## CUSTOMS NOTIFICATION (RENT) No 43/2

*The Customs Ordinance*

IT is hereby notified that by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 17 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185) the Governor has directed that the rates and the regulations under section 13 (now section 17) of the Ordinance, published by notification in *Gazette* No 8,269 of January 29, 1937, be amended under the heading "Import Warehouse Rent" as follows —

- (1) in paragraph 2, by the substitution, for all the words from "Thereafter" to the end of that paragraph, of the following  
"Thereafter, the above rates shall be charged for each succeeding period of three days and for any outstanding period of less than three days (including Sundays, Customs holidays, and the day of removal or shipment of the goods) during which the goods remain at the wharf"
- (2) in paragraph 3, by the omission of the words "single and double",

- (3) in paragraph 4, by the substitution, for the words "double rent" of the words "warehouse rent other than first rent", and
- (4) by the insertion, immediately after paragraph 6, of the following new paragraph —  
"7 Goods consigned to Colombo and diverted to any other port by order of the Admiralty or the Ministry of War Transport of the United Kingdom shall be exempt from warehouse rent other than first rent at such port  
Provided that if such goods are not removed from the wharf within a period of three clear days (exclusive of Sundays and Customs holidays) after their removal from the wharf has been ordered by the Collector of such port, the goods shall, from the expiry of such period, be charged with warehouse rent at the rates applicable under paragraph 2 to goods remaining at the wharf after the period of first rent"
