THE REGISTERED STOCK AND SECURITIES ORDINANCE

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance (Chapter 289), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order direct that of the sum of one hundred and twenty five million rupees for the raising of which by way of loan authority has been given by the National Loan Ordinance, No 35, of 1943, the sum specified in the Schedule hereto shall be raised in Ceylon in the mode and upon the terms and conditions specified in that Schedule

Schedule

1 The sum of monev to be raised shall be twenty million rupees and it shall be raised by way of—

- (a) a 9-10 year loan,
(b) a 12-13 year loan, and
(c) a 21-26 year loan

2 Each of the three loans shall be raised by the creation and issue of registered stock only

Provided, however, that the holders of registered stock issued for the purpose of raising any of the three loans shall, on and after such date as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published in the *Gazette* not later than six months after the conclusion of the present war, have the option of exchanging such stock for securities in the form of Government promissory notes

3 The rate of interest payable shall—

- (a) in the case of the 9-10 year loan, be 3 per centum per annum,
(b) in the case of the 12-13 year loan, be 3½ per centum per annum, and
(c) in the case of the 21-26 year loan, be 3½ per centum per annum

4 The dates in each year on which the half yearly interest on each of the three loans shall be payable shall be the first day of February and the first day of August

5 A half yearly appropriation out of the general revenue and assets of Ceylon as a contribution to the sinking fund to be established for the purpose of redeeming each of the three loans shall be made at the rate of 3 per centum per annum, and such contributions shall commence on the first day of August, 1946

6 The date of redemption of the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising each of the three loans and any Government promissory notes taken in exchange for such stock by the holders thereof shall—

- (a) in the case of the 9-10 year loan, be the first day of August, 1953,
(b) in the case of the 12-13 year loan, be the first day of August, 1956, and
(c) in the case of the 21-26 year loan, be the first day of August, 1969

Provided however, that in the case of the 21-26 year loan the Government shall, on such date subsequent to the first day of August, 1964, as may be appointed by the Governor by notification published, not less than six months prior to that date, in the *Gazette* and in two Ceylon newspapers, have the option of redeeming the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising that loan and any Government promissory notes taken in exchange for such stock by the holders thereof

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,
1939 AND 1940

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon, by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940

Regulations

1 These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (Venereal Diseases) Regulations

2 The Vagrants Ordinance shall, so long as these Regulations are in force, have effect for all purposes as if section 7 (1) thereof had been amended in paragraph (iii)—

- (1) by the renumbering of sub-paragraph (iii) as sub-paragraph (iv), and

(2) by the insertion, immediately after sub-paragraph (ii), of the following new sub-paragraph—

“(iii) in the vicinity of any barracks, camp, billet, training-school, parade ground, place of recreation or other place or premises reserved for the use of any part of the forces of His Majesty or of any power allied with His Majesty in the conduct of any war, or”

3 (1) This Regulation shall apply to every person who—

- Cap 26 (a) is convicted of an offence under section 3 (1) (b) of the Vagrants Ordinance, or
- (b) being a woman, is convicted of any offence under section 7 of the Vagrants Ordinance as amended by these Regulations, or
- Cap 25. (c) at the trial of any person for an offence under section 2 of the Brothels Ordinance in respect of the use of any premises as a brothel, is proved to the satisfaction of the Court to have been, at the time of any search or inspection of the premises which is deposed to in the evidence, found on the premises in such circumstances that it is reasonable to infer that that person was there present for an immoral purpose
- (2) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (3) of this Regulation, a Magistrate's Court shall have power to make order—
- (a) that any person to whom this Regulation applies shall be medically examined,
- (b) that for the purpose of such examination such person shall be removed to a Government institution, and
- (c) that such person, if found upon such examination to be suffering from any venereal disease, shall be detained in that institution for treatment until the medical officer of that institution certifies that such person has passed the infective stage of the disease

(3) No order under paragraph (2) shall be made in respect of a person of the description set out in sub paragraph (c) of paragraph (1), unless the Court, by oral or written notice in that behalf, has first given that person an opportunity to show cause why such order should not be made, and unless that person has failed to show cause in compliance with the notice or has not shown sufficient cause

(4) In this Regulation—

“Government institution” means any hospital, clinic or other establishment maintained by the Government for the free treatment of venereal disease,

“venereal disease” means gonorrhoea, syphilis, or soft chancre

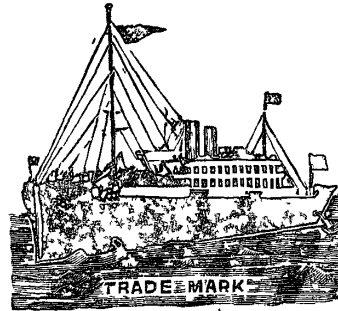
