The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No 8,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after regulation 45L, of the following new regulation —

“Interference 45M Except for the purpose of preserving with water life or property, no unauthorised person pipes, etc, shall—
used for fire fighting

- (a) throw, put, or pour anything into any water stored by or on behalf of any of His Majesty's forces or any department of Government or any local authority for the purpose of fighting fires,
(b) climb into, on, or over any tank used for storing water as aforesaid,
(c) interfere with any pipes, valves, or other apparatus used or intended for use by or on behalf of any of His Majesty's forces or any department of Government or any local authority for the purpose of fighting fires

In this regulation, “unauthorised person” means any person other than—

- (a) a member of an Air Raid Precautions Service or of any unit of the Auxiliary Fire Service acting in the course of his duty as such,
(b) a servant of His Majesty acting in the course of his duty as such, or
(c) a person acting under general or special directions given by or on behalf of the Civil Defence Commissioner”

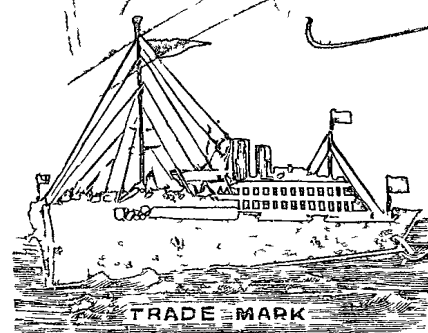
