#### Regulations

1 These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Manufacture of Matches) (No 2) Regulations

2 During the continuance in force of these Regulations, the power conferred on the Director of Commerce and Industries by sub section (1) of section 6 of the Manufacture of Matches (Regulation) Ordinance to revoke a licence, shall be deemed to include the power to revoke a licence to manufacture matches if it is shown to the satisfaction of the Director that any matches manufactured for sale by the holder of such licence do not satisfy the requirements of Part III of the Manufacture of Matches Regulations, 1938

3 Where the quantity of matches manufactured by any licensee at any manufactory during any month is less than the maximum permitted monthly output of that manufactory, the Director may allocate the quantity which that licensee has failed to manufacture at that manufactory during that month to such other licensees in such proportion as the Director may in his discretion determine, and upon such allocation being notified in writing by the Director to such other licensees, it shall be lawful for each such licensee to manufacture at any manufactory specified in his licence, in addition to the maximum permitted monthly output of that manufactory, the quantity so allocated to him, anything in section 9 of the Manufacture of Matches (Regulation) Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding

4 During the continuance in force of these Regulations, regulation 2 of the Manufacture of Matches Regulations, 1938, shall have effect as though, in the definition of "quota", for the words "output of matches", there were substituted the words "output of matches (exclusive of matches manufactured for the use of His Majesty's forces)"

5 No licensee shall manufacture any matches for the use of His Majesty's forces except under the authority of a special permit issued in that behalf by the Director or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as the Director may, in his discretion, specify in such permit

6 In these regulations—

"Director" has the same meaning as in the Manufacture of Matches (Regulation) Ordinance,

"licensee" means the holder of a licence to manufacture matches under the Manufacture of Matches (Regulation) Ordinance

THE SAVINGS CERTIFICATES ORDINANCE

WHEREAS by resolution passed under section 2 of the Savings Certificates Ordinance (Chapter 292), published with the approval of the Governor and the sanction of the Secretary of State by Notification in *Gazette* No 9,148 of July 16, 1943, the State Council has authorised a sum of Rs 5,000,000 to be borrowed within Ceylon by the issue of savings certificates under that Ordinance

And whereas the Governor has under section 3 of that Ordinance directed the Postmaster General to borrow a sum of Rs 2,000,000 out of the said sum of Rs 5,000,000 by the issue of savings certificates as aforesaid in addition to the sum of Rs 3,000,000 referred to in the notification published in *Gazette* No 9,159 of August 20, 1943

#### Regulation

The Code of Regulations for Assisted English Schools published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No 7,728 of August 16, 1929, is hereby amended as follows —

- (1) in regulation 16 (vii), as amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No 8,728 of March 21, 1941, by the addition, at the end thereof, of the following —  
"A part-time teacher means a teacher who teaches for less than twenty hours each week",
- (2) in regulation 30, as last amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No 8,872 of February 27, 1942—  
(a) by the omission of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d) and (f), and  
(b) by the re lettering of paragraphs (e) and (g) as paragraphs (a) and (b), respectively,
- (3) in regulation 30A, inserted by regulation published in *Gazette* No 7,860 of June 12, 1931, and amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No 7,936 of July 22, 1932, and erroneously referred to in the last mentioned regulation as Clause 31A—  
(a) in condition (2), by the omission of all the words and figures from "In making the above calculations" to "38 (a), (b) and (h)",  
(b) by the omission of condition (4),  
(c) by the addition immediately after condition (3) of the following new conditions —  
" (4) Any English School which provides post-primary courses, approved by the Director, in Sinhalese and Tamil up to the

standard of at least the Junior School Certificate may employ, in addition to the teachers in respect of whose salaries grant is payable under the preceding provisions of this Code, a full-time or part time teacher for conducting—

- (a) post primary courses in Tamil, in case the number of students in that school following such courses is less than the number of students in the school following post-primary courses in Sinhalese, or
- (b) post primary courses in Sinhalese, in case the number of students in that school following such courses is less than the number of students in the school following post primary courses in Tamil

Provided, however, that no such teacher shall be employed, if the number of students desirous of following such courses is less than 15

Grant shall be payable in respect of the salary of such a teacher. No teacher shall be so employed unless his qualifications have been approved by the Director

(5) Nothing in the provisions of conditions (1) to (4) shall effect or be deemed to effect the position and salaries of teachers employed, prior to November 19, 1943, to conduct post-primary classes in Oriental Languages

(6) The grant payable in respect of the salary of any full-time teacher referred to in condition (4) or (5) shall be the salary appropriate to the qualifications of the teacher less the Manager's contribution in respect of such salary, such salary and contribution being determined according to the scales specified in the Appendices. The grant payable in respect of a part time teacher referred to in condition (4) or (5) shall be calculated on the basis of—

- (a) the number of hours for which he taught each week,
- (b) the salary appropriate to his qualifications, and
- (c) the Manager's contribution in respect of such salary

Such salary and contribution shall be determined according to the scales specified in the Appendices."

(4) by the addition, immediately after regulation 43, of the following new regulation 43A —

"43A The grant payable to schools conducted for the education of blind, deaf, defective or epileptic children shall be 75 per centum of the salaries of the approved number of teachers, such salaries being determined according to the scales specified in the Appendices. For the purpose of this regulation, the approved number of teachers shall be calculated on the basis of one teacher for every ten units of average attendance"

- (5) by the rescission of regulation 38,
- (6) in Appendix A, by the substitution for the words and figures, "Uncertificated teachers who have passed an examination in Sinhalese or Tamil or Pali or Sanskrit or Arabic not lower in standard than that prescribed in clause 31 (c)", of the words "Uncertificated teachers whose qualifications have been approved by the Director", and
- (7) in Appendix B, under the heading "Fixed Contributions from Managers towards the salaries of Women Teachers in Girls' and in Mixed Schools and in the Kindergarten Classes of Boys' Schools", by the substitution, for the sub-heading "Class IV — Vernacular Teachers (Clause 31 (c))", of the following —  
"Class IV — Vernacular Teachers"

The rules for the guidance of ministers framed under section 9 (now section 7) of the Marriage Registration Ordinance and published in *Gazette* No 7,911 of March 11, 1932, are hereby amended by the substitution, for rule 19, of the following new rule —

“Effect of section 30 (2) of the Marriage Registration Ordinance 19 In the case of a marriage intended to be solemnized in Ceylon between a British subject resident in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and a British subject resident in Ceylon, section 30 (2) of the Marriage Registration Ordinance shall not be deemed to relieve the party to such marriage who is resident in Ceylon of the duty to comply with the provisions of that Ordinance which require the giving of notice of marriage, the making of a declaration in such notice, and the production of a certificate of notice of marriage”

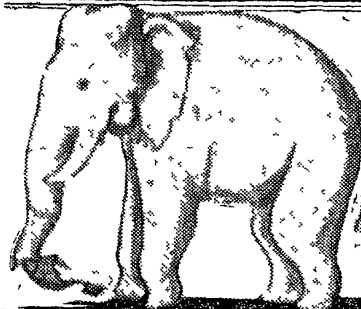
