- 1 In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
"the Board" means the Sanitary Board of the Vavuniya District,
"officer" means the holder of any permanent office under the Board, employed on a monthly salary,
"servant" means any person employed by the Board on a daily wage
- 2 The gratuity payable by the Board to any officer or servant on the termination of his services, shall be computed, and awarded by a special resolution of the Board, in accordance with the rates, conditions, and provisions hereinafter set out
- 3 (1) No officer or servant shall in any circumstance whatsoever be deemed to have an absolute right to any gratuity upon the termination of his service under the Board
(2) Where it is established to the satisfaction of the Board that an officer or servant has been guilty of negligence irregularity or misconduct, the Board may by resolution—
(a) make a deduction from the amount of the gratuity otherwise payable under these rules, or
(b) altogether withhold the gratuity
- 4 (1) The gratuity awarded by the Board shall be subject in every case to the approval of the Governor
(2) In order to obtain such approval, the following shall in every case be forwarded, through the Commissioner of Local Government and the Auditor General, to the Additional Controller of Establishments, namely —
(a) the application for the gratuity,
(b) a statement showing the computation by which the amount is ascertained,
(c) a certificate from the Charman of the Board as to the applicant's period of service, age, and conduct, and the grounds of his retirement, and
(d) the terms of the special resolution passed by the Board
- 5 No gratuity shall be awarded to any officer under the age of 55 years, unless his service has been terminated upon the abolition of the office held by him, or unless two medical practitioners certify to the satisfaction of the Board that such officer is by reason of his ill health unfit for further service
- 6 For the purposes of these rules—
(1) the service of an officer shall be deemed to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the fixed establishment of the Board, but any temporary service as an officer, or any service as a servant of the Board which is immediately prior to and continuous with service on the permanent establishment may be reckoned as service,

(2) No service completed by any officer or servant before he attains his sixteenth year of age, shall in any circumstances be taken into account.

(3) all full pay leave and half the period of all half pay leave but no other leave or absence shall be reckoned as service

7 The gratuity awarded to any officer shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him in respect of the permanent office or offices held by him at the time of his retirement, if he has held such office or offices, or an office or offices to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached for a period of not less than three years next preceding the date of retirement, otherwise the gratuity shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent office or offices held by an officer during the three years next preceding the date of retirement

8 Any officer retiring after not less than 120 months' total service on account of age or under the provisions of the foregoing rule 5, may receive a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/12th of his final monthly salary or average of such salaries as in the foregoing rule prescribed for each month of service, fractions of a month being excluded for this purpose.

9 In the event of an officer, who has completed 120 months' total service, dying whilst in the service of the Board, it shall be competent to the Board, by resolution to grant to the widow, or if there is no widow, to the children of such officer, a gratuity not exceeding six months' salary of the officer at the rate drawn by him at the time of his death

10 Any servant who after 180 months' continuous service, is to the satisfaction of the Board certified by two medical practitioners to be unfit for further service, or proved to have attained 55 years of age, may be awarded a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/18th of a month's pay for each month's service, a month's pay being calculated on the basis of 26 days for a month and fractions of a month being excluded for this purpose

Provided that breaks in the continuity of service not exceeding six months during the whole period of service may be condoned by resolution of the Board

11 In the event of the death, whilst he is still in service, or on leave with or without pay, of any servant who at the time of his death would have been eligible for a gratuity under the provisions of the preceding rule, the gratuity, that would in the ordinary course have been paid to him had he retired, may be paid to his widow, or if there is no widow, to his children

12 If the services of any officer or servant are dispensed with on the certificate of two medical practitioners that he is unfit for further service by reason of any permanent injury or illness specially attributable to the nature of his duty, he may be granted by a resolution of the Board a gratuity calculated in the manner laid down in rule 8 or rule 10, as the case may be, or a special enhanced gratuity not exceeding Rs 750 in the case of an officer and Rs 250 in the case of a servant

Provided that the gratuity so calculated may be reduced by resolution of the Board, if the injury or illness was caused by contributory negligence on the part of such officer or servant or does not incapacitate him from earning a livelihood in other employment

13. When an officer or servant of the Board is killed on duty or dies as a direct result of injuries received while on duty, it shall be competent for the Board, with the sanction of the Governor, to award gratuities as follows—

(a) to the widow of the deceased, a sum not exceeding the equivalent of one year's pay at the substantive rate drawn by the deceased at the time of his death,

(b) where the deceased leaves young children, but no widow, a gratuity not exceeding Rs 10 to each child for every year by which his or her age at the time of the father's death shall be less than fifteen. Provided that in no case shall the total payment to the children exceed the amount that would have been payable to a widow under sub-paragraph (a) of this rule, and provided further that where, without this limitation the sum payable to the children would have exceeded the sum payable to the widow, the amount payable to each child shall be reduced in proportion to the reduction made in the total sum on that account

1 For the purposes of the assessment tax, the percentage or rate to be deducted from the annual value for the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep, shall be as follows —

- in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent,
- in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent,
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent, and
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent

2 (1) For the purpose of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

- to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and
- to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may, in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall, within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice

(3) For the purposes of this by law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed on a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person

3 No person shall obstruct any assessor or any person acting under the orders of an assessor, in the lawful discharge of his duties

4 In these by laws—

“building” includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure, whether used for human habitation or otherwise,
“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee,
“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Kottawa village area

6 The course of training will be—

(a) To receive training in Revenue and Expenditure Accounting generally which would qualify an officer to undertake the control of work connected with—

- (1) Revenue,
- (2) Engineering Accounts
- (3) Stores Accounts,
- (4) Transportation Accounts, and
- (5) Statistical work,

They must prove themselves competent to examine accounts at stations, trace irregularities, alter (when necessary) systems as approved by the Chief Accountant and undertake prosecutions

(b) To pass, with merit, an examination in station accounts

(c) To pass, with merit an examination in the Railway Departmental Instructions (Administrative) and in the Public Service Regulations, General Orders and Financial Regulations so far as they affect the Railway Department

(d) Generally to act, without extra remuneration, in any post or perform any duties in the accounting line which will give them experience and a sense of responsibility

This course of training may be reduced from 5 years to 3 years in the case of a Chartered or Incorporated Accountant

In filling vacancies in the Assistant Accountant's Grade consideration will be given to experience and knowledge of the particular work of the vacant post, an examination being held if necessary

7 The salary paid to a Probationary Assistant Accountant is Rs 2,592 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs 144 to Rs 3,312 If the candidate is an officer already in the service of the Ceylon Government, he will be transferred to the salary scale in accordance with Financial Regulation 847 The selected candidate will continue to be on probation until such time as he is appointed to a post in the Assistant Accountants Grade, Class IV of the Scheme for accountants and Audit Officers and during this period of probation he will be liable to be discontinued without notice or reverted to his former position in the service at any time if his progress is found to be unsatisfactory

8 Rent allowance will not be payable unless the officer holds an appointment under the Ceylon Government and was appointed before June 1, 1934

9 The grant of leave and other conditions of service will in the case of a new entrant to the public service be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934

10 A new entrant to the Public Service will before appointment be required to pass a medical examination
