THE REGISTERED STOCK AND SECURITIES ORDINANCE

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance (Chapter 289), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order direct that of the sum of one hundred and twenty five million rupees for the raising of which by way of loan authority has been given by the National Loan Ordinance, No 35 of 1943, the sum specified in the Schedule hereto shall be raised in Ceylon in the mode and upon the terms and conditions specified in that Schedule

Schedule

1 The sum of money to be raised shall be twenty million rupees, and it shall be raised by way of—

- (a) a 9–10 year loan,
- (b) a 12–13 year loan, and
- (c) a 21–26 year loan

2 Each of the three loans shall be raised by the creation and issue of registered stock only

Provided, however, that the holders of registered stock issued for the purpose of raising any of the three loans shall, on and after such date as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published in the *Gazette* not later than six months after the conclusion of the present war, have the option of exchanging such stock for securities in the form of Government promissory notes

3 The rate of interest payable shall—

- (a) in the case of the 9–10 year loan, be 3 per centum per annum,
- (b) in the case of the 12–13 year loan, be 3½ per centum per annum, and
- (c) in the case of the 21–26 year loan, be 3½ per centum per annum

4 The dates in each year on which the half yearly interest on each of the three loans shall be payable shall be the first day of February and the first day of August

5 A half yearly appropriation out of the general revenue and assets of Ceylon as a contribution to the sinking fund to be established for the purpose of redeeming each of the three loans shall be made at the rate of 3 per centum per annum, and such contributions shall commence on the first day of August, 1946

6 The date of redemption of the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising each of the three loans and any Government promissory notes taken in exchange for such stock by the holders thereof shall—

- (a) in the case of the 9–10 year loan, be the first day of August, 1953,
- (b) in the case of the 12–13 year loan, be the first day of August, 1956, and
- (c) in the case of the 21–26 year loan, be the first day of August, 1969

Provided, however, that in the case of the 21–26 year loan, the Government shall, on such date subsequent to the first day of August, 1964, as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published, not less than six months prior to that date, in the *Gazette* and in two Ceylon newspapers, have the option of redeeming the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising that loan and any Government promissory notes taken in exchange for such stock by the holders thereof

The List will be opened on October 23, 1943, and will be closed on July 31, 1944, or earlier if the loan is fully subscribed

ISSUE OF Rs 20,000,000 CEYLON GOVERNMENT NATIONAL LOAN

THIS LOAN WILL BE RAISED IN THREE ISSUES AT THE OPTION OF THE APPLICANT —

- (a) 3 per cent Stock repayable at par at the General Treasury, Colombo, on August 1, 1953
 (b) 3½ per cent Stock repayable at par at the General Treasury, Colombo, on August 1, 1956
 (c) 3½ per cent Stock repayable at par at the General Treasury, Colombo, on August 1, 1969, but the Government will have the option of redemption at par on or after August 1, 1964, on giving six calendar months' notice

The allocation between the three issues will not be fixed, but the total amount issued will not exceed Rs 20,000,000

Authority—The loan is raised on the authority of the National Loan Ordinance, No 35 of 1943, and under the provisions of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance, 1937 (Chapter 289)

Purpose—The proceeds of the loan will be used to finance (a) any emergency expenditure which may become necessary as a result of the war, (b) work connected with or incidental to post war development, and (c) repayment of the three year loan raised under the Home Defence Loan Ordinance, No 2 of 1942, and maturing in 1945 and 1946

Form of Issue—The loan will be issued in the form of registered stock only. Holders of registered stock will, however, have the option of exchanging registered stock for promissory notes on and after a certain date as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published in the Gazette not later than six months after the conclusion of the present war (Leaflets containing the general conditions applicable to Registered Stock are available on application to the Public Debt Office)

Issue Price—The issue price is Rs 100 per cent payable in full at the time of application. The minimum holding is Rs 100

Applications—Applications will be received by the Registrar, Public Debt Office, General Treasury, Colombo, from October 23, 1943, and until the list is closed. Applications must be on the proper form and must be accompanied by a remittance in full or by a receipt for the remittance from a Kachcheri or Bank—for mode of payment see under "Payment for Stock"

When payment is made into a Kachcheri or a Bank, the application form may be forwarded through such Kachcheri or Bank

A commission of 1/16 per cent will be allowed to bankers, recognized stock brokers, and brokers registered under the Coconut Products Ordinance in respect of applications bearing their stamp

Payment for Stock—Payments may be made personally or by post in cash or by cheque at the General Treasury, Colombo, or at any Kachcheri, or to the credit of Ceylon Government account in any of the following Banks in Colombo —

Bank of Ceylon
 Chartered Bank of India, Australia and China
 Eastern Bank, Limited
 Hong Kong and Shanghai Banking Corporation
 Imperial Bank of India
 Mercantile Bank of India, Limited
 National Bank of India, Limited

Scrp—Stock Certificates will be issued immediately after receipt and acceptance of the application

Interest—Interest on the three issues at the appropriate rate will be payable half yearly on the 1st day of February and the 1st day of August in each year. The first payment of interest will be the amount of interest due for the period between the date on which the stock is purchased and the next half yearly interest payment date, and a warrant for this amount payable on the next half yearly interest payment date will be attached to the scrip

Taxation—All documents used in the issue, exchange, transfer or redemption of the loan will be free from stamp duty. Interest to resident holders will be paid without deduction of Income Tax, but resident holders liable to Income Tax must include such interest in their income tax returns. Deduction of tax at source will be made from holdings by non residents, other than Empire Governments (Current rate of income tax is 15 per cent in the case of non resident individuals and 18 per cent in the case of non resident companies). Persons who are exempt from Ceylon Income Tax will be entitled to repayment of the tax deducted. Holdings of Charities and Governments of Empire countries are exempt from Ceylon Income Tax

Security—The loan is secured on the general revenues and assets of the Ceylon Government. Three separate sinking funds will be formed for the redemption of the three issues of the loan under the management of the Deputy Chief Secretary and

the Deputy Financial Secretary, who are the Trustees of the sinking funds. Half yearly contributions at the rate of 3 per cent per annum will be commenced on 1st August, 1946, to each of the three sinking funds

These contributions may be increased and will only be discontinued if and when the Trustees are satisfied that no further contributions will be required to ensure the repayment of the loans on the due dates

Public Debt—The public debt of Ceylon on September 30 1942 (excluding war loans raised on behalf of the United Kingdom Government for which no sinking fund is formed as repayment will be made by the United Kingdom Government), amounted to Rs 192,532,033. The approximate market value of the accumulated sinking fund amounted to Rs 36,007,109. The net public debt is thus Rs 156,524,924

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

Order

1 This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Mosquito Nets and Netting) Order, 1943

2 Each of the articles specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as a "scheduled article") is hereby declared to be a controlled article within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

3 (1) Every person who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, has in his possession or under his control a stock of any scheduled article shall, within seven days from that date, furnish to the Controller a return setting out—

- the name and address and the place of business (if there is a place of business) of that person,
- the nature and quantity or number of such stock,
- the purpose for which such stock is kept, and
- the situation of the premises in which such stock is kept or stored

(2) Every person who, after the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, imports any scheduled article shall, within three days from the date on which he takes delivery of that article, furnish to the Controller a return setting out the particulars specified in the foregoing sub paragraph (1)

(3) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any scheduled article in his possession or under his control a separate return shall be furnished in respect of the stock kept in each such premises

4 (1) Except under the authority of a permit, no person who is required by paragraph 3 to furnish a return shall—

- appropriate to his own use any quantity or number of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- remove or permit the removal of any quantity or number of any such article from the premises specified in such return

(2) Except under the authority of a permit no authorised dealer (not being a person required by paragraph 3 (1) to furnish a return) shall—

- appropriate to his own use any quantity or number of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- remove or permit the removal of any quantity or number of any such article from the premises at which he carries on business

(3) No permit under the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be required for the purpose of authorising the removal of any quantity or number of any scheduled article which is sold or otherwise disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this Order

5 (1) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity or number of any scheduled article to any person other than an authorised dealer

(2) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity or number of any scheduled article to any authorised dealer unless that dealer is the holder of a general or special permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity or number from that importer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit

6 No authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity or number of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control to any person except upon the surrender by that person of a permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity or number from that dealer

7 Except under the authority of a permit no person shall purchase or otherwise acquire any quantity or number of any scheduled article

8 No person not being an importer or an authorised dealer shall sell or supply any scheduled article to any other person

Provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not be deemed to prohibit any person who has furnished a return under paragraph 3 (1) and who has not been appointed to be an authorised dealer from selling or otherwise disposing of the stock of any scheduled article specified in such return in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

9 The Controller may in his discretion appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or supplying any scheduled article

10 Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by notification published in the *Gazette*

11 (1) The Controller may in his discretion—

- refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant therefor,
- determine and specify in any permit the terms and conditions subject to which such permit is granted,
- alter, add to or rescind any of the terms and conditions of any permit

(2) Every decision or determination of the Controller under the preceding sub paragraph shall be final

(3) Every person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall comply with the terms and conditions specified in such permit

12 No person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall—

- transfer the permit to any other person, or
- use the article obtained on such permit for any purpose other than the purpose specified in the application made in respect of that permit

13 The Controller may cancel the appointment of any person as an authorised dealer if the Controller is satisfied after such inquiry as he may deem necessary that such dealer has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Order

14 Every importer and every authorised dealer shall—

- keep and maintain in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose such records or registers relating to his stock of scheduled articles as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain, and
- furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish

15 Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate

16 The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any information furnished or any record maintained by any importer or authorised dealer in pursuance of this Order or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—

- enter the premises at which such importer or dealer carries on business or keeps his stocks of any scheduled article,
- inspect the stock of any scheduled article kept on the premises, or
- inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kept by such importer or dealer (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of scheduled articles

17 The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller

18 The provisions of this Order shall apply to the sale or supply of any quantity or number of any scheduled article to any Naval, Military or Air Force authority

19 In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Controller” means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) appointed under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939,

“importer” means any person who imports any scheduled article into Ceylon,

“new mosquito net” means an unused mosquito net,

“new mosquito netting” means any unused mosquito netting, and

“permit” means a permit issued by the Controller under this Order

- (a) in rule 12 by the substitution, for the word “one half”, of the word “three quarters”, and
- (b) by the substitution, for rule 13, of the following new rule—

“13 (1) It shall be lawful for the President (or one of the nominated members of the Committee of Management deputed by him) at his discretion to grant to any member a loan not exceeding the amount of his substantive monthly salary (exclusive of allowances) or pension for the purpose of relieving him in a time of sickness or distress or of aiding him in pecuniary difficulties

(4) In the case of a member who has been compulsorily retired from service more than 18 months before reaching the age of 55, the Committee of Management may, in its discretion, allow the whole or any part of the amount outstanding on a loan taken by such member prior to his retirement to be set off against his contributions under Rule 4. No further loan under this rule shall be granted to any member who is allowed to set off, against his contributions, the whole or any part of the amount outstanding on any loan taken by him

(5) Notwithstanding anything in the preceding provisions of this rule no monthly instalment as aforesaid shall be recoverable in the month of December”

THE CATTLE ORDINANCE

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands under section 3 of the Cattle Ordinance (Chapter 330), approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 5 of that Ordinance

Colombo, August 21, 1943

D S SENANAYAKE,
Minister for Agriculture and Lands*Regulations*

- 1 Those regulations may be cited as the Cattle Branding Regulations, 1943, and shall be in force in every branding district (hereinafter referred to as "district")
- 2 Any person who is resident or owns land in any district and has any animal belonging to him in that district may—
 - (a) have that animal branded with the communal mark fixed for that district, or
 - (b) where that animal has already been branded with such mark and such mark has become indistinct, have that animal re branded with such mark,
 if he or any other person acting under his authority brings that animal to such place and on such date as may have been appointed in respect of that district under regulation 3 and pays the fee specified in regulation 8 to the branding officer on duty at such place on such date
- 3 The Government Agent of each Province shall—
 - (1) appoint branding officers for each district in that Province,
 - (2) provide each branding officer of that Province with—
 - (a) registers in such form as is referred to in regulations 9, and
 - (b) books of vouchers, in foil and counterfoil, for the purposes of regulation 12, and
 - (3) by notice published in the *Gazette*, appoint the place or places in each district in that Province to which, and the days on which, animals of that district may be brought under regulation 2 to be branded or re branded with the communal mark fixed for that district
- 4 No person shall brand or re brand any animal with a communal mark unless he is a branding officer or is authorised by a branding officer so to brand or re brand that animal under the direction, and in the presence, of such officer
- 5 No person shall alter, add to, or deface any communal mark on any animal
- 6 The communal mark with which any animal is to be branded or re branded shall be affixed on the left haunch of that animal as shown in the sketch set out in the Schedule hereto
- 7 (1) No branding officer of any district shall, on any day or at any place, brand or re brand or cause the branding or re branding of any animal with the communal mark fixed for that district unless—
 - (i) that day or that place has been appointed in respect of that district under regulation 3,
 - (ii) that animal, in his opinion—
 - (a) belongs to the person who claims to be the owner thereof, such person being a resident or an owner of land in that district, and
 - (b) is kept in that district, and
 - (iii) the owner of that animal or any other person acting under the authority of such owner pays the fee specified in regulation 8
- (2) No branding officer shall re brand or cause the re branding of any animal with a communal mark which has once been affixed to that animal unless the mark so affixed has become indistinct
- (3) Subject as hereinafter provided, no branding officer of any district shall brand or re brand or cause to be branded or re branded any animal belonging to him and kept in that district with the communal mark fixed for that district. Provided, however, that any animal belonging to any such officer and kept in that district may, at his request, be branded or re branded with such mark by, or under the direction of, any other branding officer of that district
- 8 The fee for branding or re branding any animal with a communal mark shall be 40 cents. Such fee shall be credited to general revenue
- 9 Every branding officer of each district shall keep and maintain a register, in the Form A set out in the Schedule hereto, of animals branded or re branded, by him or under his direction, with the communal mark fixed for that district. He shall open for each village a separate folio in such register
- 10 No person other than a branding officer shall be in possession of an instrument intended or capable of being used for branding any animal with a communal mark unless he can satisfactorily account for the possession of such instrument
- 11 No person shall be in possession of any animal bearing a forged, altered, or defaced communal mark unless he can satisfactorily account for the possession of that animal
- 12 (1) Where a branding officer brands or causes the branding of any animal with a communal mark, he shall issue, free of charge, to the owner of that animal a voucher in the Form B set out in the Schedule hereto
- (2) Where a voucher issued under paragraph (1) of this regulation by a branding officer of any Province in respect of any animal is lost, stolen, or destroyed, the Government Agent of that Province may, on the application of the owner of that animal and on being satisfied that such voucher has been lost, stolen, or destroyed, issue to such owner or his representative a copy of such voucher. If the applicant for such copy is not the person to whom such voucher was issued by such branding officer, the Government Agent shall first satisfy himself by inquiry that such applicant has become the owner of that animal by lawful means, and shall, if so satisfied, make the following endorsement on such copy before issuing it to such owner or his representative—

" This copy is issued on the application of _____ I am satisfied that he has by lawful means become the owner of the animal to which the voucher refers "
- (3) A copy of a voucher issued under paragraph (2) of this regulation shall be deemed for the purposes of these regulations to be as valid and effectual as the original voucher

13 Every branding officer of any Province shall return to the Government Agent of that Province the counterfoils of any book of vouchers, provided under regulation 3, when all the vouchers in that book have been issued, or when required so to do by the Government Agent

14 No person other than a branding officer shall issue such a voucher as is referred to in regulation 12

15 No person shall alter, add to, or deface a voucher issued under regulation 12

16 No person shall sell or purchase any animal which has been branded with a communal mark unless the voucher issued in respect of that animal under regulation 12 is signed and dated both by the seller and the purchaser and delivered to the purchaser at the time of sale

17 No person shall be in possession of any animal which has been branded with a communal mark unless he is the holder or the agent or servant of the holder, of the voucher issued in respect of that animal under regulation 12

18 Every person in possession of any animal which has been branded with a communal mark shall, on demand by any headman or police officer, produce for inspection the voucher issued in respect of that animal under regulation 12

19 The keeper of a slaughter house shall not admit thereto any animal which has been branded with a communal mark unless the owner of that animal, or any person acting under the written authority of such owner endorsed on such voucher—

(a) delivers to such keeper the voucher issued in respect of that animal under regulation 12, and

(b) signs, in the appropriate place, the register kept and maintained by such keeper under regulation 20

20 The keeper of every slaughter house shall keep and maintain a register of vouchers received by him under regulation 19, showing the dates of admission to the slaughter house of the animals to which such vouchers refer, the numbers of such vouchers, and the dates of slaughter of such animals

21 The keeper of every slaughter house shall preserve every voucher received by him under regulation 19 for a period of six months after the slaughter of the animal to which that voucher refers, and shall, on demand by any Government Agent, Magistrate, Divisional Revenue Officer, President of a Village Tribunal, or officer in charge of a police station, produce for inspection any such voucher which is in the possession of such keeper

22 The Assistant Government Agent appointed for any Revenue District may exercise in respect of that Revenue District the powers conferred on a Government Agent by these regulations

23 In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“animal” means a head of cattle,

“branding district” means a branding district declared by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands by notification published in the *Gazette* under section 5A of the Cattle Ordinance,

“branding officer” means a branding officer appointed under regulation 3,

“communal mark” means a communal brand mark fixed by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands by notification published in the *Gazette* under section 5A of the Cattle Ordinance,

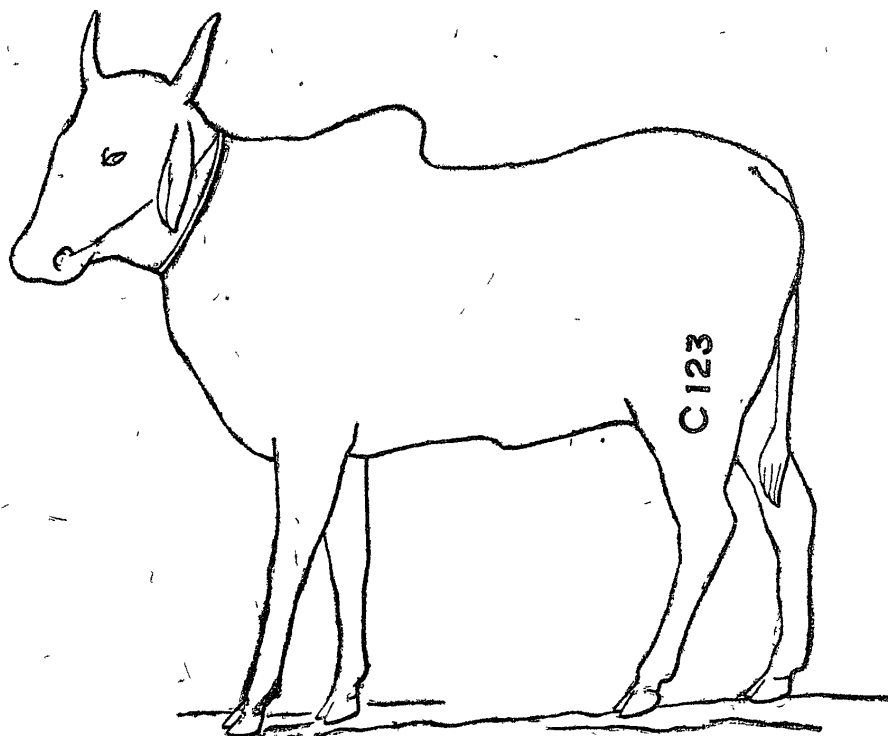
“voucher” includes a copy of a voucher issued under regulation 12 (2) and all endorsements made on, or attached to, the voucher or copy and relating to any such sale of the animal to which the voucher or copy refers as may have been effected after the issue of the voucher or copy

- (c) any bank specially or generally authorised by the Postmaster General to issue such certificates

(2) Every Savings Certificate issued at any place specified in clause (b) or clause (c) of paragraph (1) shall bear, in the space provided therein for the purpose, the name of a Post Office appointed by the Postmaster General to be for the time being an office of the Post Office Savings Bank, and such Post Office shall be deemed for all purposes to be the Post Office at which the issue of such certificate has been registered

1 (1) Every applicant for a telephone connection from any exchange other than an exchange within the Colombo Exchange area, shall, before he is provided with the telephone connection applied for, enter into an agreement with the Postmaster General substantially in the form set out in the Schedule hereto

(2) For the purposes of this rule, "Colombo Exchange area" means the area within the administrative limits of the Colombo Municipal Council

The undersigned,* _____ (hereinafter called "the Renter"), agrees to hire from _____ Postmaster General of Ceylon (hereinafter called "the Postmaster General"), acting herein for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon a telephone line and instruments (hereinafter referred to as "the telephone line") for the purpose of the telephone service described hereunder upon and subject to (a) the provisions and conditions herein and in the Schedule hereto contained, and (b) the Rules relating to telephones made from time to time under the Telegraph Ordinance (Chapter 147). The Renter undertakes to pay to the Postmaster General in advance the annual/quarterly rent specified below, and, on demand, all message rate fees and charges incurred on account of trunk lines, or any other additional facilities and services rendered, subject, however, in the case of quarterly payments to an additional charge of Rs 5/Rs 2 50† with each such quarterly payment of rent

This Agreement shall be for a term of _____ year, and shall continue thereafter unless and until determined at the end of the said term or at any time thereafter, by either party giving to the other three calendar months' previous notice in writing or by payment by the Renter to the Postmaster General of three months' rent (calculated at the annual rate) in lieu of notice

General Conditions

- 1 The Postmaster General shall erect the telephone line (subject to the provisions of this agreement) maintain the in good working order
- 2 (1) Subject as aforesaid in the event of the telephone not being in good working order, the Postmaster General repair and restore the same at his own expense and with possible despatch, but the Postmaster General shall not held responsible or liable to the Renter in damages or expense howsoever for any delay in such repair, or for any or damage occasioned by the total or partial interruption communication by means of the telephone line
- (2) In the event of the destruction or damage by fire or accident of any part of the telephone line which is located on the Renter's land or premises, the Renter shall pay to the Postmaster General the value of any instrument or other part of the telephone line destroyed or damaged
- 3 (1) The Postmaster General reserves to himself the right, without expense to the Renter, to disconnect any line from the exchange with which it is connected, to re connect it with any other exchange which he may wish in the area
- (2) If the Renter desires at any time any alteration in the telephone line or the removal of the telephone line to any premises, and the Postmaster General is of opinion that alteration or removal may be effected without prejudice to the interests of the Post Office under the agreement, such alteration or removal shall be effected by the Postmaster at the Renter's expense, and the provisions of this agreement shall apply to the telephone line as thus altered alteration or removal shall not in any way prejudice the Postmaster's right to recover rent from the Renter the provisions of this agreement in respect of the period which the telephone line is totally or partially interrupted in consequence thereof
- 4 (1) So far as the telephone line and the fixtures and fittings connected therewith are situated on the Renter's premises, he shall take good care of the same, and shall damage, alter, or remove the same, or allow it or them or of them to be damaged, altered, or removed, or, without the consent of the Postmaster General in writing make any attachments to the same or place any other telephone line or apparatus in electrical connection therewith, and shall not obliterate any marks, words, or numbers which may be written, painted, stamped, or impressed on any surface forming part of the telephone line, or allow any obliteration In the event of any breach of this condition the Renter shall (without prejudice to the other provisions of this agreement) make good to the Postmaster General all expenses and damages to which he may be put by reason of such breach
- (2) Telephones connected with exchanges are to be used for the business of the Renters, or that of their employees, or, or guests only
- (3) The Renter further undertakes to indemnify the Postmaster General against any claim on account of damage or injury caused to the Renter's premises by any high potential electricity not emanating from premises of the Postmaster General which may be conveyed to the Renter's premises by means of the telephone line The Postmaster General shall, however, take all reasonable precautions to prevent damage or injury from this cause

or without allows the telephone to be put to any illegal use, and may remove, or cause to be removed, any instruments allotted to the use of such Renter

(3) If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Postmaster General that a telephone rented for non business purposes is used for professional or business purposes, the Postmaster General may demand payment of the difference between non business and business rate per annum for such telephone, and may disconnect the Renter on failure to pay the amount within ten days after such demand, and may remove, or cause to be removed, the instrument allotted to the use of such Renter The Postmaster General's decision as to what constitutes use for business or professional purposes within the meaning of this rule shall be final

(4) No person shall have any claim for damages or otherwise whatsoever in consequence of the removal of any instruments or of the disconnection of any Renter as aforesaid

6 If the annual or quarterly subscription or any of the additional fees, charges, expenses, or damages payable by Renter to the Postmaster General under this agreement shall be in arrear for one month after the same ought to have been paid, or if the Renter shall be adjudicated an insolvent or make any composition or arrangement with or assignment for the benefit of his creditors, or if distress or execution be levied on the Renter's premises, or in the case of a Company, if it shall be wound up, or shall have a Receiver of Assets appointed, or if the Renter shall fail to observe and perform any of the clauses and conditions of this agreement, the Postmaster General may (without any prejudice to any other right or remedy of the Postmaster General under this agreement and notwithstanding the waiver of any previous breach) determine this agreement at any time thereafter by notice in writing to that effect This notice shall be deemed to be duly given if it is left at the Renter's premises or if it is sent by registered post to his usual or last known place of address Any such determination shall cancel this agreement, save for the purpose of carrying this condition and condition No 11 into effect, and such determination shall not prejudice the right of the Postmaster General to recover the said arrears (if any) The Postmaster General shall also be entitled to recover from the Renter forthwith, as liquidated damages and not by way of penalty (in addition to any arrears of subscription or other sums due to the Postmaster General), a sum equal to one fourth of the annual rental In the event of the death of the Renter, the Postmaster General shall be entitled to serve the aforesaid notice on the executor of the last will of the Renter or on the administrator of the estate of the Renter or on the occupier of the premises in which the telephone line is installed

7 The Postmaster General may cause the Renter to be disconnected without notice and without prejudice to the other clauses and conditions of this agreement, if the subscription, or any of the additional fees and charges payable by the Renter under this agreement, is overdue, and to decline to make any connection involving an additional charge unless and until the same is prepaid or a deposit covering such charge is given to the Postmaster General

8 The Renter must answer questions addressed to him by the Postmaster General with regard to the use of the telephone supplied to him In the case of refusal the Postmaster General may terminate the agreement, and shall not be liable to refund any part of the rent paid

9 If the Postmaster General shall at any time be unable or for any reason unwilling to obtain or maintain any licences, way leaves, or permission for any telegraphic work, or any easements necessary to the construction or maintenance of the telephone line, the Postmaster General may by notice in writing determine this agreement as from the time of the leaving of such notice at the Renter's premises, and the Renter shall be entitled to no payment or compensation except a return of so much of the current year's or quarter's rental calculated at the annual rate as shall be proportionate to the unexpired portion of the period paid for, and the balance of any deposits standing in the Postmaster General's books to the credit of the Renter

10 The Renter will grant to the Postmaster General free of charge every facility in his power for the erection of poles and wires and the examination and maintenance of the telephone line, and will permit the Postmaster General and his servants at all reasonable times to have free access to the particular premises in this agreement referred to, and to all other premises under the Renter's control for all or any of the purposes aforesaid If the Postmaster General, after written application under his hand or the hand of the Superintendent of Telecommunication Traffic left at the Renter's premises, shall be unable to obtain any such facility as aforesaid, the Postmaster General shall have the right, without further

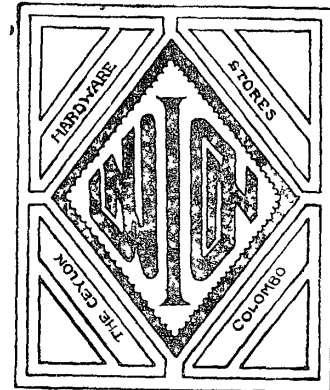

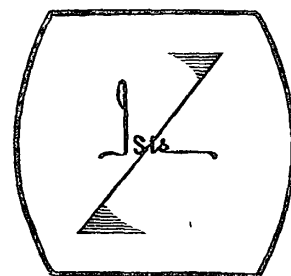
