THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939

AND

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (CUSTODIAN) ORDER, 1940

WHEREAS Mrs S M Yesudian has become entitled to the immovable property more fully described in the Schedule hereto under the provisions of her mother's last will

And whereas the said Mrs S M Yesudian is now believed to be residing in Butterworth Province, Wellesley, Malaya, and is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, read with the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

Order

- 1 This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Quinine) Order

2 In this Order—

“Controller” means the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services and includes any other officer of the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services acting under his authority,

“dealer” means a person who imports any quinine or any of its salts into Ceylon for the purposes of trade or carries on any business (whether wholesale or retail) as a seller or supplier of quinine or its salts, and includes any person who carries on any such business together with any other business,

“medical practitioner” and “pharmacist” have the same meaning as in the Medical Ordinance

Cap 90

3 Quinine and all salts of quinine are hereby declared to be controlled articles within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

4 No dealer in quinine or any of its salts shall—

- (a) sell or supply any quantity of such quinine or salts to any person other than a medical practitioner or a dealer,
- (b) being a pharmacist, sell or supply any quinine or any of its salts to any person other than a medical practitioner or a dealer except on the prescription of a medical practitioner

Provided that the provisions of Sub paragraph (b) shall not apply to the sale or supply to any person at any one time of a quantity of quinine tablets containing in the aggregate not more than sixty grains of quinine

5 No medical practitioner shall administer, prescribe or supply quinine or any of its salts for any purpose other than the curative treatment of malaria

6 No pharmacist shall sell or supply any quinine or any of its salts to any person except at premises licensed under section 55 of the Poisons, Opium and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance

7 Every person (not being a medical practitioner or a dealer) who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, has in his possession or under his control any stock of quinine or its salts exceeding one ounce in weight, and every person in charge of any estate hospital or estate dispensary which is established under the Medical Wants Ordinance and at which on that date any stock of quinine or its salts exceeding five pounds in weight is kept, shall, before the expiry of a period of fourteen days from that date furnish to the Controller a return setting out—

- (a) the name and address and the place of business, if any, of that person,
- (b) the nature and quantity of such stock,
- (c) the purpose for which such stock is kept,
- (d) the situation of the premises at which such stock is kept

8 No person who is required by paragraph 7 to furnish a return shall sell or dispose of any part of the stock of quinine or its salts in his possession or under his control except with the prior approval of or except in accordance with such directions as may be given by the Controller

9 Every medical practitioner having a private dispensary and every dealer shall—

- (a) maintain such records or registers relating to stocks of quinine or its salts purchased, sold or otherwise disposed of by him as the Controller may prescribe by notification published in the *Gazette* and in at least two newspapers circulating in Ceylon, and
- (b) furnish to the Controller or to such person as the Controller may specify such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may, from time to time, require him to furnish

10 Every return furnished under this Order shall be verified by a declaration signed by the person furnishing the return to the effect that the particulars set out in such return are true and accurate

11 The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may, for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any return furnished or any record or register maintained by any person in

pursuance of this Order or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—

- (a) enter and inspect any premises at which quinine or any salt of quinine is kept or stored or sold or otherwise disposed of by that person,
- (b) inspect and take copies of any records, books or accounts kept by that person (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of quinine or any salt of quinine

Order

1 This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Drugs and Medicinal Preparations) Order

2 In this Order—

“ Controller ” means the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services and includes any other officer of the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services acting under his authority,

“ dealer ” means a person who imports any scheduled drug or scheduled preparation into Ceylon for the purposes of trade or carries on any business (whether whole sale or retail) as a seller or supplier of any such drug or preparation, and includes any person who carries on any such business together with any other business,

“ medical practitioner ”, “ dentist ”, and “ pharmacist ” have the same meaning as in the Medical Ordinance,

“ scheduled drug ” means a drug or article specified in the First Schedule hereto,

“ scheduled preparation ” means a preparation or article specified in the Second Schedule hereto,

“ scheduled household remedy ” means a household remedy specified in the Third Schedule hereto

3 All scheduled drugs, scheduled preparations and scheduled household remedies are hereby declared to be controlled articles within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

4 (1) Subject as hereinafter provided, every dealer who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, has in his possession or under his control any quantity of any scheduled drug or scheduled preparation shall, within thirty days from that date, and thereafter, within thirty days from the date on which he completes his annual stock taking, furnish to the Controller a return in respect of such drug or preparation setting out the particulars hereinafter prescribed

Provided that it shall not be obligatory on any dealer, in pursuance of the preceding provisions of this sub paragraph, to furnish a return in respect of—

- (a) any drug specified in the first column of Part I of the First Schedule if the quantity of that drug in the possession or under the control of that dealer at the time the return is furnished is less than the quantity, if any, specified in relation to that drug in the second column of that Part,
- (b) any drug specified in Part II or Part III of the First Schedule

(2) Every return required by this paragraph in respect of any scheduled drug or scheduled preparation shall contain the following particulars—

- (a) the name and address and the place of business (if there is a separate place of business) of the person furnishing the return,
- (b) the name of such drug or preparation,

- (c) the quantity of such drug or preparation in his possession or under his control, such quantity in the case of any tablet, hypodermic tablet, ampoule, or capsule being the amount of the drug contained therein, calculated in accordance with the particulars laid down in the current edition of the British Pharmacopoeia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex,
- (d) the situation of the premises at which such drug or preparation is kept or stored

5 Subject as hereinafter provided, no person other than a dealer, medical practitioner, dentist, or veterinary surgeon shall sell or supply any scheduled drug or scheduled preparation to any person

Provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to—

- (a) the sale or disposal by any person, for industrial purposes, of any drug specified in Part II of the First Schedule,
- (b) the sale or disposal by any person of any scheduled preparation which is included among the household remedies specified in the Third Schedule so long as such sale or disposal is effected in accordance with the conditions, if any, specified in that Schedule

6 No pharmacist shall sell or supply any scheduled drug or scheduled preparation except at premises licensed under section 55 of the Poisons, Opium and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance

7 Every medical practitioner having a private dispensary and every dealer shall—

- (a) maintain such records or registers relating to the stocks of scheduled drugs and scheduled preparations imported, purchased, sold, used, or otherwise disposed of by him as the Controller may prescribe by notification published in the *Gazette* and in at least two newspapers circulating in Ceylon, and
- (b) furnish to the Controller or to such person as the Controller may specify such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time require him to furnish

8 Every return furnished under this Order shall be verified by a declaration, signed by the person furnishing the return, to the effect that the particulars set out in such return are true and accurate

9 The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may, for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any return furnished or any record or register maintained by any person in pursuance of this Order, or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—

- (a) enter and inspect any premises at which any scheduled drug or scheduled preparation is kept or stored, or sold or otherwise disposed of by that person,
- (b) inspect and take copies of any records, books, or accounts kept by that person (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stocks of such drugs or preparations

10 Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to require any records, registers, or returns to be maintained or furnished in respect of any scheduled drug or scheduled preparation kept at any Government hospital or dispensary, any estate hospital or dispensary established under the Medical Warrants Ordinance, or any institution to which a grant either in drugs or in money, is made by the Government

1 The manufacture of coconut shell charcoal for purposes of trade is hereby declared to be an offensive trade

2 No person shall manufacture coconut shell charcoal for purposes of trade unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman

3 No licence shall be issued to any person unless the place at which the coconut shell charcoal is to be manufactured by him is approved by the Medical Officer of Health or the Field Medical Officer and the Committee

Rubber (New-Planting) Regulations

Soil Conservation Measures

1 Every holder of a permit for the exercise of new planting rights shall take steps to comply with the measures, specified hereunder, for the prevention of soil erosion on the land on which such rights are to be or are being exercised

2 No land on which new planting rights are to be or are being exercised shall be planted or replanted with any crop other than rubber and the plants referred to in Schedule C until the measures, specified hereunder, for the conservation of the soil of those lands have been adopted

3 (1) Where a person, to whom a permit for the exercise of new planting rights has been issued before the date of publication of these directions in the *Gazette*, is planting his land with rubber, he shall adopt before 31st August, 1943, for the conservation of the soil of that land, the measures specified hereunder

(2) Where a person, to whom a permit for the exercise of new planting rights is issued on or after the date of publication of these directions in the *Gazette*, desires to plant his land with rubber or desires to prepare his land for planting any crop other than a crop specified in Schedule C under the heading “ Condition V ” or desires to replant his land with any food crop, he shall adopt before he commences so to plant, prepare or replant his land, for the conservation of the soil of that land, the measures set out hereunder.

Schedule A

Natural drainage Lines and Storm water Drains for the prevention of Soil Erosion

1 All main natural drainage lines, sited along the lowest points up and down pronounced undulations in the land shall be maintained as leader drains and lines of water flow. They should not be closed, nor should the flow of water down them be prevented. All lateral drains, contour trenches and contour platforms should be designed so that surplus storm water they carry spills into existing natural drainage lines, leader or storm-drains

2 New or additional leader and storm drains shall not be constructed unless —

(I) they are sited along the lowest points up and down undulations in the land or along minor natural drainage lines,

(II) their discharge into either natural drainage lines or other recognised water conducting channels, not primarily constructed or used for purposes of irrigation, is possible,

(III) no natural drainage lines exist either on the land itself or upon any adjoining land owned or occupied by the same landowner or occupier,

(IV) insufficient natural drainage lines exist to prevent the water-logging of the land or to prevent soil erosion due to normal surface run off of either internal or external origin

3 The flow of water in all natural drainage lines, leader or storm drains shall be checked or retarded, either by vegetation or by artificial retards, so that scouring of the sides and beds of the drains or drainage lines does not normally take place. Retards maintained for this purpose shall not impede the normal flow to an extent which causes the water to overflow the sides of the channel

Schedule B

Earth or Stone Work for the prevention of Soil Erosion

Any one or more of the following works shall be constructed at intervals of distance (measured up and down the slope at right angles to the contours of the land) which do not exceed the distances set out in the following table, according to the average slope of the land —

Feet	Slope of Land
72	Slopes of 5 per cent (= 1 in 20 or approximately 3°) and under, including flat land
48	Slopes between 5 per cent (= 1 in 20 or approximately 3°) and 25 per cent (= 1 in 4 or approximately 14½°)
24	Slopes over 25 per cent (= 1 in 4 or approximately 14½°)

Prescribed Soil Conservation and Drainage Works

1 Contour drains—with cross sectional dimensions averaging not less than 2½ square feet

2 Contour trenches—either continuous or in echelon throughout the area and with cross sectional dimensions of not less than 4 square feet

3 Contour stone terraces—either continuous or in echelon throughout the area and with perpendicular upper sides not less than 1 foot in height above ground level, and with cross sectional dimensions of not less than 1½ square feet

4 Contour platforms—contour platforms must have a reverse slope of at least 1 in 6 and an average width (back to front) of not less than 4 feet

5 Graded lateral drains—of a lock-and-spill or silt-pitted type which runs across the slope of the land, have cross sectional dimensions of not less than 2½ square feet and whose gradient or fall does not exceed 1 in 40 (= a slope of 2½ per cent or approximately 1½°). The water-retaining capacity of the locks or silt pits of such drains must not be less than 45 cubic feet per chain

Interpretation

1 *Soil Erosion*—the movement or removal of soil, by water or wind, from the place of its formation or previous deposition

10 *Counter slope*—across the natural slope of the land, i e., on an approximate contour

11 *Surface run off water*—the water directly due to normal rain, which flows over the surface of the land, prior to its joining any type of drain or natural drainage line

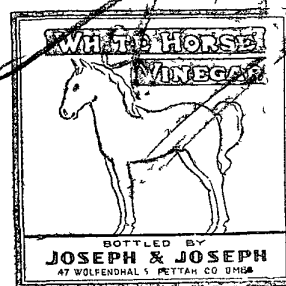

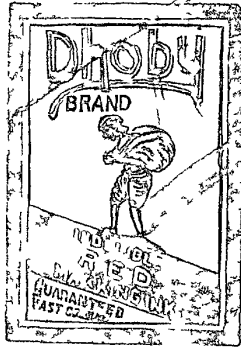

5 If any tenderer, on being declared the purchaser of a privilege, declines to sign the conditions of sale or fails to furnish the required security when called upon to do so the tender deposit made by him will be declared to be forfeited, and the defaulter will render himself liable to have his name entered in the list of defaulters in respect of all Excise Licences

THE DEFENCE (FINANCE) REGULATIONS

Order under Regulation 5A (1)

IN pursuance of the provisions of Regulation 5A (1) of the
Defence (Finance) Regulations, exemptions are hereby
granted in respect of anything done for the purpose of the
transfer of the whole or any part of any amount standing
to the credit of—

(a) a sterling area account relating to any territory
specified in the First or Second Schedule to this Order, being a
transfer to the credit of another sterling area account of
the same territory,

(b) the account of a person resident in any territory
specified in the Third or Fifth Schedule to this Order, being a
transfer to another account of a person resident in the same
territory,

(c) an account (not being an account specified in the
Sixth Schedule to this Order) of a person resident in a
scheduled territory not specified in the Third Schedule to
this Order, being a transfer to another such account of a
person resident in a scheduled territory not specified in the
first five Schedules to this Order,

(d) an account (not being an account specified in the sixth
Schedule to this Order) of a person resident in any territory
specified in the First, Second or Fourth Schedule to this Order,
being a transfer to another such account of a person resident
in the same territory. For the purposes of this sub-
paragraph the countries specified in the Fourth Schedule to
this Order shall be considered as forming part of the same
territory

(2) In this Order—

(a) the expression "sterling area account" means any
account which is for the time being recognised by the
Controller for the purposes of this Order as a sterling area
account relating to any territory specified in the First or
second Schedule to this Order, or an account with a bank
in the United Kingdom recognised by the Bank of England
as a "sterling area account" of such territory,

(b) the expression "account", where not otherwise
defined, means a rupee account with a bank in Ceylon,

(c) where among the territories specified in any of the
Schedules to this Order two or more territories are grouped
together, the expression "territory" includes all the
territories in that group

(3) The Order under Regulation 5A (1) dated December 12,
1940, and published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 8,694 of
December 12, 1940, as amended by any subsequent Order is

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of

Regulations

1 These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Food
Control) (Special Provisions) (No 3) Regulations, 1943

2 During the continuance in force of these Regulations,
the regulations under Head B of the Food Control Regulations,
1938, shall have effect as though—

(a) Regulation 2 under that Head were rescinded, and
(b) the following new regulations were inserted immediately
after Regulation 1 under that Head—

"2 (1) Where the Food Controller, or a peace
officer, or any person authorised thereto in writing
by the Food Controller has reason to suspect that
any cattle, food or article of food, is being trans-
ported or removed in any vehicle or vessel in
contravention of any Order for the time being in
operation, he may—

(a) give such orders, directions or signals or use
such devices or take such other measures
as may be necessary to stop the vehicle or
vessel or to cause it to be halted, and
(b) inspect and search the vehicle or vessel

(2) Where the Food Controller has reason to
suspect, that any road or waterway is being used
for the transport of any cattle, food or article of
food in contravention of any Order for the time

being in operation, he may erect across the road or waterway or any part thereof a barrier or barriers of such nature and description as to him may seem necessary for the purpose of stopping vehicles or vessels using such road or waterway or causing such vehicles or vessels to be halted

(3) Where any barrier has been erected under paragraph (2) across any road or waterway or any part thereof, the Food Controller or a peace officer or any person authorised thereto in writing by the Food Controller may—

(a) give such orders, directions or signals as may be necessary to cause any vehicle or vessel using such road or waterway to stop or to be halted at such barrier, and

(b) inspect and search every vehicle or vessel stopped or halted at such barrier, for the purpose of ascertaining whether any cattle, food or article of food is being transported or removed in such vehicle or vessel in contravention of any Order for the time being in operation

(4) Where any order, direction or signal is given under any of the preceding provisions of this regulation for the purpose of stopping any vehicle or vessel, the driver or other person for the time being in charge of such vehicle or vessel shall forthwith stop the vehicle or vessel or cause it to be halted in accordance with such order, direction or signal

2A Where the Food Controller or a peace officer has reason to suspect that any cattle, food or article of food has been transported or removed to any place or premises in contravention of any Order for the time being in operation, the Food Controller or any peace officer or any other person authorised thereto in writing by the Food Controller, may enter, inspect and search such place or premises

3 During the continuance in force of these Regulations, the regulations in Part II under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1939, shall have effect as though—

(a) the following new regulation were inserted immediately after Regulation 4 in that Part —

“Restriction of purchases by residents of estates 4A No person who is a resident of any estate shall purchase or obtain possession of any such supplies otherwise than from the superintendent of that estate”, and

(b) there were inserted, immediately after sub paragraph (a) of Regulation 6 (1) in that Part, the following new sub paragraph —

“(aa) the quantity of such food or article of food in the possession of persons resident on the estate,”

4 During the continuance in force of these Regulations, the regulations in Part III under Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, shall have effect as though—

(a) paragraph (a) of Regulation 14 in that Part were omitted, and

(b) the following regulation were substituted for Regulation 15 in that Part —

Prohibition of sale, transfer, &c, of ration books and coupons 15 (1) No person shall make application for the issue in his name of more than one ration book, or be the holder of more than one ration book

(2) No person shall have in his possession any ration book other than a ration book issued under these Regulations to himself or to a member of the same household as himself

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be deemed to prohibit the possession by the officer in charge of any prison, hospital or other institution to which regulation 8 in this Part applies, of any ration book collected by or surrendered to such officer under that regulation

(3) No person shall have in his possession any coupon which has been removed from a ration book

Provided that no person shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence by reason of the possession of any coupon so removed if he proves to the satisfaction of the court—

(a) that he was an authorised distributor or person in charge of a depot, and that the coupon was delivered to him by or on behalf of the holder of a ration book in accordance with the provisions of this Part, or

(b) that he was a wholesale dealer, and that the coupon had been surrendered to him by an authorised distributor in accordance with the provisions of this Part, or

(c) that the coupon was surrendered to him under regulation 7 (1) (b) of this Part

(4) No person shall sell or transfer any ration book or coupon to any other person

(5) No person shall deliver or surrender any ration book to any other person

Provided, however, that nothing in the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be deemed to prohibit—

(a) the delivery or surrender of any ration book in compliance with any requirement duly made under these Regulations or any other written law; or

(b) the delivery of any ration book by the holder thereof to any member of the same household as himself for the purpose of enabling supplies of any controlled commodity to be obtained for and on his behalf

(6) No person shall deliver or surrender any coupon which has been removed from a ration book to any other person, unless such delivery or surrender is authorised by the

provisions of this Part or is made in compliance with any requirement duly made under those Regulations or any other written law.

(7) No person shall use any ration book which has not been issued to him under these Regulations unless it was delivered to him by a member of the same household as himself for the purpose of enabling supplies of any controlled commodity to be obtained for and on behalf of such member.

(8) No person shall alter or deface any ration book or make any entries therein except in accordance with the provisions of this Part.

Tenders for Purchase of Paddy, Bagging, Loading and Transport under the Internal Purchase Scheme

TENDERS are hereby invited for the purchase of paddy in the Mannar District from owners of paddy lands according to the requisitioned quantity furnished by the Assistant Government Agent, Mannar, during the operation of the Internal Purchase Scheme. Paddy so purchased should be of good quality and free from grit and chaff and should be bagged, loaded in the carts and transported and delivered at my store or at the mills between the hours of 9 A M and 4 30 P M on week days and 9 A M to 1 P M on Saturdays. Sacks will be supplied to the Agents on furnishing security for safe return, and the Agents will arrange for necessary carts and the labourers for bagging and transport. The Agents will pay Rs 4 to the vendors of paddy. Government will pay their cart hire and commission. No advance to Commission Agents have been authorised by Government.

2 Tenders should state (a) what per cent commission is required on every bushel of paddy purchased at the threshing floor including bagging and loading into carts and unloading at prescribed stores and (b) rate per mile per bag at which he is prepared to transport a bag of 3½ bushels of paddy from the threshing floor to the prescribed stores or mills (i.e. cart hire per bag of 3½ bushels per mile).

3 Tenders should either be deposited in the Tender Box at the Mannar Kachechen or sent through the post under

registered cover, addressed to the Assistant Government Agent, Mannar.

4 Tenders should be marked "Tender for purchase of paddy" in the left top hand corner of the envelope and should reach the Assistant Government Agent, Mannar, not later than 12 noon on July 30, 1943.

5 The tenders should be on form which will be supplied upon application at the Kachechen and no tender will be considered unless it is on a form so supplied.

6 All alterations and erasures in a tender should be initialed by the tenderer.

7 A deposit of Rs 10 will be required to be made at the Kachechen and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any tenderer decline or fail to enter into a contract or fail to furnish security within four days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted his deposit will be confiscated. Notice of the acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to him or left at the address given by him. Successful tenderer will have to enter into a bond with the Government for successful execution of the contract. The successful tenderer will except as stated below be required to employ only Ceylonese labour in carrying out the work tendered for. If for any reason the tenderer is unable to employ only Ceylonese labour for the work he must state in his tender the maximum percentage of non Ceylonese labour which he proposes to employ on the work. Preference will be given to the tenderer who undertakes to employ only Ceylonese labour or to the tenderer who specifies the lowest percentage of non Ceylonese labour which he proposes to employ for the work. A tender which specifies a percentage of non Ceylonese labour for employment on the work, which appears to the Assistant Government Agent to be unnecessarily high will normally be rejected. The employment of Ceylonese labour only to carry out the work tendered for or the employment of a definite percentage only of non Ceylonese labour for such work will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of terms of the contract, and will render the contractor liable to have the contract cancelled, and in addition to pay a penalty of Rs 5 a day, for each non Ceylonese labourer employed by him on work or for each non Ceylonese labourer employed by him over and above the percentage of non Ceylonese labourer, which he is permitted to employ on the work in terms of his contract. The word "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all persons born in Ceylon and no others.

8 The Assistant Government Agent, Mannar, reserves to himself the right of rejecting any or all tenders without assigning any reason for doing so. He is not bound to accept any lower tender.

9 The Assistant Government Agent, Mannar, may for reasons which appear to him sufficient give notice in writing of his objection to the employment of any person by the contractor for any reason specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.
