that every importer of, and wholesale dealer in, the article specified in the Schedule hereto, who has his place of business or store within the Revenue District of Kandy, shall furnish to the Controller of Prices, 111, Dam street, Colombo, on or before February 5, 1943, returns (sent separately in respect of each store), which shall specify—

- (a) the address of every premises containing stocks of the article specified in the Schedule hereto in his possession or under his control;
- (b) the quantity of the article specified in the Schedule hereto which is contained in those premises.
