Order

THE CO OPERATIVE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Co operative Societies Ordinance (Chapter 107), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this special order confer on Mr Ric and Cleveland Selvarasu Cooke, an officer appointed to assist the Registrar of Co operative Societies with effect from July 1, 1943, the following powers of the Registrar under that Ordinance —

- (1) power to register societies and the addresses of societies under sections 5, 6, 7 and 15,
- (2) power to register amendments of the by-laws of registered societies under section 8,
- (3) power to sanction, under section 34 (2), contributions by registered societies, out of nett profits, to a charitable purpose or a common-good fund,
- (4) power under sections 35 and 36 to inspect and dissolve registered societies, and
- (5) power under section 45 to deal with disputes referred for decision

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE

Regulations for St Anne's Festival

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Talavillu for St Anne's Festival in July, 1943

Regulations

1 In these regulations the expression “ camp area ” means the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto

and “ Assistant Government Agent ” means the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts

2 No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent

3 No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent

4 No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent

5 (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle

6 All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

7 No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area

8 In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance

9 (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

10 When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart

11 No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating house or gala within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge

12 No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp

13 No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area

14 No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness

Schedule.

Boundaries of Talavillu “ Camp Area ”

North by Talavillu odoi, south by path leading due west to sea from junction at Erumbukudal of Etalari Talavillu and Telikudah Talavillu paths, east by Pandaram and Karukku wachcham and Periyatotam roads, west by sea

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE

Regulations for the Amirthakallu Festival

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Amirthakallu, within the limits of the Urban Council, Batticaloa

1 (1) These regulations shall be in force during the period commencing on the 20th day of July, 1943, and ending on the 1st day of August, 1943

(2) In these regulations "camp area" means the area within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto, "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Urban Council, Batticaloa

2 No person shall camp in any part of the camp area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Chairman by special or general order or by notice exhibited on the spot

3 No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by or with the approval of the Chairman

4 No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid within the camp area, except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Chairman

5 (1) No person shall keep any cattle—(a) in the camp area, or (b) in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala, or at a place approved for such use by the Chairman

(2) Every person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed daily from the camp area to the nearest place occupied by his cattle

6 Every person who exposes food for sale within the camp area shall keep such food—

(a) wrapped in, or covered with, clean paper or cloth so as to protect such food from contamination by flies or dust or,

(b) in closed glass cases, or

(c) in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

7 No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area, or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area

8 In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during festival it shall be lawful for the Chairman to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area, and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart

9 Every person within the camp area who contracts any infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

10 When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart

11 No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala, or expose for sale rice, cakes within the camp area, unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Chairman, Urban Council, Batticaloa. Such licence shall be issued free of charge

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Chairman, construct any booth or extend any building, so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area

13 No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Chairman, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area, or within the distance of one mile from the boundaries of such area

14 No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Chairman, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

Schedule.

The boundaries of the "Camp area" are as follows—

East—(a) The portion of the boundary road starting from the junction of Kulavadi lane and Boundary road up to Bar road junction

(b) Bar road from junction of Boundary road up to the point it meets the flood outlet drain leading from Hanuman Theertham

South—Kulavadi lane up to the point where it meets the Railway line and along the Railway line from this point up to the 216th milepost

West—A straight line drawn from the 216th milepost from the Railway line to the most westerly point of Hanuman Theertham

North—Along the eastern boundary of Hanuman Theertham and the flood outlet drain leading from Hanuman Theertham up to the point it meets the Bar road

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Dewundara Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale in the Matara District, Southern Province, commencing in July, 1943

A CALDECOTT,
Governor*Pilgrimage to Dewundara Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale**Regulations*

1 In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity immediately before or during the pilgrimage, or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage, or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all pilgrims to leave Dondra forthwith and return to their homes, and to prescribe the routes by which they shall depart

2 No person who is suffering from a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature shall enter Dondra

3 No person shall bring any person suffering from a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature into Dondra, or aid or abet such person in entering Dondra

4 Every person who contracts a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted any such disease, shall forthwith report the case to the Sanitary Assistant or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police at Dondra

5 (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale at Dondra in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board

(2) No person shall sell meat, food or drink of any kind which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Sanitary Assistant or Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Divisional Revenue Officer, of the District or senior officer of Police present at Dondra

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Assistant to seize and destroy any meat, food or drink condemned as unwholesome under the provisions of paragraph (2)

6 (1) All eating houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition

(2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed flyproof glass cases

(3) No waste tea, coffee or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacles hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by sanitary authorities

(4) Every building, structure or place used for the purpose of any trade or business, shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in the bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover

7 (1) No person shall erect any booth or building for the purpose of the pilgrimage—

(a) Within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla and of the approach road to the dewale, or

(b) within such area as may be reserved by the Assistant Government Agent for the accommodation of pilgrims or the parking of vehicles

(2) No person shall expose any article of any description for sale within any space referred to in paragraph (1) (a)

8 The proprietor or lessee of the premises used for the accommodation of pilgrims shall—

GENERAL CLERICAL SERVICE EXAMINATION

Date of Examination—

1 A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the General Clerical Class, Grade II, will be held in Colombo, Kandy, Galle, and Jaffna, on September 25, 1943

2 (i) *Salary*—Successful candidates will be appointed to the General Clerical Class, Grade II, on the salary of Rs 600 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs 42 to Rs 1,398 per annum. In this scale an efficiency bar operates before Rs 1,020 per annum

(ii) *Conditions of Service*—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934. No rent allowance is payable unless the successful candidate holds an appointment under the Ceylon Government and was appointed before June 1, 1934.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on 2 years' probation. They will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed. They will be subject to the Public Service, Financial and other Standing Regulations of the Government.

(c) Successful candidates who may have previous pensionable, non pensionable or Quasi Government service will not be given incremental credit in respect of such service.

3 The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

Applications—

4 Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Director of Education on forms which may be obtained from his office up to August 2, 1943.

5 Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on August 9, 1943. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

6 The Director of Education will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Eligibility—

7 Candidates must be of good character.

8 Candidates must be Ceylonese.*

9 Candidates must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least—

(a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or

(b) The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College, or

(c) The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination and either (i) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce or (ii) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce.

Their applications must also bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs 10.

10 (i) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be born not earlier than August 1, 1921, and not later than August 1, 1926, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii) Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv) If candidates submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, these certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known—(a) the parent or guardian in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94, Legislative Enactments), and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

(a) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon, or

(b) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a) or

(c) a British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances to be a Ceylonese.

to the satisfaction of the Director of Education that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, a certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended, otherwise it may be from the candidates' teacher or school master by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary; or, generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

11 Clerks on the permanent establishment of Government Departments who are paid directly from "Personal Emoluments" Votes in the Government Estimates (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's, or Railway Departments, Draughtsmen, and Stenographers), if within the age prescribed in these regulations will be admitted without fee provided that they have passed the examination or examinations prescribed by regulation 9 above and that their services since employment under Government have been throughout satisfactory.

Withdrawals and Refunds—

12 (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5 the value of stamps affixed to his application.

(b) If a candidate, who has been admitted to the examination gives notice of his withdrawal to the Director of Education at least 7 days before the date of the examination, a refund will be made of half the value of stamps affixed to his application. His form of admission to the examination should be returned to the Director of Education for the refund to be made.

(c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness, should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Director of Education at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.

Leave to Government Officers to attend Examination—

13 Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education, leave to present themselves at the examination.

Subjects—

14 The subjects for the examination are as follows—

(1) English Language and Composition— A one and half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis and questions to test the correct use of the English language	150
(2) General Paper— A two hour paper in three sections as follows	
(a) 20 minutes A test of accuracy with figures including Totals and additions of various kinds	150

(c) 50 minutes A test of general and local knowledge	
(3) One of the following — Sinhalese Tamil Arabic English (Special Paper)	One hour paper 100

Sinhalese must be taken by Sinhalese candidates and Tamil by Tamil candidates. Arabic or English (Special Paper) may be taken only by those candidates who are by race neither Sinhalese nor Tamil.

(4) *Viva Voce* Test—Candidates are required to produce at the *viva voce* test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to the General Clerical Service Examination.

15 The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the *Viva Voce*. The number to be called for the *Viva Voce* examination will be fixed by the Deputy Chief Secretary in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified. The *Viva Voce* examination will be held in Colombo.

Medical Examination—

16 The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

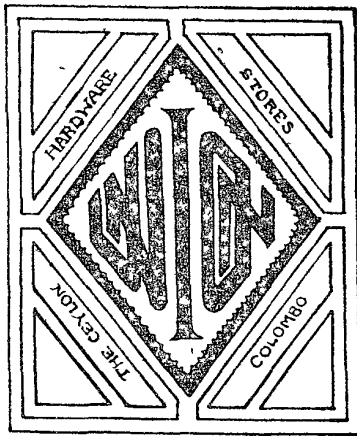

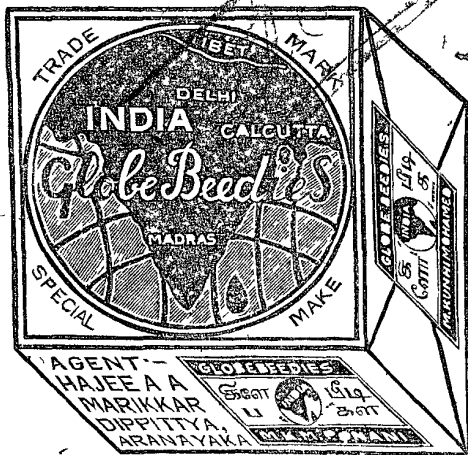
