AND

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (CUSTODIAN)
ORDER, 1940

WHEREAS an undivided share of the immovable property more fully described in the Schedule hereto belongs to Ratnajothi Thero

And Whereas the said Ratnajothi Thero is now believed to be residing in Jamaida, Methila, in Burma, and is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, read with the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations

And whereas it is expedient that a Vesting Order should be made in respect of the aforesaid share of Ratnajothi Thero in the said immovable property and such powers in regard thereto as are hereinafter contained should be conferred upon the Custodian of Enemy Property

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations and the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order—

- (1) that all the right, title and interest of Ratnajothi Thero to and in the aforesaid share of the said immovable property do vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property, and
- (2) that the said Custodian do have all such powers as may be necessary for the purposes of the control and the management of the aforesaid share of the said immovable property, including the power to employ such agents as he may consider necessary for such purposes

Regulations

1 These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Control of Tea Sales) Regulations, 1943

2 (1) No manufacturer of made tea shall sell, transfer or (whether by way of gift or otherwise) dispose of, any quantity of made tea or any quantity of any waste product of tea, to any person other than—

(a) the Commissioner, or

(b) a person authorised in writing by the Commissioner to purchase or otherwise acquire such tea or waste product,

and no person other than the Commissioner or a person so authorised shall purchase or otherwise acquire from a manufacturer any such tea or waste product

(2) The Commissioner may refuse to purchase, or to authorise any other person to purchase or otherwise acquire—

(a) any made tea which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, contains any grit, sand or other foreign matter, or

(b) any waste product of tea,

and may destroy any such tea or waste product or cause it to be destroyed in such manner as he may determine

3 (1) The Commissioner may, in his discretion, appoint by writing under his hand such number of persons as he may deem necessary, to be—

(a) authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or distributing made tea, or

(b) authorised exporters for the purpose of exporting made tea or any waste product of tea,

and may, for any cause appearing to him to be sufficient, cancel any appointment so made

(2) The Commissioner shall notify in the *Gazette* every appointment and every cancellation of an appointment made by him under paragraph (1)

(3) Upon the cancellation of the appointment of any authorised dealer or any authorised exporter, it shall be the duty of such dealer or exporter to surrender to the Commissioner any letter of appointment issued to him by the Commissioner

4 Except under the authority of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Commissioner, no person shall, on or after the fifteenth day of August, 1943, purchase or otherwise acquire any quantity of made tea from any person other than the Commissioner or an authorised dealer

5 No person other than the Commissioner or an authorised dealer shall, on or after the fifteenth day of August, 1943, sell, transfer or (whether by way of gift or otherwise) dispose of any quantity of made tea to any other person, except upon the surrender by that person of a permit issued to him under Regulation 4

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by Regulation 43A of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order declare all engineering production undertakings of any class or description specified in the Schedule hereto to be controlled undertakings for the purposes of that Regulation

Engineering Production Undertakings

Every undertaking, which is wholly or mainly engaged, and every branch or department of an undertaking being a branch or department wholly or mainly engaged, in the manufacture, assembly or repair of goods or articles of wood, iron, steel, or non-ferrous metals which involves the use of machine tools, foundry or forging plant

6. No person who is not a manufacturer of tea referred to in Regulation 2 (1) shall sell, transfer or (whether by way of gift or otherwise) dispose of any quantity of any waste product of tea to any other person.

7. Subject as hereinafter provided, no person shall on or after the thirty first day of August, 1943, have in his possession or under his control any quantity of made tea or any waste product of tea for any purpose whatsoever unless such tea or waste product has been purchased or otherwise acquired from a manufacturer under the authority of the Commissioner in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 2 (1) or from the Commissioner or from an authorised dealer.

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this Regulation shall apply in the case of—

- (a) any made tea or any waste product of tea which is in the possession or under the control of—
 - (i) the Commissioner or any person acting on his behalf, or
 - (ii) a manufacturer or the agent of a manufacturer holding stocks of made tea or any waste product of tea for purposes of export on behalf of a manufacturer, or
 - (iii) an authorised exporter, or
- (b) any made tea which is in the possession or under the control of an authorised dealer.

8. Subject as hereinafter provided, no person shall transport any quantity exceeding five pounds in weight of made tea or of any waste product of tea, from any place in Ceylon to any other place in Ceylon, except under the authority of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Commissioner.

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this Regulation shall apply in the case of any made tea or any waste product of tea which is transported by or on behalf of, or for the purpose of delivery to—

- (a) the Commissioner, or
- (b) a person authorised in writing by the Commissioner to purchase or otherwise acquire such tea or waste product, or
- (c) any other person who has purchased such tea or waste product from the Commissioner.

9. Where the Commissioner or any person authorised by him in writing to act on his behalf for the purposes of these Regulations has reason to suspect that any made tea or any waste product of tea is being transported in any vehicle or vessel in contravention of Regulation 8, he may—

- (a) give such orders, directions or signals, or use such devices or take such other measures as may be necessary to stop the vehicle or vessel or to cause it to be halted,
- (b) inspect and search the vehicle or vessel, and
- (c) seize and detain any made tea or any waste product of tea found in the vehicle or vessel which he has reasonable cause to believe is being transported in contravention of Regulation 8.

10. Where the Commissioner, or any person authorised by him in writing to act on his behalf for the purposes of these Regulations, has reasonable cause to believe that there is in any place or premises any made tea or any waste product of tea which, as the case may be—

- (a) has been sold, transferred or disposed of in contravention of Regulation 2 or Regulation 6, or
- (b) has been purchased or acquired in contravention of Regulation 2 or Regulation 4, or
- (c) is in the possession or under the control of any person in contravention of Regulation 7, or
- (d) has been transported or removed in contravention of Regulation 8,

he may—

- (i) enter and search such place or premises,
- (ii) inspect any stock of such made tea or waste product of tea and any books or records relating to such stocks or to any business carried on in such place or premises, and
- (iii) seize and detain any made tea or any waste product of tea which he has reasonable cause to believe to have been sold, transferred or disposed of in contravention of Regulation 2 or Regulation 6, or

to have been purchased or acquired in contravention of Regulation 2 or Regulation 4, or to be in the possession or under the control of any person in contravention of Regulation 7, or to have been transported or removed in contravention of Regulation 8.

11. All quantities of made tea or of any waste product of tea seized and detained under Regulation 9 or Regulation 10 shall be produced before a Magistrate within a reasonable time and shall be disposed of in such manner as the Magistrate may direct in the circumstances of each case.

12. Where any person is convicted of transporting any made tea or any waste product of tea in any vehicle or vessel in contravention of Regulation 8, the court which convicts such person may, in addition to any other punishment which it may impose for that contravention, and after notice to the owner of the vehicle or vessel, order that the vehicle or vessel shall be confiscated.

Provided that no order for the confiscation of any vehicle or vessel shall be made under the preceding provisions of this regulation if the owner proves to the satisfaction of the court that the contravention was committed without his knowledge or consent.

13. (1) The Commissioner may at any time direct the registered proprietor of any estate or small holding or any manufacturer, authorised dealer or authorised exporter—

- (a) to furnish before a date specified by the Commissioner in any month, or in each of a series of months so specified, a return setting out—

- (i) such particulars as the Commissioner may require in respect of the production, sale or delivery of made tea or waste product of tea or the stocks of made tea or waste product of tea held by such proprietor, manufacturer, dealer or exporter,

- (ii) such information as may be necessary to enable the Commissioner to prepare statistics as to any matter connected with the production, sale or export of made tea or any waste product of tea,

- (b) to furnish before a specified date such information or explanation as the Commissioner may require in respect of any return furnished by any such proprietor, manufacturer, dealer or exporter under this regulation,

- (c) to produce or cause to be produced before a specified date such documentary or other evidence as the Commissioner may consider necessary for the purpose of verifying any facts or particulars set out in any return furnished by such proprietor, manufacturer, dealer or exporter under this regulation.

(2) Every return furnished under this regulation and any explanation or information required by the Commissioner to be furnished thereunder shall be verified by a declaration that the statements contained therein are true and accurate.

14. The Commissioner, or any person authorised by him in writing to act on his behalf for the purposes of these Regulations may at any time enter any estate or small holding or any building situated thereon, or any tea factory wherever situated, or any premises used for keeping or storing tea or any waste product of tea by a dealer in or exporter of tea, for the purpose of—

- (a) inspecting such estate, small holding, building, factory or premises, or
- (b) verifying the stocks of made tea or of waste product of tea kept thereon, or any particulars contained in any return made or any information or explanation furnished to the Commissioner under these Regulations or
- (c) examining the books or records maintained in connexion with the business transacted in such building, factory or premises, or
- (d) making any survey plan of, or taking any measurements of, or on, that estate or small holding.

15. Every person who fails to comply with any direction issued by the Commissioner under

Regulation 13, and every person who furnishes any return, explanation or information which is false and which he knows to be false or does not believe to be true in any material particular, shall be guilty of an offence.

16 The Commissioner and all persons authorised by him in writing to act on his behalf for the purposes of these Regulations shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of the Penal Code

17 In these Regulations—

“authorised dealer” means a person authorised by the Commissioner to sell or distribute tea,

“authorised exporter” means a person authorised by the Commissioner to export tea,

“Commissioner” means the Tea Commissioner, “estate”, “proprietor”, “registered”, “small holding” and “tea” have, respectively, the same meaning as in the Tea Control Ordinance,

“made tea” means tea manufactured from the leaf of the tea plant, but does not include any waste product of tea,

“manufacturer” means any person who, being lawfully in possession of a tea factory (whether as owner, lessee, usufructuary mortgagee or otherwise) manufactures made tea at that factory, and includes any person who causes any tea leaf produced on any estate or small holding in his possession to be manufactured at a factory which is not in his possession and to be delivered to him, and also includes the superintendent of any estate, the tea maker and any other person employed in a tea factory in or in connexion with the manufacture of tea,

“waste product of tea” means sweepings, red leaf, fluff or any other waste product obtained from the manufacture of made tea.

THE BUTCHERS ORDINANCE

- (b) except between 8 A M and 12 noon on any day. Provided that the Chairman may in exceptional circumstances authorise the slaughter of any animal at any time other than that specified herein

(2) No person shall slaughter any animal at the slaughter-house—

- (a) at any time after the expiry of a period of 30 hours from the time of the approval of that animal under paragraph (1), or
- (b) if it has been removed alive from the slaughter-house premises after it was approved under paragraph (1),

unless it is again inspected and approved under that paragraph as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption

3 Every person who brings any animal into the premises of the slaughter house shall take all such measures as may be necessary to ensure that that animal is adequately fed and watered while it remains in those premises

4 Every person who brings any animal into the premises of the slaughter house shall, if the animal is rejected as unfit for slaughter, immediately after such rejection remove the animal or cause it to be removed from those premises

5 Any officer referred to in regulation 2 may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if, after it has been approved under regulation 2, it is found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption

6 If the meat or offal of any animal slaughtered in the slaughter house is, in the opinion of any officer referred to in regulation 2, diseased or unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the meat or offal to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent such meat or offal being exposed for sale or used for human consumption

7 The officer in charge of the slaughter house shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited as provided in regulation 5

8 (1) No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the direction of any officer referred to in regulation 2, any meat or offal which has been declared under regulation 6 to be unfit for human consumption

(2) No person shall remove the carcass of any animal, intended for human consumption, from the slaughter house, unless such carcass has been stamped on its fore-quarters and hind quarters by the officer in charge of the slaughter-house with the mark "U C Badulla" and with the words "Australasian Beef", "Country Beef", or "Mutton", as the case may be

9 No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of any other animal or until the carcass of every animal previously slaughtered in the premises has been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned

10 (1) Subject as hereinafter provided, the fee to be charged for the use of the slaughter house or for slaughtering shall be at the following rates —

Provided that, where any animal brought into the slaughter-house is rejected as unfit for slaughter or is withdrawn from slaughter, the fee to be charged in respect of that animal shall be 15 cents only

(2) No animal shall be slaughtered in, or removed from, the slaughter house until the appropriate fee under paragraph (1) has been paid to the Council in respect of that animal and an official receipt for the payment of such fee has been produced to the keeper of the slaughter house or to

such other officer as may be appointed by the Chairman in writing as the person to whom such receipts should be produced

With reference to the notice under the above heading in the "Board of Trade Journal" of May 23, 1942 (page 264), following is a further concern which the Netherlands Government has certified as having transferred its seat from the Netherlands or the Netherlands East Indies —
