Regulations

1 These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Royal Naval Special Police) Regulations

2 (1) It shall be lawful for the Admiralty to raise and maintain a force, to be called the Royal Naval Special Police Force, for the policing of Admiralty establishments in the Island

(2) The Force shall consist of such persons as may from time to time be appointed thereto by, or on the authority of, the Admiralty

(3) The organisation, classification, training, discipline, remuneration, clothing, accoutrements and equipment of the members of the Force shall be such as may from time to time be determined, with the approval of the Admiralty, by the Admiral Superintendent, Ceylon, or an officer authorised by him in that behalf

3. Subject to the general or special directions of the Admiralty the Admiral Superintendent, Ceylon, shall be charged with the administration and control of the Force

4 Every member of the Force shall, before entering on the duties of his office, take before a Magistrate or a Justice of the Peace, the oath of office prescribed in the Promissory Oaths Ordinance

5 (1) Every member of the Force shall, within the limits of each Admiralty establishment and in the immediate vicinity thereof, have all the powers, protection and immunities conferred on a member of the Ceylon Police Force of corresponding rank by any written law for the time being in operation

(2) Every member of the Force shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of the Penal Code

6 Every member of the Force who—

(a) neglects or refuses to obey any lawful order or direction given or issued to him in the course of his duties as a member of the Force, or

(b) commits any act of misconduct in the performance of his duties as a member of the Force, or

(c) deserts from the Force,

shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations

7 Where any offence under these Regulations is committed by any member of the Force, the Admiral Superintendent, Ceylon, or any officer or person authorised thereto by him, may, after such inquiry as he may deem necessary—

(a) order the offender to pay a fine not exceeding twenty five rupees and direct that the amount of such fine be deducted, either in its entirety or in instalments, from the pay of the offender, or

(b) order the offender to be confined within the limits of his camp, barracks or station for a period not exceeding fourteen days, or

(c) assign to the offender extra guard or picket duties, or

(d) institute proceedings against the offender in a Magistrate's Court

8 Every member of the Force who is convicted of any offence under these Regulations by a Magistrate's Court shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred and fifty rupees, or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months together with forfeiture of pay during such imprisonment

9 In these Regulations—

"Admiralty establishment" means—

(a) any protected place or protected area declared under Regulation 25 or Regulation 26 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, or

(b) any prohibited place within the meaning of the Official Secrets Acts, 1911 to 1939,

which is occupied or controlled by or on behalf of the Admiralty, in Ceylon,

COMMENCEMENT OF LICENCING OF TEXTILES DEALERS IN REVENUE DISTRICT OF KALUTARA

1 Under Regulation 16 of the Defence (Control of Textiles) (No 1) Regulations, 1943, all DEALERS of all classes including indented and commission agents as well as hawkers in textiles—

(a) whose places of business are situated, or who hawk within the limits of the REVENUE DISTRICT OF KALUTARA, and

(b) who can prove to my satisfaction, under Regulation 17, that they are the proprietors of an ESTABLISHED BUSINESS in textiles IN THE OPEN MARKET, and that they carried on business as such DURING THE FIRST WEEK of the month of JANUARY, 1943,

are hereby required to make application for a dealer's licence, addressed to—

Havelock Town, COLOMBO

(NOT to the undersigned by name) to reach at the above address not later than 12 noon on SATURDAY, OCTOBER 2, 1943, with the words "Application for Licence" written conspicuously on the envelope in the top left hand corner

2 In filling up Section I—Applicant's Affidavit in the Application form, after giving the name of the Village or Town, if there is no Post Office in such village, the name of the Post

Office serving the village should also be inserted, so that the post cards of acknowledgment and licences may be correctly addressed for delivery by the Post Office

3 HAWKERS in the above District, when sending their applications, should attach to them at least SIX RECEIPTS FOR PURCHASES of textiles by them for a few months immediately prior to January 8, 1943. Such receipts should be *securely* fastened to the application with pins, or stitched to it so that they do not become detached. The applicant's name should also be written on the top receipt, all receipts being pinned together.

4 DEALERS in other districts will be called upon to apply in due course by subsequent Press Notices, and SHOULD NOT APPLY till so called upon.

5 Dealers within the Revenue District of Kalutara, who commenced to deal in textiles AFTER THE FIRST WEEK OF JANUARY, 1943, are requested to refrain from applying, or corresponding about their eligibility for a licence. They are advised to sell out their stocks at regulated prices, and give up their business in textiles.

6 BROKERS in textiles, *i.e.*, those who ran no establishments or held no stocks, but purchased textiles locally from one dealer, and sold them locally to another, are NOT RECOGNIZED in the Regulations as dealers, and SHOULD NOT APPLY for licences.

7 Applications must be made only in the authorised printed form of "Application for Licence to Trade in Textiles", which may be obtained from the Kalutara Kachcheri on presentation of a ten cent (10c) postage stamp. The stamp will be affixed to the form in the space provided for it, and will be cancelled by the Issuing Clerk by signing, dating, and punching it, whereafter the stamped form will be handed to the applicant, who should STUDY IT CAREFULLY, fill up all the particulars required, and send it by post addressed as indicated in para. 1 above.

8 Receipt of every application will be acknowledged by post cards within 7 days. If a post card does not reach within, say, 10 days, attention should be invited, giving the date when the application was posted. The correct Postal Address should be given, as required in para. 2 above, for this purpose.

9 If any dealer in the Revenue District of Kalutara has BRANCHES OUTSIDE that district, particulars about such branch office or a HEAD OFFICE SHOULD BE ENTERED in cago (2) of Section II of the Application Form, though Applications are restricted in this Notice to dealers in the above District only, subject to the instructions in para. 10 below.

10 Those dealers in Kalutara District who have a Head Office or branch in Colombo Municipality or in Colombo District should find out from their Head Office or Branch, whether in its application for a licence the Branch in Kalutara District has already been mentioned in such application in respect of the Head Office or branch in Colombo Municipality or in Colombo District, and if so, NO fresh application should be sent for the branch in Kalutara District.

11 HAWKERS, who hawk textiles within Kalutara District, but who have already applied for licences in respect of Colombo Municipality or of Colombo District also, need NOT apply again.

AWARD UNDER THE ESSENTIAL SERVICES (AVOIDANCE OF STRIKES AND LOCK OUTS) ORDER 1942 IN THE TRADE DISPUTE BETWEEN THE ELECTRICITY DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES' UNION AND THE URBAN COUNCIL, JAFFNA

THE Employees of the Electricity Department of the Jaffna Urban Council, who formed themselves into a Trade Union presented under paragraph 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lock outs) Order 1942, a petition wherein they complained that a trade dispute had arisen between them and the Urban Council of Jaffna in consequence of the notice of the termination of the services of the Electrical Superintendent, S Nagendram, by a resolution of the Council dated July 9, 1943, and his subsequent interdiction from duty by a further resolution of the Council at a special meeting held on August 5, 1943. Being satisfied that this petition relates to a trade dispute, I transmitted the petition to the District Judge, Jaffna, for inquiry.

2 After the inquiry was taken up the District Judge made an attempt to effect a settlement of the dispute between the parties but it was not possible to do so. At the conclusion of the inquiry, the District Judge found that the notice of the termination of services served on S Nagendram, the Electrical Superintendent, and his interdiction from service and the termination of services are not justified.

3 The following summary of the Award finally made by the District Judge is published for the information of all concerned in terms of paragraph 8 (4) of the above mentioned Order.

- (i) That the discontinuance of the services of the Electrical Superintendent is not justified and he should be reinstated in his employment,
- (ii) that if the Urban Council of Jaffna wishes to bring up any motion with regard to the discontinuance of Nagendram as Electrical Superintendent employed by the Council, such motion should not be dealt with by the Council as at present constituted but should be submitted for consideration by the Council which will be constituted after January 1, 1944,
- (iii) that with regard to the procedure to be adopted for the dismissal or discontinuance of the services of any member of the staff of the Electricity Department of the Council, a charge or charges should normally be framed against the employee and reasonable time should be given to him to furnish an explanation. If the explanation is found unsatisfactory by the Council, the Council should, after considering the explanation, deal with the matter upon a decision based on the majority vote of the Council.

The District Judge does not consider that the Council should be deprived of its undoubted right to take disciplinary action or to dismiss one of its employees after following the procedure indicated above. The question of delegating the power of dismissal to an outside body appears to derogate from the undoubted right of an employer to deal with his own employee.

LOAN BOARD

Report for the Year 1942

THE annual report of the Commissioners of the Loan Board for the year 1942 is submitted together with the statement of Loan Board funds duly audited by the Auditor General.

Loans—Loans amounting to Rs 249,850 were granted during the year. The corresponding figure for the previous year was Rs 241,650.

Repayments—During the year a sum of Rs 717,009 was received in repayment of principal. The corresponding figure for the previous year was Rs 655,088 75.

Purchase and Sale of Securities—Two securities on which loans to the amount of Rs 77,000 were due, were sold for Rs 90,100 and the amounts realised were credited to the respective loans. Two other securities on which loans to the amount of Rs 42,600 were due, were sold for Rs 33,500 and the deficit of Rs 9,100 was met from Reserve and Depreciation Fund Account.

Interest—The amount of interest collected during the year amounted to Rs 508,741 65 as against Rs 452,809 11 in 1941. The interest collected during the 2nd half of 1941 and the 1st half of 1942 was insufficient to pay the two half yearly dividends of 2 per cent each and a sum of Rs 23,097 60 had therefore to be withdrawn from Profits Account to allow the payment of these dividends.

Investments—A sum of Rs 3,711,230 83 was invested in Ceylon Home Defence Loans.
