## THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE

## Regulations for the Mandur Festival

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Mandur in the Porativu pattu of the Batticaloa District

## Regulations

1 (1) These regulations shall be in force during the period commencing on the twenty fourth day of August, 1943, and ending on the thirteenth day of September, 1943

(1) In these regulations, "Camp Area" means the area within the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto, and "Government Agent" means the Government Agent of the Eastern Province

2 No person shall camp in any part of the camp area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Government Agent by special or general order or by notice exhibited on the spot

3 No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent

4 No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area, except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent

5 (1) No person shall keep any cattle for any purpose whatsoever in, or in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Government Agent

(2) Every person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed daily from the camp area to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle

6 Every person who exposes any food or drink for sale within the camp area shall—

- (a) keep such food or drink, and all materials used for the preparation thereof in covered receptacle or glass cases or other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer or by the Sanitary Assistant in charge

of the camp area, or wrapped in or covered with, clean paper or cloth so as to protect such food or drink from contamination by flies or dust,

- (b) keep his premises and the furniture and equipment used for the purposes of his trade in a clean and sanitary condition

7 No person who is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter the camp area and no person shall bring any person suffering from any such disease into the camp area, or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area

8 In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area, and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart

9 Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area

10 When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart

11 The Medical Officer in charge of the camp area, may, if he thinks it necessary, chlorinate any well within the camp area

12 No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating house, or gala, or expose for sale any eatable within the camp area, unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. Such licence shall be issued free of charge

13 (1) No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street, or for any other purpose, within the camp area

(2) No person shall sell or expose for sale any articles of any description at any place within the camp area other than a place approved for the purpose by the Government Agent

14 No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area or within a distance of one mile from the boundaries of such area

15 No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness

## Schedule

The boundaries of the "camp area" are as follows —

- North by the first public lane on the north running parallel to the Mandukkoddamunai road
- East by the lagoon facing Mandukkoddamunai temple
- South by the lake (lagoon) known as Kovilkudah and the village of Palamunai
- West by the Kurunchamunai road

**Abstract**—The object of the invention is to cool the feeding trays which supply material to the drying chamber of a tea drying machine. Normally heated air from the drying chamber leaks past the feeder trays, with the result that the trays and associated mechanism are heated up. The inventor states that even when an inlet valve is provided, frequent stoppages are necessary for cleaning the hot valve to which the leaf has stuck.

Leakage of hot air is prevented, according to the present invention, by blowing cool compressed air, through a series of holes in a pipe system, on to the driving sprocket, the trays which have just discharged leaf, and the returning empty trays. Compressed air is cooled by expansion through the vent holes, and also the direction pressure and velocity is such as to oppose any tendency for hot air to leak into the feeding chamber.
