THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTRATION ORDINANCE

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

*Order*

1 This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Hydroquinone and Metol) Order, 1943

2 All scheduled articles are hereby declared to be controlled articles within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

3 (1) Every person who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, has in his possession or under his control a stock of any notifiable quantity of any scheduled article, shall, within seven days from that date, furnish to the Controller a return setting out—

- (a) the name and address and the place of business (if there is a place of business) of that person,
- (b) the nature and quantity of such stock,
- (c) the purpose for which such stock is kept,
- (d) the situation of the premises in which such stock is kept or stored

(2) Every person who, after the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, imports any scheduled article, shall, within three days from the date on which he takes delivery of that article, furnish to the Controller a return setting out the particulars specified in the foregoing sub paragraph (1)

(3) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any scheduled article in his possession or under his control a separate return shall be furnished in respect of the stock kept in each such premises

4 (1) Except under the authority of a permit no person who is required by paragraph 3 to furnish a return shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use or use in the execution of any contract for work undertaken by him in the course of any trade or business any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises specified in such return

(2) Except under the authority of a permit no authorised dealer (not being a person required by paragraph 3 (1) to furnish a return) shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use or use in the execution of any contract for work undertaken by him in the course of any trade or business any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises at which he carries on business

(3) No permit under the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be required for the purpose of authorising the removal of any quantity of any scheduled article which is sold or otherwise disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this Order

5 (1) No importer of raw hydroquinone or raw metol shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of such hydroquinone or metol—

- (a) to any person other than an authorised dealer, or
- (b) to any authorised dealer unless that dealer is the holder of a general or special permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that importer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit

(2) No importer of any mixture or solution containing hydroquinone or metol or both hydroquinone and metol shall

sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of such mixture or solution otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

6 (1) No authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of raw hydroquinone or raw metol to any person unless that person is the holder of a general or special permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that dealer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit

(2) No authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any mixture or solution containing hydroquinone or metol or both hydroquinone and metol—

- (a) to any person other than an authorised retailer, or
- (b) to any authorised retailer, unless that retailer is the holder of a general or special permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that dealer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit

7 (1) No authorised retailer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of raw hydroquinone or raw metol in his possession or under his control on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, except in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

(2) No authorised retailer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any mixture or solution containing hydroquinone or metol or both hydroquinone and metol to any person, unless that person is the holder of a permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that retailer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit

8 Except under the authority of a permit, no person shall purchase or otherwise acquire any quantity of any scheduled article

9 No person not being an importer, an authorised dealer or an authorised retailer shall sell or supply any scheduled article to any other person

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be deemed to prohibit any person who has furnished a return under paragraph 3 (1) and who has not been appointed to be an authorised dealer or an authorised retailer from selling or otherwise disposing of the stock of any scheduled article specified in such return in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

10 Except with the general or special authority of the Controller previously obtained in that behalf, no person shall on or after such date as the Controller may appoint by notification published in the *Gazette*, use any quantity of any scheduled article to print or develop any photograph (other than a wedding photograph) of a group of more than two persons provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to the printing or developing of any photograph which has been taken on a film not exceeding 5½ inches by 3¼ inches in size

11 The Controller may in his discretion appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers and to be authorised retailers for the purposes of this Order

12 Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by notification published in the *Gazette*

13 (1) The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant therefor,
- (b) determine and specify in any permit the terms and conditions subject to which such permit is granted,
- (c) alter, add to or rescind any of the terms and conditions of any permit

(2) Every decision and determination of the Controller under the preceding sub paragraph shall be final

(3) Every person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall comply with the terms and conditions specified in such permit

14 No person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall—

- (a) transfer the permit to any other person, or
- (b) use the article obtained on such permit for any purpose other than the purpose specified in the application made in respect of that article

15 The Controller may cancel the appointment of any person as an authorised dealer or as an authorised retailer if the Controller is satisfied after such inquiry as he may deem necessary that such dealer or retailer has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Order

16 Every importer, every authorised dealer, every authorised retailer and every professional photographer shall—

- (a) keep and maintain in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose such records or registers relating to his stock of scheduled articles as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain, and

(b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish

17 Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate

18 The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any information furnished or any record maintained by any importer, authorised dealer, authorised retailer or professional photographer in pursuance of this Order or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—

(a) enter the premises at which such importer, dealer, retailer or photographer carries on business or keeps his stock of any scheduled article,

(b) inspect the stock of any such article kept on the premises, or

(c) inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kept by such importer, dealer, retailer or photographer (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of scheduled articles

19 The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller

20 In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—

“Controller” means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) appointed under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939,

“film” means any photographic film, photographic plate, or other sensitised article capable of being used for obtaining photographic negatives,

“importer” means any person who imports any scheduled article into Ceylon,

“notifiable quantity” in relation to any article specified in column I of the Schedule hereto means the quantity specified in the corresponding entry in column II of that Schedule,

“permit” means a permit issued by the Controller under this Order,

“professional photographer” means any person who carries on any trade or business as a photographer and includes any person who carries on any such trade or business together with any other trade or business,

“raw hydroquinone” means hydroquinone in the raw state,

“raw metal” means metal or elon in the raw state,

“scheduled article” means any article specified in column I of the Schedule hereto,

“wedding photograph” means any photograph taken on the occasion of any wedding

(iv) Where the film so used exceeds 8½ inches by 6½ inches in size but does not exceed 12 inches by 10 inches in size, the photographic paper used in the making of such photograph shall not exceed 12 inches by 10 inches in size

5 Where a film which does not exceed 5½ inches by 3½ inches in size is used on any occasion whatsoever for the purpose of taking a photograph of a group consisting of more than two persons, the photographic paper used in the making of such photograph shall not exceed the size of the film so used

6 Any powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller

#### Order

The Controlled Articles (Explosives) Order, published in *Gazette* No 8,967 of July 16, 1942, is hereby amended by the insertion, immediately after paragraph 6, of the following new paragraph—

6A (1) In lieu of the provisions of paragraphs 5 and 6, the provisions of this paragraph shall apply to the sale of gunpowder to, or the purchase of gunpowder by, any person authorised by a licence issued under the Firearms Ordinance to possess and use a muzzle loading gun. Every such person is hereinafter referred to as the “licensee”

(2) Upon the application of any licensee it shall be lawful for the proper authority or any officer appointed for the purpose by the proper authority, by endorsement on the licence to specify thereon the name of the dealer from whom, and the date from which, that licensee may obtain his supplies of gunpowder

(3) No licensee shall purchase or otherwise acquire any gunpowder from any person other than the dealer specified for the time being on the licence by endorsement made as aforesaid

(4) No licensee shall purchase or otherwise acquire on any one licence in any one month a quantity of gunpowder exceeding eight ounces in weight

(5) No person other than the dealer whose name is for the time being specified on a licence by endorsement made as aforesaid shall sell or supply any gunpowder to the holder of the licence

(6) Every dealer shall keep and maintain, in such form as the proper authority may determine, a register of all licensees who are entitled under the preceding provisions of this paragraph to obtain from him their supplies of gunpowder, and shall, upon the sale or supply of gunpowder to any such licensee, forthwith enter in such register full particulars of each transaction relating to such sale or supply.

4 The following provisions of this paragraph shall apply to the taking of photographs of groups consisting of more than two persons on the occasion of any wedding and to the making of such photographs—

(i) No person shall for the purpose of taking any such photographs use more than four films exceeding 5½ inches by 3½ inches in size without the special authority of the Controller,

## Order

1 This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Bicycles) Order, 1943

2 Bicycles are hereby declared to be controlled articles for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

3 (1) Every person (whether or not he carries on business as a seller or supplier of bicycles) who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette* has in his possession or under his control any new bicycle, and every person who carries on such business and on that date has in his possession or under his control any bicycle not in actual use, shall, before the expiry of a period of seven days from that date, transmit to the Controller a return in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order setting out—

- (a) the total number of such bicycles in his possession or under his control on that date and the description and size of every such bicycle, and
- (b) the situation of the premises at which such bicycles are kept and stored.

(2) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any bicycles in his possession or under his control, a separate return shall be made in respect of the stock kept in each such premises

(3) Except with the written permission of the Controller, no person who is required by sub paragraph (1) of this paragraph to furnish a return in respect of any bicycle shall remove that bicycle, from the premises in which it is kept on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, to any other place

4 No person who is required by paragraph 3 (1) to furnish a return shall, unless he has been appointed an authorised dealer, sell or dispose of any bicycle to any person otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

5 Every person who imports any bicycle of any description shall, within a period of three days after he obtains delivery thereof, transmit to the Controller a return specifying the description and size of the bicycle imported by him

6 No person who imports any bicycle of any description shall sell, use or dispose of that bicycle otherwise than in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

7 The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or distributing bicycles under this Order, and
- (b) cancel any such appointment at any time

8 No person, whether an authorised dealer or not, shall sell or dispose of any bicycle of any description to any other person, except under a permit authorising such other person to purchase or acquire such bicycle

9 No person shall purchase or acquire any bicycle of any description, except under a permit authorising that person to purchase or acquire such bicycle

10 (1) No authorised dealer shall sell or dispose of any bicycle of any description to any person except upon surrender by that person of a permit authorising him to purchase or acquire such bicycle from that dealer

(2) No authorised dealer shall appropriate to his own use any bicycle in his possession or under his control except under a permit authorising him to appropriate such bicycle to his own use

(3) No authorised dealer shall remove any bicycle kept in his premises to any other place except with the written permission of the Controller

11 (1) Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by notification published in the *Gazette*

(2) The Controller may in his discretion refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant, and the decision of the Controller shall be final

(3) A permit under this Order shall be valid only during such period as may be specified in the permit

12 No person to whom any permit has been granted under this Order shall transfer the permit to any other person

13 The Controller shall specify in every permit issued under this Order the name of the person from whom the bicycle to which the permit relates is to be purchased or obtained

14 (1) Every person to whom a permit has been granted under this Order shall, before taking delivery of the bicycle to which the permit relates—

- (a) affix his signature (or his thumb print, if he is unable to write) to the permit in the presence of the dealer or other person from whom the bicycle is purchased or obtained,
- (b) surrender the permit to that dealer or person, as the case may be, and
- (c) comply with such other conditions (including the surrender for salvage purposes of any unserviceable bicycle or bicycles in his possession or under his control) as the Controller may, in his discretion, impose

Provided that a person to whom a permit has been granted under this Order may, in writing, authorise a representative to sign the permit on his behalf and to surrender it to the dealer or person, as the case may be

(2) Every person other than an authorised dealer to whom a permit has been surrendered under the provisions of sub paragraph (1) of this paragraph shall, within three days of the surrender of such permit transmit the permit to the Controller

15 No person shall sell or supply or purchase or acquire any bicycle otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order

16 Every person to whom a permit authorising the purchase of a bicycle has been issued shall produce the bicycle in respect of which the permit was issued for inspection at any time before an officer specified by the Controller

17 Every authorised dealer shall—

- (a) maintain such records or registers relating to his business as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain,
- (b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to his business as the Controller may, from time to time, by notice require him to furnish, and
- (c) conform to such directions as the Controller may, in his discretion, issue for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Order

18 Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate

19 If any applicant for a permit under this Order makes any false statement in his application, then, without prejudice to the institution or maintenance of a prosecution for any offence thereby committed that application or any subsequent application by that person for a permit under this Order may be refused by the Controller

20 The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller

21 In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- “bicycle” does not include any bicycle which is mechanically propelled,
- “Controller” means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) appointed under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939,
- “new bicycle” means an unused bicycle,
- “permit” means a permit issued under this Order.

**THE WAGES BOARDS ORDINANCE, No 27 OF 1941**

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce under section 57 of the Wages Boards Ordinance, No 27 of 1941, approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section

*Regulations*

1 These regulations may be cited as the Wages Boards Regulations, 1943

2 (1) Deductions from the wages of a worker may be made by the employer, in accordance with section 2 of the Ordinance, in respect of—

(a) the price of any article of food supplied to the worker by the employer, being an article specified by the Controller by notification published in the *Gazette*, and such price being not in excess of the maximum price, if any, fixed for that article by order for the time being in force under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, and, where there is no such order relating to that article, being not in excess of the maximum price fixed by the Controller for that article by such notification,

(b) any contribution which the worker desires to make through the employer to any pension fund, provident fund, co operative society, or insurance scheme, being a fund, society, or scheme approved in writing by the Controller,

(c) the rent of any housing accommodation provided for the worker by the employer, the amount of such rent not in any case exceeding six per centum per annum of the capital expended by the employer on such accommodation,

(d) an amount approved in writing by the Controller as the charge for any amenities or services provided for the worker by the employer, being amenities or services of a class or description specified by the Controller by notification published in the *Gazette*,

(e) the price of any goods sold to the worker by the employer out of goods kept for sale at the place of employment of the worker, such place being a shop, co operative store, or other establishment, approved in writing by the Controller, and

(f) any fine imposed on the worker by the employer in respect of any act or omission, being an act or omission of a kind, class, or description determined in writing by the Controller and specified by the employer in a written notice kept exhibited conspicuously in the place of employment of the worker, so, however, that the aggregate of the deductions made in respect of such fines at any one time shall not exceed five per centum of the wages earned by the worker during the period in which such fines were imposed

(2) Every deduction authorised to be made under sub-paragraph (f) of paragraph (1) of this regulation shall be subject to the condition that the amount of such deduction shall be applied by the employer to such purposes beneficial to the worker as may be approved in writing by the Controller

3 The deduction of any sum constituting an advance of wages not already earned shall be made from the wages of a worker in equal instalments spread over a period of six months

4 The deductions authorised to be made from the wages of a worker at any time shall be made in the following order of priority —

- (1) Any deduction under sub paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of regulation 2
- (2) Any deduction under sub paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) of regulation 2
- (3) Any deduction under sub paragraph (c) of paragraph (1) of regulation 2
- (4) Any deduction under sub paragraph (d) of paragraph (1) of regulation 2
- (5) Any deduction under sub paragraph (e) of paragraph (1) of regulation 2
- (6) Any deduction in respect of any advance of wages not already earned
- (7) Any deduction under sub paragraph (f) of paragraph (1) of regulation 2

5 Each Deputy Controller of Labour, Assistant Controller of Labour, and Inspector of Labour, appointed under section 47 of the Ordinance, is hereby declared to be an officer who shall have and may exercise the power, under section 3 of the Ordinance, to require any employer in any trade to produce for inspection the record of wages kept by that employer

6 (1) Where there is any trade union, association, or other organisation of the employers or of the workers in respect of whom representative members are to be appointed to a Wages Board, the Controller shall, at some reasonable time before

such members are to be appointed, make a written request to such union, association, or organisation to furnish to him, on or before a date specified in the request, a list of the persons whom such union, association, or organisation desires to be appointed as such members. Any such list so furnished by any such union, association, or organisation may, if the Minister disapproves of any or all of the persons mentioned in that list, be referred back to that union, association, or organisation for the purpose of enabling that union, association, or organisation to name any person or persons to take the place of the person or persons disapproved by the Minister.

(2) The persons who are to be appointed as the representative members of a Wages Board shall be chosen by the Minister from among those suggested for appointment as such members in such list or lists, if any, as may have been furnished to the Controller under paragraph (1) of this regulation. Where there is no trade union, association, or other organisation of the employers or of the workers whom such members are to represent, or where there is no such list so furnished, such persons shall be chosen by the Minister from among those whom he considers fit to be appointed as such members.

7 (1) Every meeting of a Wages Board shall be summoned by the Controller by written notice sent by post to each member of the Board together with the agenda for the meeting.

(2) Not less than fourteen days' notice of every ordinary meeting of a Wages Board shall be given to each member of the Board.

(3) Notice of any motion to be moved at an ordinary meeting of a Wages Board shall, not less than seven days before that meeting, be given in writing to the Controller by the member proposing that motion, and the Controller shall include that motion in the agenda for that meeting and furnish every member of the Board with a copy of that motion before the date of that meeting.

(4) A special meeting of a Wages Board may be summoned by the Controller whenever he considers it desirable, and shall be summoned by him whenever a written requisition is presented to him signed by not less than two members of the Board and specifying the purpose for which the special meeting is to be summoned.

(5) Not less than seven days' notice of every special meeting of a Wages Board shall be given to each member of the Board.

(6) Minutes of all proceedings at every meeting of a Wages Board shall be entered in a book of minutes by the Secretary of the Board.

(7) Any meeting of a Wages Board may be adjourned from time to time by resolution of the Board or by the Chairman of the Board.

8 Every vacancy in the membership of a Wages Board caused by the death, resignation, or removal of any member shall be filled in the same manner as the appointment of that member was made.

9 Every Wages Board shall, where there is any trade union, association, or other organisation of the employers or workers in the trade for which that Board is established, consult such union, association, or organisation before making a decision as to any matter which that Board is empowered to decide under section 22, 23, 24, 25, or 26 of the Ordinance.

10 Where a Wages Board established for any trade desires to constitute a District Wages Committee for that trade in any area or district in Ceylon, such Board shall give the Executive Committee written information of—

- (a) such area or district,
- (b) the number of members of such Board who are to represent such Board on the District Wages Committee, and
- (c) the number of members of the District Wages Committee who are to represent the employers and the workers, respectively, in such area or district.

11 The members of a District Wages Committee who are to represent the employers or the workers, as the case may be, shall be appointed by the Minister.

12 Any person may be appointed to a District Wages Committee to represent the employers or the workers in the area or district for which such Committee is constituted by any Wages Board notwithstanding that such person is not an employer or worker in the trade for which that Board is established.

Provided, however, that every such person shall be approved by the trade union, association, or other organisation, if any, of the employers or of the workers, as the case may be, whom that person is to represent.

13 Every member of a District Wages Committee who is appointed under clause (a) or (b) of section 18 (2) of the Ordinance shall hold office for a period of two years from the date of appointment.

Provided, however, that any such member—

- (a) may at any time resign from the membership of such Committee or be removed therefrom by the Minister,
- (b) shall, if appointed to fill any vacancy caused by the death, resignation, or removal of any member, hold office during a period equal to the unexpired portion of the term of office of the member who has died, resigned, or been removed, and

(c) shall, after the expiry of the term of office, continue to hold office until a successor is appointed.

14 Every member of a District Wages Committee who is appointed under clause (a) or (b) of section 18 (2) of the Ordinance shall, if he is absent without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of such Committee, be deemed to have resigned from the membership of such Committee, and the resignation of such member shall be deemed to take effect on the date of the last of such meetings.

15 Any person ceasing to be a member of a District Wages Committee shall be eligible for re-appointment thereto.

16 Every vacancy in the membership of a District Wages Committee caused by the death, resignation, or removal of any member shall be filled in the same manner as the appointment of that member was made.

17 The quorum for any meeting of a District Wages Committee shall be not less than one third of the total number of members of such Committee.

Provided, however, that, where any meeting of a District Wages Committee is postponed for want of a quorum to any date and where on that date the number of members present is less than the quorum, the meeting of the members so present shall constitute a valid meeting of such Committee.

18 The Chairman of every meeting of a District Wages Committee shall be entitled to vote on any question brought before that meeting.

19 Where, in the attendance of members for the purpose of holding any meeting of a District Wages Committee, the number of members representing employers is greater or less than the number of members representing workers, the members representing employers or the members representing workers, whoever are in the majority, shall, before the meeting commences, choose from among themselves the member or members who shall refrain from voting at the meeting in order to ensure that the number of members representing employers who shall be entitled to vote at the meeting and the number of members representing workers who shall be so entitled shall be equal.

Provided, however, that where the member or members who shall refrain from voting at the meeting cannot be chosen by agreement, such member or members shall be chosen by lot to be drawn in the presence and under the directions of the Chairman of the meeting.

20 The report of a District Wages Committee upon any matter referred to such Committee by a Wages Board shall be furnished to such Board signed by the Chairman of the meeting of such Committee at which the consideration of that matter was concluded.

21 (1) Every permit granted under section 34 (1) of the Ordinance shall be subject to the following conditions—

- (a) The worker to whom the permit is granted shall be paid wages by his employer at the rate specified on the permit.
- (b) The permit shall, unless it is revoked under section 34 (3) of the Ordinance, be in force during the period specified on the permit.

(2) Every notice to an employer under section 34 (3) of the Ordinance shall be in Form I set out in the Schedule hereto and shall be sent to the employer by post by registered letter.

22 (1) Every register which an employer is required to keep under section 36 of the Ordinance shall be substantially in Form II set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Every employer shall, in addition to the particulars required by section 36 of the Ordinance, set out in the register or registers kept under that section the rate of wages paid to each worker employed by him, the gross wages earned by that worker, and the authorised deductions made from such gross wages.

23 The notice which every person engaged in any trade for which a Wages Board is established is required to exhibit under section 37 of the Ordinance shall—

- (a) be substantially in Form III set out in the Schedule hereto,
- (b) be in the Sinhalese, Tamil, and English languages,
- (c) set out, in addition to the latest decisions of such Board relating to that trade, the matters in respect of which deductions are authorised to be made from the wages of each worker employed in that trade by that person, and the amount of the maternity benefits payable to any such worker, and
- (d) be kept exhibited conspicuously in the place where that trade is carried on.

24 Every notice under section 41 (1) of the Ordinance shall be in Form IV set out in the Schedule hereto.

25 The Controller and each officer referred to in regulation 5 is hereby declared to be an officer who shall have and may exercise all the powers under section 50 (1) of the Ordinance.

26 The names of all the members of every Wages Board and of every District Wages Committee shall be published by the Minister in the *Gazette* and in one Sinhalese, one Tamil, and one English newspaper.

27 Every representative member or nominated member of a Wages Board who is not a Government employee shall be paid by the Controller out of funds voted by the State Council for the purpose—

- (a) a subsistence allowance of ten rupees for every day on which a meeting of such Board is attended by such member, and
- (b) a travelling allowance consisting of—
  - (i) an amount calculated at the rate of thirty five cents for each mile or outstanding part of a mile of the journey to and from the place of such meeting, if such member performs such journey by a private or hired conveyance, and
  - (ii) the amount paid by such member as fare, if such member performs such journey by the railway or by any omnibus, tram, or other public conveyance

28 The Controller, or any officer referred to in regulation 5 who is acting under the directions of the Controller, may, for the purpose of investigating the standards of living and conditions of work in any trade, enter any place in which that trade is carried on by any person, and ask for information

which may be necessary for such purpose, and that person shall permit the Controller or such officer to enter such place and shall furnish the information asked for

29 In these regulations—
