This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Sulphur) Order 1943

2 Each of the articles specified for the time being in the Schedule hereto, (heiemafter reforred to as a "scheduled article"), is hereby declared to be a controlled article within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

(1) Every person who, on the date on which this Order is published in the Gazette has in his possession or under his control a stock of any scheduled article shall, within seven days from that date, furnish to the Contioller a return setting out

(a) the name and address and the place of business (if there is a place of business) of that person,

- (b) the nature and quantity of such stock,
- (c) the purposes for which such stock is kept, and (d) the situation of the premises in which such stock is kept or stored

(2) Every person who, after the date on which this Order is published in the Gazette, imports any scheduled article shall, within three days from the date on which he takes delivery of that article, furnish to the Controller a return setting out-the particulars specified in the foregoing sub paragraph (1)

(3) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any scheduled article in his possession or under his control a separate ietuin shall be furnished in respect of the stock kept in each such premises

(1) Except under the authority of a permit, no person who is required by paragraph 3 to furnish a return shall

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises specified in such return

(2) Except under the authority of a permit no authorised dealer (not being a person required by paragraph 3 (1) to fuinish a return) shall-

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises at which he causes on business

(3) No permit under the preceding provisions of this para graph shall be required for the purpose of authorising the removal of any quantity of any scheduled article which is sold or otherwise disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this Order

5 (1) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled aitrcle to any person other than an authorised dealer

(2) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article to any authorised dealer unless that dealer is the holder of a general or special permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quan tity from that importer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit

No authorised dealer shall sell of otherwise dispose of any 6 quantity of any scheduled article to any person except upon the surrender by that person of a permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that dealer

7. Except under the authority of a permit no person shall purchase or otherwise acquire any quantity of any scheduled article

No person not being an importei or an authorised dealer shall sell or supply any scheduled atticle to any other person

Provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not be deemed to prohibit any person who has furnished a return under paragraph 3 (1) and who has not been appointed to be an authorised dealer from selling or otherwise disposing of the stock of any scheduled article specified in such return in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

9 The Controller may in his discretion appoint such number of poisons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or supplying any scheduled article

10 Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be pre-cribed by him by notification published in the Gazette

11 (1) The Controller may in his discretion-

- (a) refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant therefor ,
- (b) determine and specify in any permit the terms and conditions subject to which such permit is granted ,

Every return and every application made under this Order shall be venified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate

The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any information furnished or any record maintained by any importer or authorised dealer in pursuance of this Order or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order-

- (a) enter the premises at which such importer or dealer carnes on business or keeps his stocks of any scheduled article,
- (b) inspect the stock of any scheduled article kept on the premises, or
- (c) inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kopt by such importer or dealer (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of scheduled articles

(1) Every person (whether or not he carries on business 3 as a seller or supplier of torch bulbs) who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette* has in his possession or under his control more than six new bulbs shall, before the expiry of a period of seven days from that date, transmit to the Controller a retern in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order setting out-

(a) the number, description and size of such bulbs in his possession of under his control on that date, and

(b) the situation of the premises at which such bulbs are kept or stored

(2) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any new bulbs in his possession or under his control, a separate return shall be made in respect of the

stock kept in each such premises (3) No person (whether or not he carries on business as a seller or supplier of torch bulbs) who, on the date on which this Order is published in the Gazette has in his possession or under his control in any premises more than six new bulbs shall remove any of such bulbs from such premises to any other place or dispose of any of such bulbs except with the written permission of the Controller

4 Every person who imports any new bulbs shall, before the expry of a period of three days of the arrival of such bulbs, transmit to the Controller a return setting out the number, description and size of the bulbs imported by him

5 No person who imports any new bulbs, shall sell or dispose of any of such bulbs-

- (a) to any person other than an authorised dealer specified in that behalf by the Controller, or (b) otherwise than in accordance with such directions as
- may be given to him by the Controller
- The Controller may in his discretion-
- (a) appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary, to be authonsed dealers for the purpose of selling or distributing new bulbs under this Order and
- (b) cancel any such appointment at any time

No person other than an authorised dealer shall, after the prescribed date, purchase or acquire any new bulb of any description, except under a permit authorising that person to purchase or acquire such bulb

(1) No authorised dealer shall after the prescribed date sell or dispose of any new bulb of any description to any person, except upon the surrender by that person of a permit author using him to purchase or acquire such bulb from that dealer

(2) No authoused dealer shall, after the prescribed date, appropriate to his own use any new bulb in his possession of under his control, except under a permit authorising him to appropriate such bulb to his own use

(3) No authorised dealer shall, after the prescribed date, remove any new bulb kept in his premises to any other place except with the wiltten permission of the Controller

9 No person who is required by paragraph 3 (1) to furnish a return shall, unless he has been appointed an authorised dealer, sell or dispose of any new bulb to any person other than an authorised dealer or otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controllei.

(1) Every application for a permit under this Order 10 shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by notification published in the Gazette

(2) The Controller may in his discretion refuse to grant permit under this Order to any applicant, and the decision of the Controller shall be final

(3) A permit under this Order shall be valid only during such period as may be specified in the permit

11 No person to whom any permit has been granted under this Order shall transfer the permit to any other person

12 The Controller shall specify in every permit issued under this Order the name of the authorised dealer from whom the new bulb to which the permit relates is to be purchased or obtained

Every person to whom a permit has been granted 13 under this Order shall, before taking delivery of the new bulb to which the permit ielates

(a) affix his signature (or his thumb print, if he is unable to write) to the permit, and

(b) surrender the permit to that dealer

14 No person shall sell or supply or purchase or acquire any new bulb otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order

- (a) maintain such records or registers iclating to his stock of bulbs as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain, and
- (b) furnish to the Controllei such returns of other information relating to his stock of bulbs as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish

The Africa Star and the 1939–43 Star, the Clasps to the Two Stars, the Despatches Emblem, Wound Stripes and Chevrons for War Service

The Committee on the grant of Honours, Decorations and Medals, in time of war, and a special Committee formed therefrom have had under consideration proposals and direc tions by the Prime Minister, First, Lord of the Treasury and Minister of Defence relative to recommendations for the institution of awards for service during hostilities Certain of the Reports by the Committee have been submitted by the Prime Minister to The King and His Majesty has graciously approved the recommendations summarised in the following memorandum

The Africa Star and the 1939–43 Star Clasps to the Two Stars

1 In commemoration of the expulsion of the enemy from North Africa and to recognise services rendered in operations during the first four years of the war. The King has approved the institution of two awards for the Armed Forces and the Merchant Navy, to be known as the Africa Stai and the 1939–43 Star Noindividual will qualify for both Consideration of the manufacture and issue of the Stars themselves will be postponed until after the war The ribbons are to be made now, and will be issued when supplies are ready

The Africa Star

 \mathbf{Date}

2 The Africa Stai will be granted for service in North Africa from the date of the entry of Italy into the war on June 10, 1940, up to the date of the cossation of operations against the enemy in North Africa on May 12, 1943, inclusive The ribbon is pale bluff in colour, with a central vertical red stripe and two other narrower stripes, one dark blue and the other light blue The background is intended as a symbol of the desert, the central red stripe stands for the Armies, the dark blue stripe for the Naval Forces and the Merchant Navy, and the light blue stripe for the Air Forces The ribbon is to be worn with the dark blue stripe furthest from the left shoulder

(a) Army —The qualification is entry, as part of the estab lishment, into an operational command in North Africa The individual should have been taken on the strength of a unit or formation The whole of the area between the Canal and the Straits of Gibraltar is included Service in operations in Abyssinia, Somaliland and Eritrea, and also in Malta, is a qualification Service in West Africa is excluded

(b) Air Force — The qualification is landing in the area of an Army operational command as defined above including Malta Casual journeys and inspections, other than those specially approved, are excluded In addition, service in the air over any of the Army operational commands in North Africa as defined above, or over enemy occupied territory in North Africa is a qualification, provided that the individual is not eligible for the 1939-43 Star mentioned below

(c) Navy —In the Navy the Africa Star will be awarded only for service on shole or in harboui in the same aleas and between the same dates as the Army, and provided that the individual is not eligible for the 1939–43 Star mentioned below (d) Merchant Navy —In the Merchant Navy the Africa Star will be awarded for service on shore of in harbour under the same conditions as the Royal Navy

Clasps to the Africa Star

3 (a) Army — A silver emblem in the form of an arabic "8" or "1" will be worn on the ribbon in service diess denoting the award of one of these Clasps in the Army The awards will be restricted to service in the Eighth and First Armies respectively in the period from October 23, 1942, inclusive, the date of the battle of el Alamein, up to the date of the cessation of operations against the enemy in North Africa on May 12, 1943 Only one Clasp will be granted to any individual

(b) Air Force —A Clasp, denoted by the standard silver rose emblem on the ribbon, will be awarded to air crew and non air crew personnel of the Royal Air Force under the command of the A O C, Western Desert, or the Air Commander North-West African Forces, and to air crew personnel under the command of the A O C, Malta, or of other A Os C, who operated in support of the Eighth Army or First Army or in the cutting of Rommel's or von Armin's communications, or in the defence of Malta, during the period from October 23, 1942, to the date of the cessation of hostilities in North Africa on May 12, 1943 (Royal Air Force personnel eligible for the 1939–43 Star, which in the Air Force will have priority of award over the Africa Star, will be granted a Clasp to the 1939–43 Star for the service referred to in this paragraph This rose emblem also will be of the standard silver pattern)

(c) Navy —As has been stated above, the Africa Ŝtar will only be awarded in the Navy for service on shore or in harbour There will be no award of a Clasp to the Africa Star in the Navy except for personnel, if any, who served as part of the Eighth or First Armies For these the time limits will be as for the Aimy, and an "8" or a "1" emblem will be issued

(Officers and Ratings of certain units, for instance inshore squadrons and some of the escorting vessels serving off the coast of North Africa, and of submarines and other craft specifically engaged in cutting Rommel's or von Arnim's communications, from October 23, 1942, to the cessation of hostilities in North Africa on May 12, 1943, will be awarded a Clasp to the 1939-43 Star referred to below The rose emblem will be of the standard silver pattern)

a chap to the boot in Star Internet a Star in the emblem will be of the standard silver pattern) (d) Merchant Navy —(As in the Royal Navy, the Clasp to the 1939-43 Star will be awarded m the Merchant Navy to the personnel of vessels which worked inshore during the North African Campaign between October 23, 1942, and May 12, 1943)

4 The 1939-43 Star will be granted for service in operations during the period from September 3, 1939, to December 31, 1943 The ribbon is dark blue, ied and light blue in three equal vertical stripes The dark blue stripe is intended to mark the service of the Naval Forces and the Merchant Navy, the red stripe that of the Armies, and the light blue stripe that of the Air Forces The ribbon is to be worn with the dark blue stripe furthest from the left shoulder

(a) Navy—The qualification is six months' service, afloat in areas of active operations during the period from September 3, 1939, to December 31, 1943, inclusive Service after December 31, 1943, will not be reckoned

These areas are -

- (1) From September 3, 1939, the Atlantic Ocean, including Home Waters, and the North Sea, the Baltic, the Arctic Ocean between Greenland and longitude 70° E and that part of the Indian Ocean lying South of 15°S and West of 55°E
- (u) From June 1, 1940, as (1) with the addition of the Pacific Ocean and the rest of the Indian Ocean
- (m) From June 10, 1940, anywhere at sea

Naval personnel, not eligible by length of service afloat, who served in operations and Commando Raids accepted as qualifying Army personnel for the 1939-43 Star, will be held to qualify

Officers and Men of the Fleet An Anm, who are not qualified by sea service, may be considered for qualification under similar rules to the R A F

(b) Army —The Aimy qualification will be six months in an operational command during the period September 3, 1939, to December 31, 1943 As, however, there have been campaigns that have not covered six months, certain exceptions will be made Where troops have been evacuated, eg, from Dunkirk, Norway, &c, they will be eligible for the 1939–43 Star although then service in operations may have been less than six months, and specified Commando Raids will be similarly treated The list of such exceptions is under consideration India will not be regarded as an operational command except for the purpose of operations on the Burma and North-West frontiers Service on passage to an operational command through dangerous waters will count towads the six months' qualifying period

(c) Avr Force —The 1939–43 Star will be awarded to all air crews who have taken part in operations against the enemy, subject to the completion of two months in an operational unit In addition, non cew personnel serving in the area of an Aimy operational command will qualify, six months' service in the area of the operational command being the equalification, and special exception being made for those evacuated, eg, from Dunkirk, Norway, &c, as for the Aimy those above

(d) Merchant Navy -The Merchant Navy will be awarded the 1939-43 Star under the same conditions as the Royal Navy, except that six months' service at sea will qualify, provided that at least one voyage had been made through one of the specified areas of active operations Service in the landings on of after November 8, 1942, on the coast of Morocco, will be a qualification

(e) General -- Operational service for a lesser period than six and two months respectively, but brought to an end by death, wounds or other disability due to service will qualify The grant for service in operations, of an Honour, Decoration or Mention in Despatches would in the armed forces of the Merchant Navy be a qualification for the award of the Star

Clasp to the 1939-43 Star

5 This Clasp will be denoted by a silver rose emblem, of the standard pattern, and will be confined to the Navy, the Air Force and the Mcichant Navy, for Noith African service The conditions will be as stated in blackets under heading 3, "Clasps to the Africa Star" above, sub paragraphs (b), (c)and (d)

Allied Nationals in the British Forces

6 Allied nationals serving as members of the British Forces (other than those enlisted or commissioned therein by vitue of their membership of Allied Forces) will be eligible for the Stars as members of such Forces, provided their services do not qualify them for similar awards from their own Governments

The Dominions India, Burma and the Colonial Empire

The above airangements will also apply to the Forces 7 and Merchant Navies of Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, India, Burma and the Colonial Empire

The Despatches Emblem, Wound Stripes and Chevrons for War Service

8 His Majesty has also approved an Emblem to denote Mentions in Despatches and has authorised the institution of Wound Stripes and Chevions for wai service These will be issued as soon as they are ready, but production may take some months

Mentions in Despatches

9 The Despatches Emblem is to be granted only for Mentions in Despatches awarded for service in the present way. One such Emblem only will be worn in respect of any number of Mentions in Despatches. The Emblem is in bronze of a new pattern in the form of an oak leaf and is to be worn on the coat immediately after all Medal ribbons It has been designed by Mr Percy Motcalfe, CVO It is not Intended to be worn during the wai on the libbon of any Medal or Stai but is to be attached directly to the coat in the position in which a single libbon would be worn or in the position in which a ribbon would be placed immediately after those already worn The stalk would be woin furthest from the shoulder

Wound Stripes and Chevrons for War Service

Net Profit of the Fund -A sum of Rs 271,101 55, being net profit for the year 1940-41 was paid into Government revenue during the year

The net profit for the year 1941-42 is Rs 253,298 31

Cash Balance — The cash balance lying in the Treasury on September 30, 1942, was Rs 14,142 46

Capital of the Fund -The capital of the Fund stood at Rs 6,655,979 80, of which Government grants amounted to Rs 4,193,094 27 and the accumulated interest to Rs 2,462,885 53 Of the latter amount Rs 253,298 31 represents the net profit for the year payable to Government revenue

Arrears —No final settlement has yet been teached in regard to the loan to the Chilaw Urban Council The Council has agreed to cortain proposals made by the Commissioners according to which it was necessary for Government to consent to take over and run the Chilaw Water Scheme The Public Works Department is still looking into this question

The Small Towns of Point Pedro and Valvettitural and the Small Towns of Hikkaduwa and Dodanduwa were again allowed the concession of paying only the interest due on their loans for 1942 A sum of Rs 1,797 86 due in repayment of loans in 1941-42 is still outstanding from the Small Town of Kuliyapitiya
