THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)  
REGULATIONS, 1939

AND

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (CUSTODIAN)  
ORDER, 1940.

WHEREAS the immovable property more fully described in the Schedule hereto belongs to Dr. S. T. Aiyathurai and his wife:

And whereas the said Dr. S. T. Aiyathurai and his wife are now believed to be residing in Batu Pahat, Johore, Malaya, and are enemies within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, read with the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations:

And whereas it is expedient that a Vesting Order should be made in respect of the said property and such powers in regard thereto as are hereinafter contained should be conferred upon the Custodian of Enemy Property:

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations and the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order—

Where any land which is required for Naval, Military or Air Force purposes is to be acquired under the Land Acquisition Ordinance (Chapter 203), the person directed under section 5 of that Ordinance to take order for the acquisition of the land may dispense with the publication in the *Gazette* of the notice referred to in section 6 of that Ordinance if he is satisfied that such publication will be prejudicial to the public safety, the defence of the Island or the efficient prosecution of the war, and where in accordance with the preceding provisions of this regulation such publication is dispensed with every reference in that Ordinance to the publication of the notice shall be read and construed as a reference to the posting of that notice, on or near the land in question, in accordance with the provisions of the said section 6

ONE cadetship in the Indian Merchant Marine Training Ship "Dufferin" will be available for a Ceylonese boy for the course of training which begins in January, 1944, and a qualifying examination for Ceylonese candidates will be held in Colombo on October 15 and 16, 1943. The closing date for entries is October 1, 1943. Full details of the course of training are given in the prospectus of the Indian Merchant Marine Training Ship "Dufferin" which can be obtained from the Government Record Office on payment of Re 1 25 (exclusive of postage) and particulars of the special conditions applicable to the selection of the Ceylonese cadet can be obtained on application to the Chief Secretary. Candidates must be between the ages of 13 years 8 months and 16 years on January 15, 1944.

(iii) for watering gardens or compounds where special appliances or connections are fixed permanently or temporarily to any service pipe or main for the purpose,

(iv) for building purposes,

(v) for the purposes of making or repairing any road other than a road maintained by the Government or the Council

(4) In the case of water supplied otherwise than by meter, charges at the following rates shall be paid yearly in advance to the Council—

(a) where it is supplied to premises licensed as an eating house, a tea kiosk or a common lodging house—

1 (1) Where in the opinion of the proper authority any area is likely to be infected with cholera, the proper authority may by order under his hand declare such area to be an area likely to be infected with cholera

(2) Every order made under paragraph (1) shall continue in force until it is revoked by the proper authority

(3) Notice of every order made under paragraph (1) and of the revocation of any such order shall be given by the proper authority in such manner as may appear to him to be best adapted for giving publicity thereto

2 During the continuance in force within any area—

(1) of any order made under regulation 1, or

(2) of any declaration under regulation 1 of the regulations made under sections 2 and 3 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance and published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No 7,481 of August 28



1925, whereby such area has been declared to be a diseased locality by reason of its being infected or suspected of being infected with cholera,

it shall be lawful for the proper authority from time to time to require any person found within such area—

- (a) to have himself inoculated against cholera, or
- (b) to have himself medically examined and to permit rectal swabs to be taken for the purpose of ascertaining whether he is a carrier of the cholera vibrio

Provided that no person shall be required to have himself inoculated against cholera if he proves to the satisfaction of the proper authority that he has been so inoculated at any time within the preceding three months

3 Every person who is required by the proper authority under regulation 2 to have himself inoculated against cholera shall present himself before the proper authority, or an officer authorised in that behalf by the proper authority, or a medical practitioner, within such time as the proper authority may specify, and shall take, on such dates as the proper authority or such officer or practitioner, as the case may be, may fix for the purpose, such injections as may be deemed necessary for the purposes of such inoculation

4 Every person who is required by the proper authority under regulation 2 to have himself medically examined and to permit rectal swabs to be taken shall present himself before the proper authority or an officer authorised in that behalf by the proper authority, within such time or on such dates as the proper authority or such officer, as the case may be, may fix for the purpose, and shall submit to a medical examination and allow rectal swabs to be taken

Provided that no female shall be examined for such purpose except by a female officer authorised in that behalf by the proper authority

5 Every person who is inoculated against cholera by the proper authority or by an officer authorised in that behalf by the proper authority shall be given a certificate to that effect by the proper authority or such officer, as the case may be. The dates on which the injections for the purposes of such inoculation were given to such person shall be set out in the certificate

6 In these regulations—

“medical practitioner” means a person registered as such under the Medical Ordinance whether such person is in private practice or is holding office in the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services,

“proper authority” means the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services or any officer authorised by him in writing

(3) Notice of every order made under paragraph (1) and of the revocation of any such order shall be given by the proper authority in such manner as may appear to him to be best adapted for giving publicity thereto

2 During the continuance in force within any area of an order made under regulation 1, it shall be lawful for the proper authority from time to time to require any person residing within such area to have himself inoculated against typhoid fever

Provided that no person shall be required to have himself inoculated against typhoid fever if he proves to the satisfaction of the proper authority that he has been so inoculated at any time within the preceding two years

3 Every person who is required by the proper authority under regulation 2 to have himself inoculated against typhoid fever shall present himself before the proper authority, or an officer authorised in that behalf by the proper authority, or a medical practitioner, within such time as the proper authority may specify, and shall take, on such dates as the proper authority or such officer or practitioner, as the case may be, may fix for the purpose, such injections as may be deemed necessary for the purposes of such inoculation

4 Every person who is inoculated against typhoid fever by the proper authority or by an officer authorised in that behalf by the proper authority shall be given a certificate to that effect by the proper authority or such officer, as the

case may be. The dates on which the injections for the purposes of such inoculation were given to such person shall be set out in the certificate

5 In these regulations—

“medical practitioner” means a person registered as such under the Medical Ordinance, whether such person is in private practice or is holding office in the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services,

“proper authority” means the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services or any officer authorised by him in writing

6 These regulations may be cited as the Typhoid Fever (Preventive Measures) Regulations, 1943

#### THE CEYLON (STATE COUNCIL ELECTIONS) ORDER IN COUNCIL

##### Revision of Registers

Colombo North, Central, and South Electoral Districts

THE Registers of Voters of the Colombo North, Central, and South Electoralates for the year 1943 are being revised, and attention is invited to the relevant provisions of the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, and in particular those provisions which relate to the qualification of voters

2 In terms of Article 6, no person is qualified to have his name in any register of voters unless he satisfies all the following conditions—

- (a) is a British subject,
- (b) is not less than 21 years of age on August 1, 1943
- (c) has for a continuous period of six months between February 1, 1942, and August 1, 1943, resided in the electoral district to which the register relates,
- (d) has not been adjudged by a competent court to be of unsound mind, and
- (e) has not been convicted of a corrupt or illegal practice in connexion with the election of a member of the State Council

3 Any person who is not disqualified under Article 6 is qualified to have his name entered in the register of voters if he has—

- (a) a domicile of origin in Ceylon (Article 7), or
- (b) a domicile of choice in Ceylon (Article 7), or
- (c) the special literacy and property qualification (Article 8) or
- (d) a certificate of permanent settlement (Article 9)

4 The procedure that will be followed in respect of the classes of persons mentioned in the preceding paragraph and whose names do not appear in the 1942 registers will be as follows—

- (a) Persons possessing domicile of origin in Ceylon should give their names to the enumerators who will be calling at their residences between August 12 and September 6, 1943
- (b) Persons claiming domicile of choice in Ceylon will similarly give their names to enumerators who will be calling at their residences between August 12 and September 6, 1943. These persons must also furnish proof to the enumerators that they have—
  - (i) resided in Ceylon for a total period of or exceeding 5 years, and
  - (ii) have determined to make Ceylon their sole and permanent home

Their names will be entered in the registers only if the Registering Officer is satisfied that they are qualified. It will be convenient if they produce the necessary evidence before the enumerators, documentary evidence such as letters from employers, &c, will be inspected by the enumerators and returned to the persons producing them

Note—If any person possessing a domicile of origin or a domicile of choice cannot meet an enumerator, he should communicate with this office immediately after September 6, 1943

- (c) and (d) Persons who are qualified to be registered by virtue of the special literacy and property qualification (Article 8) or the special qualification by certificate of permanent settlement (Article 9) should, if they desire to have their names entered in the register, apply in writing in accordance with the instructions contained in the notification published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No 9,150 of July 23, 1943, and in the *Ceylon Daily News*, the *Dinamun* and the *Thunakaran* of the same date

The necessary forms for the purpose of these applications can be obtained from this office

5 It is desired to make the revision of the registers as complete and accurate as possible and the Registering Officer seeks the co-operation of all persons in the matter. He hopes that the necessary information will be furnished to enumerators readily and accurately. It may be added that registration

under the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, is concerned solely with the exercise of the franchise and it has no connexion whatever with any other matter

In respect of the festival specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto—

(1) the officer specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of that Schedule is hereby empowered to prohibit any assembly of persons for the purpose of organizing or conducting or taking part in any procession or any entertainment in connexion with such festival,

(2) the officer specified in the corresponding entry in column 3 of that Schedule is hereby empowered, if a prohibition is not imposed under paragraph (1), to impose such restrictions as he may consider necessary in connexion with such assembly, for the purpose of minimising the risk of loss of life or personal injuries being caused in consequence of war operations, and without prejudice to the generality of the powers hereby conferred, such restrictions may be imposed by him as to—

(a) the number of persons that may be allowed to participate in any such assembly, procession or entertainment,

(b) the premises that may be used for the purposes thereof, or in the case of a procession the route to be followed by such procession,

(c) the hours during which any such assembly, procession or entertainment may be held or conducted,

and such officer may, for the aforesaid purposes, order any such assembly, procession or entertainment to be stopped or discontinued and may direct the persons participating therein to disperse

No prohibition or restriction imposed under the preceding provisions of this Order shall be deemed to affect or prejudice the right of the person or persons in charge of any building used for religious worship to conduct within such building the religious rites connected with the festival or the right of any person to be present in such building for the purpose of participating in such religious rites

In this Order, "entertainment" includes any exhibition, performance, amusement, game, sport, or competition
