GREETING

WHEREAS I have deemed it necessary to issue a Commission to inquire into and report upon the matters hereinafter mentioned upon which information is, in my opinion, necessary

Know Ye that I, ANDREW CALDECOTT, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Territories and Dependencies thereof, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability and fidelity, do by these presents nominate, constitute, and appoint you the said LUCIAN MACULL DOMINIC DE SILVA, one of His Majesty's Counsel learned in the law (Chairman), and GEORGE CROSSETTE THAMBYAH to be my Commissioners for the following purposes, that is to say—

- (1) to inquire into and report upon the law of Ceylon relating to the hypothecation of movable and immovable property and to the procedure for the enforcement of hypothecary charges on such property, with a view to removing such defects as may be found therein,
- (2) to make recommendations relating to the amendment of existing law and to the enactment of new legislation, with a view to removing defects and supplying deficiencies in the law which limit the availability in Ceylon of adequate credit facilities for agricultural, industrial and commercial purposes, and
- (3) to inquire into and report upon the nature and extent of the protection which may properly be afforded by legislation to the ancestral and other lands of agriculturists, so as to preserve a sufficient portion thereof for the maintenance of themselves and their families

And I hereby authorise and empower you to hold all such inquiries and make all such investigations into the aforesaid matters as may appear to you to be necessary, and I do hereby require you to transmit to me a report thereon under your hand as early as possible

And I do hereby require and direct all public officers and other persons, to whom you may apply for assistance or information for the purposes of this inquiry, to render all such assistance or furnish all such information as may properly be rendered or furnished in that behalf

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Home Affairs under section 17 of the Orphanages Ordinance, No 22 of 1941, approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section

Regulations

1 These regulations may be cited as the Orphanages Regulations, 1943

2 (1) Every application, under section 6 of the Ordinance, for the registration of an orphanage established prior to the date of the commencement of the Ordinance shall be in the Form A set out in the Schedule hereto and shall contain the particulars required to be specified in that Form

(2) Every application, under section 6 of the Ordinance, for the registration of an orphanage which is to be established after the appointed date shall be in the Form B set out in the Schedule hereto and shall contain the particulars required to be specified in that Form

3 An application for the registration of an orphanage proposed to be established in any area may be refused if the Minister for Home Affairs is satisfied that the number of orphanages situated in that area is such as to render the establishment therein of an additional orphanage unnecessary

4 Every certificate of registration issued under section 7 of the Ordinance shall be in the Form C set out in the Schedule hereto

5 (1) The date in each year on or before which returns are to be furnished under sub section (1) of section 9 of the Ordinance shall be July 1

(2) Every return furnished under sub section (1) of section 9 of the Ordinance shall be in the Form D set out in the Schedule hereto and shall contain the particulars required to be specified in that Form

6 General or special directions under section 11 of the Ordinance shall be served on the Manager of an orphanage—

- (a) by letter sent to him through the registered post or delivered to him by a Village Headman, or
- (b) by notice affixed to a conspicuous part of the orphanage building

7 The orphans and deserted children who are found in an orphanage to which section 13 of the Ordinance applies may be removed by such Inspector, Registrar, or authorised person as is mentioned in that section to any registered orphanage into which such orphans and children can be admitted

8 (1) No maintenance grant under section 16 of the Ordinance shall be payable for any year in respect of any orphan or deserted child in a registered orphanage—

- (a) unless that orphanage has been in existence during the twelve months immediately preceding that year, and
- (b) unless that orphan or deserted child has been maintained in that orphanage for a period of not less than nine months in that year, and, if not under the age of five years, is attending a school which is recognised by the Director of Education

(2) No maintenance grant under section 16 of the Ordinance shall, in respect of any year, be paid to the Manager of a registered orphanage in any area—

- (1) unless he furnishes to the Registrar of Orphanages of that area a copy of the accounts of that orphanage relating to the twelve months immediately preceding that year and audited by an auditor approved by the Registrar, and
- (ii) unless the Registrar is satisfied—
- (a) that there is suitable and adequate accommodation in that orphanage,
- (b) that the orphans and deserted children in that orphanage are sufficiently provided with good food
- (c) that the continued existence of that orphanage is assured,
- (d) that the management of that orphanage is financially sound, and
- (e) that the Manager and members of the staff of that orphanage are of good character

In this paragraph the expression "accommodation" includes dormitory, dining room, kitchen, bath rooms, and sanitary conveniences

(3) The amount to be paid for any year as a maintenance grant under section 16 of the Ordinance in respect of each orphan or deserted child in a registered orphanage shall be—

- (a) fifty rupees, if the age of that orphan or deserted child is not more than five years on the first day of January of that year, and
- (b) one hundred rupees, if that orphan or deserted child—
- (1) is a female who is above the age of five years on such day, or
- (ii) is a male who is above the age of five years, but under the age of sixteen years, on such day, and
- (c) fifty rupees, if that orphan or deserted child is a male who is not under the age of sixteen years on such day

9 In these regulations—

"appointed date" means the date appointed by Proclamation under section 2 of the Ordinance, and

"Ordinance" means the Orphanages Ordinance, No 22 of 1941

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands under section 9 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance (Chapter 327)

Regulations

1 There shall be established the following Government Quarantine Stations for sheep and goats imported for the purpose of being slaughtered outside the administrative limits of the Municipal Council of Colombo for the use of His Majesty's Forces —

- (a) A Government Quarantine Station at such place in Colombo as may be approved by the Minister for Agriculture and Lands by notice published in the *Gazette*
- (b) A Government Quarantine Station at such place outside Colombo as may be approved by the Minister for Agriculture and Lands by notice published in the *Gazette*

2 The Government Quarantine Stations established under regulation 1 of these regulations shall be under the control of the Government Veterinary Surgeon

3 Such of the provisions of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, as relate to Government Quarantine Stations, other than regulations 44, 47, 48 and 49 of those regulations, shall apply in the case of the Government Quarantine Stations established under regulation 1 of these regulations

4 There shall be established at such place within the administrative limits of the Municipal Council of Colombo as may be approved by the Mayor of such Council by notice published in the *Gazette* a Quarantine Station for sheep and goats imported for the purpose of being slaughtered within such limits for the use of His Majesty's Forces

5 The Quarantine Station established under regulation 4 of these regulations shall form part of the Municipal Quarantine Station referred to in regulation 40 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, and such of the provisions of those regulations as relate to such Municipal Quarantine Station, other than regulations 42 and 43 of those regulations, shall apply in the case of the Quarantine Station so established.

6 The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, published in *Gazette* No 8,338 of December 17, 1937, are hereby amended as follows —

(1) in regulation 33 (as amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No 8,809 of November 7, 1941), by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (2) of that regulation, of the following new paragraph —

“(2A) Notwithstanding anything in the preceding provisions of this regulation, every sheep or goat imported from India and landed at the port of Colombo for the purpose of being slaughtered outside the administrative limits of the Municipal Council of Colombo for the use of His Majesty's Forces may, if that sheep or goat has not been landed under section 8 (3) of the Ordinance or the proviso to regulation 21, be removed direct to any Government Quarantine Station established for sheep and goats imported for such purpose”, and

(2) under the heading “F—Municipal Quarantine Station at Colombo”, by the insertion, immediately after regulation 43, of the following new regulations —

“43A The officer in charge of the Municipal Quarantine Station shall forthwith destroy or cause the destruction of any animal in the Station which develops rinderpest, and shall cremate or cause the cremation of its carcase

43B The officer in charge of the Municipal Quarantine Station may destroy or cause the destruction of any animal in the Station which develops any infectious or contagious disease other than rinderpest or which has been in contact with any animal suffering from rinderpest, if such destruction is in his opinion necessary to prevent or control the spread of disease”

THE TEA CONTROL ORDINANCE

Notification No 74

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands under section 42 of the Tea Control Ordinance (Chapter 299)

Regulations

1 These regulations may be cited as the Tea (New planting) Regulations, 1943

2 Any land which was not planted with tea on the thirty first day of March, 1938, or which does not form part of a registered estate or small holding may be planted with tea under the authority of a permit in that behalf granted by the Controller in accordance with the provisions of these regulations

3 A permit under regulation 2 may be granted by the Controller in respect of any land if, but only if, he is satisfied—

- that the land is to be planted with tea by a person who is a registered proprietor, or
- that it will be more economic to plant the land with tea than to use it for any other agricultural purpose

4 Every application for a permit shall be made in writing to the Controller and shall set out—

- the name and address of the applicant,
- the name (if any), situation and extent of the land proposed to be planted with tea,
- the nature of any existing plantations on such land,
- where the applicant is the registered proprietor of any estate or small holding, particulars of each estate or small holding of which he is the proprietor, and
- where the applicant is not the registered proprietor of any estate or small holding, all such information as may be necessary to enable the Controller to determine whether the application may be granted under paragraph (b) of regulation 3

5 (1) The question whether a permit shall be granted or refused, and the extent of the area of any land on which the planting of tea is to be authorised by a permit, shall be determined by the Controller in his discretion

Provided that the extent of such area shall in no case exceed fifty acres

(2) Every determination of the Controller under paragraph (1) shall be final and conclusive

6 Every permit shall specify the land on which tea may be planted under the authority of the permit and the extent of the area on which tea may be so planted on such land

7 Every permit shall be subject to the following conditions —

- The total extent of the area which may be planted with tea shall not exceed the extent of the approved area
- The permit holder shall not divert or cause the diversion of any labourer, from any work connected with the production of tea or rubber in which that labourer is already engaged, to any work connected with the planting of the approved area with tea
- The permit holder shall not, for the purpose of planting the approved area with tea, employ or cause to be employed any labourer recruited from outside Ceylon on or after the date on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*
In this paragraph, “labourer recruited from outside Ceylon” does not include any labourer who was employed in Ceylon before such date and returns to Ceylon on or after such date for the purpose of resuming his original employment or securing any other employment
- The permit holder shall cause every existing plantation on the approved area to be eradicated before such area is planted with tea
- The permit holder shall cause all such measures to be taken as the Controller may direct for the prevention of soil erosion in the approved area
- The permit holder shall allow and assist the Controller or any person authorised in writing by the Controller to enter and inspect the approved area
- The permit holder shall furnish to the Controller all such information relating to the planting of the approved area with tea as the Controller may require

8 A permit shall not be transferable

9 (1) Every permit shall be in such form as the Controller may determine and shall, unless cancelled under paragraph (3) of this regulation, be in force during such period as may be specified by the Controller in the permit

(2) A separate permit shall be issued in respect of each land, and where two or more blocks of one land are not contiguous, they shall be deemed to be separate lands for the purposes of these regulations

(3) A permit in respect of any land may be cancelled by the Controller if he is satisfied that any condition set out in regulation 7 has not been complied with in the case of that land

10 In the event of the death of the permit holder, or in the event of the legal incapacity of the permit holder by reason of insolvency, lunacy or otherwise, the person entering into possession or having control of the land to which the permit relates shall give written information to the Controller within one month of the occurrence of such event

11 In these regulations—

- “approved area” means the area on which the planting of tea is authorised by a permit,
“Controller”, “estate”, “proprietor”, “registered” and “small holding” have the same meaning as in the Tea Control Ordinance,
“permit” means a permit issued under regulation 2,
“permit holder” means the person to whom a permit has been issued

TRADE DISPUTE—GOWERAKELLE ESTATE, DEMODERA

IN pursuance of Section 8(4) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942, it is hereby notified that a petition presented by the Ceylon Indian Workers' Federation in connection with a trade dispute arising out of the notices to quit issued by the Superintendent, Gowerakelle Estate, Demodera on (1) K M Adaikalam, (2) V Periya Arumugam, (3) M Coomarasamy, and (4) R Varathan was referred in terms of section 6(2) of the aforesaid Order to a Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order.

The Tribunal has made an award dated November 10, 1943, in terms of an agreement arrived at between the parties which is as follows —

(1) 1st petitioner K M Adaikalam is to leave the estate by the 17th instant and live for 6 months outside the province of Uva and is not to return to Gowerakelle estate within that period save and except on written permission from the Deputy Controller of Labour, Badulla.

2 On the expiry of six months, he may intimate to the Deputy Controller his wish to be re employed on this estate and he is then to be re employed on his undertaking to make no interference with the estate superintendent's orders about the management of the estate, this undertaking to be without prejudice to his right to make representations on behalf of the union about grievances.

3 He must then be a regular worker on the estate. If for any reason he wishes to leave the estate and this involves absence on a working day, he must obtain permission from the Superintendent or his Agent for the time being. This permission is to be granted in all reasonable cases. If it is refused, he may appeal to the Deputy Controller whose ruling will be final.

4 In the event of any breach of the terms of the above undertaking, such breach shall be reported to the Deputy Controller, whose finding will be final. If the Deputy Controller finds that a breach has been committed by Adaikalam, he is to be summarily dismissed.

5 2nd petitioner Peria Arumugam is to leave the estate on or before November 17, 1943, any wages or pence money due to him are to be paid on or before November 17, 1943.

6 3rd petitioner M Coomarasamy is to be re employed from November 11, 1943, as weeding contractor. In the event of his obtaining within 2 months a gang of not less

than 20 labourers including his present gang, he is to be employed as supervising sub kangan. If there is any dispute about the suitability of any labourer whom he intends to engage, this is to be referred to the Deputy Controller whose finding shall be final. If a question arises about his efficiency to act as supervising kangan, this is to be referred to the Deputy Controller whose finding shall be final.

7 4th petitioner R Varathan is to be re employed from November 11, 1943, on his undertaking to be of good behaviour. If he infringes this undertaking, his case is to be reported to the Deputy Controller, whose finding shall be final.

8 A Kadiravelu, V Kadiravelu, K Letchuman, K Sinna Sinnan, S Suppiah are to apologise to the Superintendent at the evening muster on November 11, 1943, in the following words — "We are sincerely sorry that you misunderstood the manner in which we interceded for Coomarasamy as an act of indiscipline. We never intended to be rude to you. We humbly crave your pardon."

These five are also to make a voluntary contribution of Rs 5 each to war funds on or before the 10th December.
