BY vutue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordmance, No 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Order relating to the number of members of the Nuwara Eliya Urban Council and to the number and limits of the electoral divisions of the town of Nuwara Eliya, and published in Gazette No 7,922 of May 6 1932,

(3) order under section 21 that, for the purposes of the general election of the members of the Nuwara Eliya Urban Council to be held next after the date hereof and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the Order set out in paragraph (2) shall be deemed to be operative on any day, prior to the day specified in paragraph (4), on which it may be necessary that that order should be so operative, and

(4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) shall come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Nuwara Eliya Urban Council who are

in office at the date hereof

Rules

- (1) Packing—General—Subject to the special methods of packing prescribed in rule 2 for certain kinds of articles every parcel transmitted by post shall be pucked and enclosed in a leasonably strong case of cover, fustened in a manner calculated
 - a) to preserve the contents from loss or damage in the post,
 - (b) to prevent the contents being tampered with in the post, and
 - (c) to protect other postal articles from being damaged in any way thereby

(2) Parcels containing liquids, substances which easily liquefy, eggs and articles of glass or other fragile materials shall be clearly marked on the outside "Fragile"

2 (1) Special methods of packing for certain kinds of articles —Articles of glass or other fragile materials, liquids, substances which easily liquofy, oils, eggs, fish, meat, fiuit, vegetables, butter and other gronsy substances, colouring powders, cheese and other strong smelling articles transmitted by post shall be packed in the following manner—

(a) articles of glass or other fragile materials shall be securely packed in boxes made of metal, wood, or strong corrugated cardboard so as to avoid any risk of injury to postal officers and damage to other postal articles,

(b) liquids, oils and substances which easily liquety shall be enclosed in receptacles hermetically sealed Each receptacle shall be placed in a separate box or metal, strong wood or strong corrugated cardboard containing sawdust, cotton, or other spongy material in

sufficient quantity to absorb the liquid contents of the receptacle in the event of the breakage of the receptacle The lid of the box shall be fixed in such a manner that it does not become easily detached,

- (c) cggs, butter and other greasy substances shall be placed in an inner cover which shall be securely closed This inner cover shall itself be placed in an outer cover of wood, metal or leather which is sufficiently strong to prevent the contents from escaping in the course of transmission by post The outer cover shall contain sawdust, cotton or other spongy material in sufficient quantity to absorb any contents
- that may escape through the inner cover,
 (d) colouring powders shall be enclosed in an inner cover,
 which shall be securely closed. This inner cover shall itself be placed in an outer cover of metal, wood, leather or cardboard,
- (e) fish, meat, fruit, vegetables, cheese and other strong smelling articles, shall be placed in receptacles which are rat proof and do not allow the smell of their contents to escape
- (2) Viscera (whether human or otherwise) transmitted by post shall be packed in the following manner
 - (a) the viscora shall be placed in a glass bottle or jai which shall be closed with a tight fitting stopper or cork In cases where alcohol has been used to preserve the riscora, a ring of bees wax or candle wax shall be placed round the lip of the bottle or jar. The stopper or cork shall be kept in place by means of a tight fitting cover made of bladder or leather stopper or cork shall, in addition, be sealed,
 - (b) the glass bottle or par shall itself be placed in a strong wooden or tin box containing a layer of raw cotton three fourths of an inch thick, and (c) the box shull itself be enclosed in a cloth cover This
 - cover shall be securely closed and sealed. The seals shall be at intervals not exceeding 3 inches along each seam. The scals must be of the same kind of wax and shall bear distinct impressions of the same device The device shall not be that of a current coin or merely a series of straight or crossed
