THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,

1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Food 1. Control) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1943. 2. During the continuance in force of these regulations, the Regulations in Part III. under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, shall have effect as though--

(a) in Regulation 13 (1) in the aforesaid Part III., for all the words from "if he is satisfied" to "controlled commodity,", there were substituted the words

of the aforesaid Part III. :-

Revocation of authority granted to distributors and wholesale dealers.

18. (1) The Deputy Food Controller for any district or area may at any time, if he is satisfied that any authorised distributor or wholesale dealer has acted in contravention of or failed to comply with any provision of the Ordinance or of these regulations or of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, or of any order or regulation made thereunder, or if he considers it expedient so to do in the interests of the public, by Order revoke the authority granted or the directions issued to that distributor or dealer under Regulation 5in this Part.

(2) Every Order made by any Deputy Food Controller under paragraph (1) of this Regulation shall be final and conclusive.
