Order under sections 21 and 30

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order

- (1) revoke, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Order published in Gazette No 8,642 of July 26, 1940, in so far as it relates to the number of members of the Kolonnawa Urban Council and to the number and limits of the electoral divisions of the town of Kolonnawa,
- (2) order under section 30 that subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Kolonnawa Urban Council shall consist of seven members and the town of Kolonnawa shall be divided into seven electoral divisions with the limits defined in the Schedule
