DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940

Regulation

(1) This regulation may be cited as the Defence (Police Ordinance Amendment) Regulation, 1943

(2) During the continuance in force of this regulation—

Cap 43 (1) section 28 of the Police Ordinance shall have effect—

(a) as though, for all the words from "unless expressly allowed" to "intention to do so," there were substituted the words "unless expressly allowed to do so in writing by the Inspector-General of Police," and

(b) as though, for the words "without leave or two months' notice" occurring in the marginal note to that section, there were substituted the words "without leave", and

(ii) section 77 of that Ordinance shall have effect as though, for the words "without leave or without having given two months' notice," occurring in paragraph (b) of that section, there were substituted the words "without leave"

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

Order

1 This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Electric Torches and Torch Batteries) Order, 1943

2 Electric torches and electric torch batteries are hereby declared to be controlled articles for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

3 (1) Every person (whether or not he carries on business as a seller or supplier of torches or batteries) who, on the date on which this order is published in the *Gazette* has in his possession or under his control more than six new torches or more than six new batteries shall, before the expiry of a period of seven days from that date, transmit to the Controller a return in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order setting out—

(a) the number, description and size of such torches and batteries in his possession or under his control on that date, and

(b) the situation of the premises at which such torches and batteries are kept or stored

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any person who, on any date prior to the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, has furnished a return in compliance with any notice issued by the Controller

(2) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any new torches or batteries in his possession or under his control, a separate return shall be made in respect of the stock kept in each such premises

(3) No person (whether or not he carries on business as a seller or supplier of torches or batteries) who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette* has in his possession or under his control in any premises more than six new torches or more than six new batteries shall remove any of such torches or batteries from such premises to any other place or dispose of any of such torches or batteries except with the written permission of the Controller

4 Every person who imports any new torches or batteries shall, before the expiry of a period of three days of the arrival of such torches or batteries, transmit to the Controller a return setting out the number, description and size of the torches and batteries imported by him

5 No person who imports any new torches or batteries, shall sell or dispose of any of such torches or batteries—

(a) to any person other than an authorised dealer specified in that behalf by the Controller, or

(b) otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

6 The Controller may in his discretion—

(a) appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary, to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or distributing new torches or batteries under this Order, and

(b) cancel any such appointment at any time

7 No person other than an authorised dealer shall, after the prescribed date, purchase or acquire any new torch or

battery of any description, except under a permit authorising that person to purchase or acquire such torch or battery

8 (1) No authorised dealer shall, after the prescribed date, sell or dispose of any new torch or battery of any description to any person, except upon the surrender by that person of a permit authorising him to purchase or acquire such torch or battery from that dealer

(2) No authorised dealer shall, after such or battery in his possession or under his control, except under a permit authorising him to appropriate such torch or battery to his own use

(3) No authorised dealer shall, after the prescribed date, remove any new torch or battery kept in his premises to any other place except with the written permission of the Controller

9 No person who is required by paragraph 3 (1) to furnish a return shall, unless he has been appointed an authorised dealer, sell or dispose of any new torch or battery to any person other than an authorised dealer or otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

10 (1) Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by notification published in the *Gazette*

(2) The Controller may in his discretion refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant, and the decision of the Controller shall be final

(3) A permit under this Order shall be valid only during such period as may be specified in the permit

11 No person to whom any permit has been granted under this Order shall transfer the permit to any other person

12 The Controller shall specify in every permit issued under this Order the name of the authorised dealer from whom the new torch or battery to which the permit relates is to be purchased or obtained

13 (1) Every person to whom a permit has been granted under this Order shall, before taking delivery of the new torch or battery to which the permit relates—

(a) affix his signature (or his thumb-print, if he is unable to write) to the permit in the presence of the authorised dealer,

(b) surrender the permit to that dealer, and

(c) in every case where he takes delivery of a new battery, unless otherwise stated in the permit, deliver to that dealer, without demanding payment therefor, the old battery which is to be replaced by the new battery to which the permit relates

(2) The authorised dealer by whom any new battery is sold or supplied under the authority of a permit shall, before the expiry of a period of seven days from the date of the sale or supply, dispose of the old battery delivered to him at the time of such sale or supply, in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

14 No person shall sell or supply or purchase or acquire any new torch or any new battery otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order

15 Every importer and every authorised dealer shall—

(a) maintain such records or registers relating to his business as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain, and

(b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to his business as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish

16 Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate

17 If any applicant for a permit under this Order makes any false statement in his application, then, without prejudice to the institution or maintenance of a prosecution against him for any offence thereby committed, that application or any subsequent application by that person for a permit under this Order may be refused by the Controller

18 The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller

19 (1) In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—

“battery” means any battery intended for use in an electric torch,

“Controller” means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) appointed under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939,

“new battery” means a battery which has not been used and which is not fitted to any torch,

“new torch” means an unused torch,

“permit” means a permit issued under this Order,

“torch” means an electric torch

(2) The prescribed date for the purposes of this Order shall be such date as may be appointed by the Controller by notification published in the *Gazette*

The general by laws relating to licences published in Gazette No 8,027 of January 12, 1934, as amended by law published in Gazette No 8,776 of August 1, 1941, are hereby further amended by the addition, immediately after the by-laws relating to "Timber and firewood stores", of the following new by laws —

"Dangerous and offensive trades

1 No person shall be entitled to a licence to carry on any dangerous or offensive trade unless the premises to be licensed are in conformity with the following requirements —

- (a) The premises must be in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted, and every room must be provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open must be not less than one fifteenth of the superficial floor space
- (b) The walls of every room in every part must be not less than 7 feet in height and must be built of brick, stone or cabook, and the lower 4 feet of the internal surface must be plastered in cement, and the rest of the internal surfaces limeplastered and limewashed
- (c) The eaves must be at least 6 feet from the ground
- (d) The roof must be made of some permanent material
- (e) The woodwork must be oil painted or limewashed
- (f) The floor must be cemented throughout
- (g) The premises must be provided with adequate drainage
- (h) The premises must be provided with a sanitary dust bin
- (i) The premises must be provided with sufficient latrine accommodation for the use of the persons employed in the premises

2 Every licensee shall store all materials required for the purpose of carrying on any dangerous or offensive trade in such a way as to prevent the diffusion of effluvia or other similar nuisance

3 Every licensee who carries along any public place or thoroughfare any materials which are likely to be offensive or to give off effluvia shall carry such materials in non absorbent covered receptacles so as to prevent the creation of any nuisance

4 Every licensee shall cause all offensive vapours or gases emitted during any process or manufacture to be discharged into the external air in such manner and at such a height as to ensure their absorption into the upper air without injurious or offensive effects upon the neighbourhood or be passed directly through a fire into a condensing apparatus

5 Every licensee shall cause the drains of the licensed premises to be kept in efficient order and to be washed daily

6 Every licensee shall cause the floors of the licensed premises to be maintained in a proper state of repair and to be cleansed daily

7 Every licensee shall keep the walls of the licensed premises in good repair, so as to prevent the absorption of filth, and shall cause them to be whitewashed annually

8 Every licensee shall cause all apparatus including implements and vessels used in any dangerous or offensive trade to be kept clean, and where possible to be cleansed daily

9 Every licensee shall cause refuse, sweepings, and scrapings together with all waste and bye products to be removed daily from the licensed premises in covered receptacles, unless such refuse, sweepings, scrapings, waste or bye products are intended to be forthwith subjected to further trade purposes on the premises

10 Every licensee shall cause every tank used for washing cleansed as often as may be necessary to be emptied and or diffusion of effluvia

11 No licensee shall pollute any river, stream, canal, channel, well, tank, or any open piece of water by discharging or suffering to flow therein any foul, ill smelling or offensive water or other fluid or by throwing therein or suffering to be washed therein any offensive substance, or in any other way pollute or contaminate such river, stream, canal, channel, well, tank or open piece of water

12 Every licensee of a brick or tile manufactory shall cause any pits or trenches in the licensed premises to be filled so as to prevent the stagnation of water therein

The by laws relating to the Resthouse at Chilaw, published in Gazette No 8,390 of September 2, 1938 (and therein called "Rules"), are hereby amended in the Schedule thereto, by the substitution for the tariff appearing under the heading "(1) Occupation", of the following new tariff —

"1 For each person occupying any portion of the resthouse—

- (a) a consolidated fee of 10 cents per hour subject to a minimum charge of 25 cents when any meal other than afternoon tea is taken, or
- (b) a maximum charge of Re 1 50 in respect of any continuous period of 24 hours

2 Where occupation is on a monthly basis—

- (a) for each person occupying any portion of the resthouse exclusively reserved for his occupation, for each calendar month a consolidated fee of Rs 50,
- (b) for each person occupying any portion of the resthouse not exclusively reserved for his occupation, for each calendar month a consolidated fee of Rs 30

(The consolidated fee covers the use of towels, linen, beds, mosquito curtains, lights, &c)"

(b) to travel from Hatamune, Hingurakgoda and Minneriya to their home stations and *vice versa* on production of certificates signed by the Revenue Officer, Tamankaduwa or other official as may be notified from time to time

The minimum charge for each colonist or labourer shall be 25 cents ;

(3) by the omission of rule 25B

II Under the heading "Concessions", in rule 32—

(1) by the omission of all the words from "Concessions" (a) The following concessions are in force in this railway — to the words "or other recognised rifle meeting", appearing at the end of paragraph (7), and all the words commencing from "(9) Choristers, School Children and Lads belonging to Boys' Brigades" to the words "free allowance on tickets held" appearing at the end of paragraph (11),

(2) in paragraph (12) by the addition, immediately after item 23, of the following new item —

"24 Military Hospital Medical Officer in Charge Trincomalee",

(3) by the re numbering of paragraphs (8) and (12) as paragraphs (1) and (2) respectively,

(4) by the omission of paragraphs (13) to (19),

(5) by the re numbering of paragraph (20) as paragraph (3), and

(6) by the addition, at the end of re numbered paragraph (3), of the following —

"Tickets issued under this paragraph will be available for return within 17 days of the date of issue"

III Under the heading "Passengers' Luggage", in rule 33—

(1) In paragraph (f), by the substitution, for all the words from "any excess over to the end of that paragraph, of the following —

"Any excess over these weights will be charged full parcels rates up to the weight equivalent to the free allowance on the tickets held, and 50 per cent above full parcels rates on the weight in excess thereof. All excess luggage charges must be paid to the Booking Clerk at the time of booking and receipts obtained for payment, otherwise they are liable to be charged for a second time. The free allowance referred to above is granted only on the luggage booked at the starting station mentioned on the ticket, except where a journey is broken under rule 18 (j). If the luggage in excess of the free allowance is found unbooked, either en route or at destination, the whole of the luggage will be weighed and charged for as follows —

(i) if the excess weight is not more than 25 per cent of the free allowance, freight at ordinary parcels rate will be charged on the excess weight after making the free allowance on the tickets held,

(ii) if the excess weight is more than 25 per cent of the free allowance, the whole weight without making any free allowance will be charged ordinary parcels rate up to twice the free allowance, viz 2 cwt per first class, 1 cwt 2 qrs per second class and 1 cwt 1 qr per third class ticket held. Any excess over these weights will be charged 50 per cent above full parcels rate

Passengers who wish to book part of their luggage to an intermediate station in order to break journey under rule 18 (j) will be given the free allowance referred to above, and any excess charged to the ultimate destination. The luggage required for the break of journey will be separately weighed and noted on the labels affixed to such luggage, and if on resumption of journey the luggage is found to be over the weight noted thereon, the weight in excess will be charged as excess luggage. The luggage presented for booking at such intermediate stations without labels of the starting station will be treated and charged as ordinary parcels"

(2) by the substitution, in paragraph (p), for the words "articles of an offensive nature will not be conveyed as luggage but will be charged for at parcels or other special rates as specified in Parcels and Goods Regulations", of the following —

"articles of an offensive nature, empty tins, rubber, firewood, manure, copra, any package exceeding 10 cubic feet in size or 1 cwt in weight, and articles of merchandise other than fish, vegetables and fruits, will not be conveyed as luggage, but will be charged at parcels or other rates as specified in the rules relating to Parcels and Goods Traffic"

IV Under the heading "Parcels"—

(1) in rule 34, by the substitution, in paragraphs (d), for all the words from "All parcels" to "after arrival", of the following —

"(d) All parcels left in the railway premises beyond the first day after their arrival will be subject to cloak room charges as follows —

(i) 20 cents per cwt per diem for the first two days, subject to the minimum charge of 10 cents per package per diem

(ii) 30 cents per cwt per diem for any subsequent period subject to the minimum charge of 15 cents per package per diem"

(2) by the substitution, for rule 36, of the following new rule —

"36 Empty return packages in which aerated waters and articles specified in rule 35 have been conveyed by rail, will be charged at half parcels rates. Provided they are sent from the station at which they were received full and to the station from which they were despatched full, and the labels show the date on which and the station from which they were received full. The minimum charge under this rule shall be 20 cents"

(3) by the addition, immediately after rule 43, of the following new rule 43A —

(ii) by the omission, in paragraph (d), of the words "cars and motor"

(iii) by the substitution, in paragraph (e), for the words "owner of any motor vehicle before the vehicle can be accepted for conveyance by tram or, in the case of motor cycles for storage", of the following —

"Owner of any motor cycle before such cycle can be accepted for conveyance by tram or for storage"

(iv) by the addition, immediately after paragraph (e), of the following new paragraph —

"(f) (1) No motor cars will be accepted for carriage if charged with electricity, gas, oil or other inflammable liquid or vapour. Provided, however, that a quantity of petrol not exceeding two gallons may be left in the tank

(2) Where any petrol is left in the tank of any motor car, such car will not be accepted for carriage unless—

(i) the flow of petrol to the carburetter has been cut off,

(ii) any pressure in the tank has been released therefrom,

(iii) the tank is in a sound condition and closed by a well fitting cap; and

(iv) the engine has been run in any place other than a closed truck by the person in charge of the car until all the petrol in the carburetter has been used up and the engine has stopped automatically

(3) The provisions of sub paragraph (2) (iv) shall not apply to cars which are fitted with a petrol pump working from the engine, in which the feed supply is automatically cut off when the engine is stopped, or in which the carburetter is fed directly from the main tank without the aid of any form of gravity or other subsidiary feed tank

(4) Motor cars with tanks not more than three-fourths full of petrol will, however, be accepted for journeys between the hours of sunrise and sunset subject to the conditions set out in this paragraph

(5) No person shall light any fire, or carry any naked light, or smoke in or near any truck which contains a motor car

(6) The consignor of every motor car shall declare on the consignment note that the conditions set out in this paragraph have been complied with",

(2) in rule 54, by the substitution, for paragraph (a), of the following new paragraph —

"(a) Dogs when conveyed in crates or hampers will be charged for by weight at parcels rates. For each dog conveyed in the dog locker the charge will be at the rate of 35 cents for every 25 miles or part of 25 miles",

(4) in rule 57, by the substitution for the words "Mail carts, portable harmoniums", of the words "perambulators, mail carts, portable harmoniums"

Bicycles, tricycles, perambulators, bath chairs, &c, will be charged 30 cents each, and a further charge of 15 cents per day in addition will be made on all such articles remaining in the cloak room longer than two days"

VII Under the heading "Conveyance of Goods Traffic"—

(1) in rule 14, by the addition, at the end thereof, of the following —

"The General Manager may, however, at his discretion close down a goods office during specified periods of the day after due notice to the public",

(2) in rule 21, by the substitution, in the second paragraph, for the words "within one month", of the words "within two weeks",

(3) by the substitution, for rule 22, of the following new rule —

"22 Warehouse Rent—(a) All goods left in the railway premises beyond 10 working hours after their arrival will be subject to rent charges as follows —

"(a) The loading of wagons must be completed within 10 working hours from the time they are supplied. Consignors who having ordered wagons fail to load them, or having loaded them fail to furnish consignment notes, within 10 working hours from the time such wagons are supplied shall be liable to demurrage charges as follows —

Rs 10 for the first day or part of the day

Rs 20 for the second day or part of the day

Rs 30 for the third day or part of the day

Rs 50 per day for the fourth day or part of the day, and for every day or part of the day subsequent to the fourth day

(b) All wagons containing articles which the Railway does not undertake to unload and which are not discharged within 10 working hours after their arrival at the station of delivery will be liable to demurrage charges, at the rates specified in paragraph (a)

(e) The Government does not undertake either to provide warehouse accommodation for the goods referred to in the List of Articles other than Dangerous Goods for which the Railway does not undertake to provide Warehouse Accommodation, and bulky or heavy articles (referred to in rule 33) or to unload such goods, or to permit them to be unloaded until the consignee has supplied carts or other conveyances into which the goods can forthwith be transferred. If delivery of such goods is not taken within ten working hours after their arrival at the station of delivery demurrage charges will be levied at the rates specified in paragraph (a)",

(ii) by the omission of paragraphs (d) and (h),

(iii) by re lettering of paragraphs (e), (f) and (g) as (d), (e) and (f) respectively,

(iv) by the addition, immediately after the re lettered paragraph (f), of the following new paragraph —

"(g) In computing demurrage charges 8 A M to 5 P M will be considered as working hours at Colombo, and 7 30 A M to 5 30 P M at all other stations. Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday only will be considered as dies non"

(5) in rule 41, by the substitution, in paragraph (p), for all the words from "after 12 hours after arrival" to the end of that paragraph, of the following —

"after 10 working hours after arrival demurrage will be charged at the rates specified in rule 23, and if the goods be not removed within 24 hours after arrival, the packages and contents may be forthwith sold or otherwise disposed of"

(4) in regulation 82, by the substitution for paragraphs (a) and (b), of the following new paragraphs —

- (b) An insurance fee of 25 cents per 150 rupees or fraction of 150 rupees insured, in the case of an article addressed to India, and 50 cents per 300 rupees or fraction of 300 rupees insured, in the case of an article addressed to any other country "

DEFENCE (PADDY CULTIVATION) REGULATIONS

- (c) The names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land under any contract or agreement or otherwise, and
- (d) The share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled
