ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 10 of the Defence (Air Raid Precautions Services) Regulations

The Defence (Air Raid Precautions Services) Order, 1942, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 8,843 of January 7, 1942, as amended by any subsequent order is hereby further amended as follows —

(1) by the substitution, for paragraph 10 thereof, of the following new paragraph —

10 *Equipment and clothing* —The following uniforms are prescribed for the service—

- (a) The Controller, Chief Warden, Deputy Chief Warden, Officers in Charge of Services, Head Wardens, Deputy Head Wardens, Officers in Charge of Report Centres, Staff Officers, Doctors, Engineers (Rescue, Water, Electricity, Gas), A R P Instructors, Rescue Group Leaders, Deputy Rescue Group Leaders, Depot Superintendents, Deputy Depot Superintendents and Deputy Officers in Charge of Report Centres

Officers' Tunic, white drill with white shirt,
black tie
Tunic, white drill of bush type
Slacks or shorts, white drill
Shirt, white twill, military pattern
Socks or stockings, white
Shoes, brown or black
Steel helmet, white or brown topee and black
beret,
Belt, white drill with buckle

(b) Other ranks —

Shirt, white twill, military pattern
Slacks or shorts, white drill
Steel helmet and white or brown topee
Shoes, black or brown

(c) Badges —

(i) All ranks will wear a badge with the letters
A R P at the base of the shoulder straps of
the shirt or tunic

(ii) In addition, the following badges will be worn
by certain officers —

- (1) A R P Controllers—one crown (silvered)
- (2) Chief Warden, Deputy Chief Warden, and
Officers in Charge and Deputy Officers
in Charge of Services—3 stars
- (3) Head Wardens, Staff Officers, Assistant
Staff Officers, Doctors, Engineers (Re-
scue, Water, Electricity and Gas) and
Officers in Charge Report Centres—2
stars
- (4) Deputy Head Wardens, A R P Instruc-
tors, Depot Superintendents, Deputy
Depot Superintendents, Rescue Group
Leaders, Deputy Rescue Group
Leaders, and Deputy Officers in-
Charge of Report Centres—1 star
- (5) Other ranks—badge only

(d) Brassards —

(i) All ranks when on duty, and only when on
duty, shall wear on the left upper forearm, a
white brassard on which the letters A R P
in black shall be imposed

(ii) The following distinguishing marks will be
worn on the brassards of certain officers —

- (1) Controller—threequarter inch red band
along the upper and lower edges of
the brassard
- (2) Chief Warden, Deputy Chief Warden and
Officers in Charge and Deputy
Officers in Charge of Services—three-
quarter inch blue band along the
upper and lower edges of the brassard
- (3) Staff Officers—the letters "S O" in red
- (4) Head Wardens—the letter "H" in red
- (5) Deputy Head Wardens—the letters
"D H" in red
- (6) A R P Instructors—the letter "I" in
red
- (7) Members of House Fire Party—the
letters "H F P" in red
- (8) Shelter Warden—the letter "S" in red

(e) All ranks when on duty and when so directed by the
Controller or other appropriate authority, as the
case may be, shall carry such equipment as may be
ordered by the Controller or such appropriate
authority

(2) by the addition, immediately after paragraph 10 thereof,
of the following new paragraph —

11 The brassard, badges, uniforms, and all other equip-
ment of every member of the Service shall remain the
property of Government and shall be kept in the personal
custody of that member who shall take all such steps as may
be necessary to prevent them from being used by any
unauthorised person

Any person who for any reason ceases to be a member of
the Service shall forthwith return to the A R P Stores his
brassard, badges, uniforms, and all other equipment which
have been supplied to him

3 (1) Every person who, on the prescribed date, has in his possession or under his control more than ten safety cartridges of any description, whether for his own use or for the purposes of sale, shall, before the expiry of a period of seven days from that date, transmit to the Controller a return setting out—

- (a) the name and address and the place of business (if there is a separate place of business) of that person,
- (b) the number, description and size of the safety cartridges in his possession or under his control on that date,
- (c) the purposes for which such safety cartridges are kept, and
- (d) the situation of the premises in which such safety cartridges are stored

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any person who, on any date prior to the prescribed date, has furnished a return in compliance with any notice issued by the Controller

(2) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any safety cartridges in his possession or under his control, a separate return shall be made in respect of the stock kept in each such premises

(3) No person who, on the prescribed date, has in his possession or under his control in any premises more than ten safety cartridges of any description, whether for his own use or for the purposes of sale, shall, on or after that date, remove any of such safety cartridges from such premises to any other place, except with the written permission of the Controller

4 The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or distributing safety cartridges under this Order, and
- (b) cancel any such appointment at any time

5 No person (not being an authorised dealer) who, on the prescribed date, has in his possession or under his control in any premises safety cartridges of any description, whether for his own use or for the purposes of sale, shall, on or after that date, sell or dispose of any of such safety cartridges—

- (a) to any person other than an authorised dealer specified in that behalf by the Controller, or
- (b) otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

6 (1) Every person who, after the prescribed date, imports safety cartridges of any description shall, within a period of three days after he obtains delivery thereof, transmit to the Controller a return specifying the number, description and size of such safety cartridges

(2) No person who, after the prescribed date, imports safety cartridges of any description shall sell or dispose of any number of such safety cartridges—

- (a) to any person other than an authorised dealer specified in that behalf by the Controller, or
- (b) otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

(3) No person who, after the prescribed date, imports safety cartridges of any description shall appropriate to his own use any number of such safety cartridges, except under a permit authorising him to appropriate that number of such safety cartridges to his own use

7 No person other than an authorised dealer shall, on or after the prescribed date, purchase or acquire any number of safety cartridges of any description, except under a permit authorising that person to purchase or acquire that number of such safety cartridges

8 (1) No authorised dealer shall, on or after the prescribed date, sell or dispose of any number of safety cartridges of any description in his possession or under his control to any person, except upon the

surrender by that person of a permit authorising him to purchase or acquire that number of such safety cartridges

(2) No authorised dealer shall, on or after the prescribed date, appropriate to his own use any number of safety cartridges of any description in his possession or under his control, except under a permit authorising him to appropriate that number of such safety cartridges to his own use

(3) No authorised dealer shall, on or after the prescribed date, remove any stock of safety cartridges kept in his premises to any other place, except with the written permission of the Controller

9 (1) Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by Notification published in the *Gazette*

(2) The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) refuse to grant a permit to any applicant therefor, and
- (b) determine the number, description and size of the safety cartridges which any such applicant may be authorised to purchase or acquire or appropriate, as the case may be

(3) Every decision or determination of the Controller under the preceding sub paragraph shall be final

(4) A permit under this Order shall be valid only during such period as may be specified in the permit

10 No person, to whom any permit has been granted under this Order, shall—

- (a) transfer the permit to any other person, or
- (b) sell any of the safety cartridges purchased or acquired by him under that permit to any person—
 - (i) other than an authorised dealer specified in that behalf by the Controller, or
 - (ii) otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

11 The Controller shall specify in every permit issued under this Order the name of the authorised dealer from whom the number of safety cartridges to which the permit relates is to be purchased or obtained

12 Every person to whom a permit has been granted under this Order shall, before taking delivery of the number of safety cartridges to which the permit relates—

- (a) affix his signature (or his thumb print, if he is unable to write) to the permit in the presence of the authorised dealer, and
- (b) surrender the permit to that dealer

13 No person shall sell or supply or purchase or acquire or appropriate any number of safety cartridges of any description otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order

14 Every importer and every authorised dealer shall—

- (a) maintain such records or registers relating to his business as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain, and
- (b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to his business as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish

15 Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate

16 If any applicant for a permit under this Order makes any false statement in his application, then, without prejudice to the institution or maintenance of a prosecution against him for any offence thereby committed, that application or any subsequent application by that person for a permit under this Order may be refused by the Controller

17 The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller

18 In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “Controller” means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) appointed under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939,
- “permit” means a permit issued under this Order,
- “prescribed date” means the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, and
- “safety cartridges” has the same meaning as in the Explosives Ordinance.

- (2) the officer specified in the corresponding entry in column 3 of that Schedule is hereby empowered, if a prohibition is not imposed under paragraph (1), to impose such restrictions as he may consider necessary in connexion with such assembly, for the purpose of minimising the risk of loss of life or personal injuries being caused in consequence of war operations and without prejudice to the generality of the powers hereby conferred, such restrictions may be imposed by him as to—
 - (a) the number of persons that may be allowed to participate in any such assembly, procession or entertainment,
 - (b) the premises that may be used for the purposes thereof, or in the case of a procession the route to be followed by such procession,
 - (c) the hours during which any such assembly, procession or entertainment may be held or conducted,

and such officer may, for the aforesaid purposes, order any such assembly, procession or entertainment to be stopped or discontinued and may direct the persons participating therein to disperse

No prohibition or restriction imposed under the preceding provisions of this Order shall be deemed to affect or prejudice the right of the person or persons in charge of any building used for religious worship to conduct within such building the religious rites connected with the festival or the right of any person to be present in such building for the purpose of participating in such religious rites

In this Order, "entertainment" includes any exhibition performance, amusement, game, sport or competition

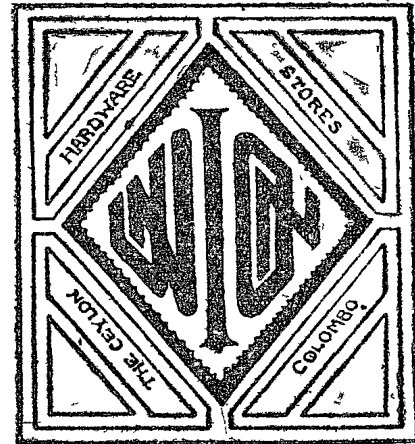

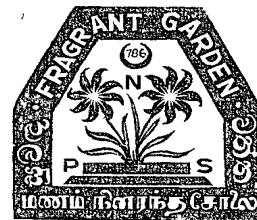
