- (1) declare that, with effect from the first day of January, 1944, the area now known as the town of Agalawatta, which forms part of the Divisional Revenue Officer’s Division of Pasdun Korale East in the Kalutara District of the Western Province and is more fully described in the Schedule hereto, shall be brought within the operation of the said Ordinance, and
- (2) alter and redefine with effect from the aforesaid date, the limits of the Maha Pattu village area defined by Proclamation dated July 31, 1895, and published in *Gazette* No 5,365 of August 9, 1895, as amended by Proclamation dated June 14, 1930, and published in *Gazette* No 7,786 of June 20, 1930, by the addition to that village area of the area now known as the town of Agalawatta, and more fully described in the Schedule hereto

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE

#### Order

WHEREAS by Proclamation the area now known as the town of Agalawatta in Pasdun Korale East in the Kalutara District of the Western Province has, with effect from the first day of January, 1944, been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance (Chapter 197), and

brought within the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and added to the Maha Pattu village area of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Pasdun Korale East defined by Proclamation dated July 31, 1895, and published in *Gazette* No 5 365 of August 9, 1895, as amended by Proclamation dated June 14, 1930, and published in *Gazette* No 7,786 of June 20, 1930

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 41 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order, with effect from the first day of January, 1944—

- (a) transfer to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area the whole of the property and the funds acquired or received by or vested in the Sanitary Board of the Kalutara District for the use and benefit of the town of Agalawatta and specified in Schedule A hereto,
- (b) declare that such funds and the revenue derived from that part of the village area which is now known as the town of Agalawatta shall be employed by the Village Committee for the use and benefit of the aforesaid part of that area,
- (c) direct the Village Committee to keep separate books of accounts in respect of the aforesaid part of the village area,
- (d) apportion and assign to the Village Committee the whole of the rights, liabilities, debts or obligations of the Sanitary Board of the Kalutara District under any contract entered into by the said Board for the benefit of the town of Agalawatta, and
- (e) prescribe the terms and conditions set out in Schedule B hereto as the terms and conditions on which the officers or servants specified in that Schedule, and employed by the said Sanitary Board for the purposes relating to the town of Agalawatta may be transferred to the service of the said Village Committee

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

The Controlled Articles (Rubber Tyres and Tubes) (No 2) Order, 1942, published in *Gazette* No 9,022 of October 16, 1942, as amended by any subsequent Order, is hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after paragraph 15 of that Order, of the following new paragraphs —

15A The Controller may by notification published in the *Gazette* require all persons who, after any date or during any period specified in the notification, have or will have in their possession or under their control any used tyre or used tube which is not fitted to a motor car, to furnish to the Controller within the time proscribed in such notification, a return setting out such particulars relating to such tyre or tube as may be required by the notification to be so set out

15B In any case where any used tyre or used tube in respect of which a return has been furnished to the Controller under paragraph 15A of this Order, or to the Commissioner of Motor Transport under paragraph 3 of the Controlled Articles (Motor Car Equipment, Parts and Accessories) Order, 1943, is removed from the premises specified in such return to any other premises, the person by whom such return was furnished shall, within seven days of such removal, notify the Controller in writing of the situation of the premises to which such tyre or tube has been so removed

15C Where any used tyre or tube fitted or attached to any registered motor car is detached or disconnected from the motor car and removed to any place other than the place at which the motor car is usually kept, the registered owner of that motor car shall, within seven days of such removal, notify the Controller of the fact of such removal, and the situation of the place to which it is removed

15D No person shall purchase or otherwise acquire any used tyre or tube except under the authority of a permit in that behalf granted by the Controller

15E No person shall sell or otherwise dispose of any used tyre or tube to any other person except upon the surrender by such other person of a permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that tyre or tube

15F (1) Every application for a permit, authorising any person to purchase or otherwise acquire any used tyre or tube, shall be made to the Controller in such form as he may provide for the purpose and shall contain such particulars as may be required to be set out in that form

(2) The Controller may, in his discretion, either refuse to grant any permit for which application is made under sub paragraph (1) or may grant a permit authorising the purchase or acquisition of a smaller number of used tyres or tubes, as the case may be, than is specified in the application

(3) The Controller may, in his discretion, attach to any permit issued by him such conditions as he may think fit including a condition that the used tyre or used tube specified in the permit shall not be sold or transferred to the holder except upon the delivery, without payment, to the person selling or supplying the tyre or tube, of the tyre or tube which is to be replaced by that specified in the permit

15G (1) The Controller may, by notification published in the *Gazette*, fix the maximum price at which any description, grade or class of used tyres or used tubes may be sold

(2) No person shall sell any used tyre or used tube, for which the appropriate maximum price has been fixed under sub paragraph (1), at any price exceeding such maximum price

15H The Controller, or any officer acting under his authority, may enter any premises in which any tyres or tubes are kept or stored, and inspect such premises for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and number of tyres or

tubes kept or stored in those premises, and the person in charge of those premises shall permit and assist the Controller or such officer to enter and inspect such premises for such purpose

Candidates should write their full names legibly on the application and give full particulars of the examination for which they are entering and the subjects they are offering

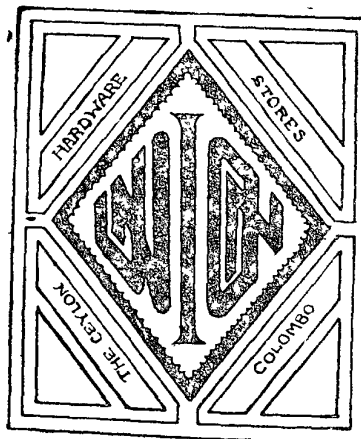

WHEREAS by Proclamations the town of Dela in Meda Pattu of Nawadun Korale in the Ratnapura District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa has, with effect from the first day of January, 1944, been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance (Chapter 197), and brought within the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and added to the Meda Pattu village area of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Nawadun Korale defined by Proclamation dated September 11, 1885, and published in *Gazette* No 4,675 of September 11, 1885

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 41 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order, with effect from the first day of January, 1944—

- (a) transfer to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area the whole of the property and the funds acquired or received by or vested in the Sanitary Board of the Ratnapura District for the use and benefit of the town of Dela and specified in Schedule A hereto, and
- (b) prescribe that the servants specified in Schedule B hereto and employed by the said Sanitary Board for the purposes relating exclusively to the town of Dela may be transferred to the service of the said Village Committee upon the terms and conditions set out in that Schedule

## Regulation

The Defence (Movement of Cattle) (Restriction) Regulation published in *Gazette* No 9,086 of February 15, 1943, is hereby amended as follows —

- (1) in paragraph (1) thereof, by the substitution, for the word "remove", of the words "remove or cause to be led, driven, transported or removed";
- (2) by the renumbering of paragraph (2) thereof, as paragraph (3), and
- (3) by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (1), of the following new paragraph —

"(2) No person shall keep under his control or be in possession of any head of cattle which to his knowledge has been removed in contravention of the provisions of paragraph (1)"
