#### A. PROCLAMATION.

A. CALDECOTT.

WHEREAS it is expedient for administrative and revenue purposes to amalgamate the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Wellaboda pattu and the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Four Gravets of Matara in the Matara District of the Southern Province into one Divisional Revenue Officer's Division to be called and known as the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Wellaboda pattu and Four Gravets, Matara.

Now therefore, know Ye that I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare that—

- (1) the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Wellaboda pattu and the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Four Gravets of Matara shall be amalgamated and shall be called and known as the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Wellaboda pattu and Four Gravets, Matara;
- (2) the said reconstituted Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Wellaboda pattu and Four Gravets, Matara, shall consist of the Village Headmen's Divisions specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) the said Village Headmen's Divisions shall consist of the village or villages specified in the corresponding entry or entries in the second column of the Schedule; and
- (4) this Proclamation shall take effect on the First day of January, 1944.

THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No 61 OF 1939.

*Order under sections 21 and 30*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Order published in *Gazette* No 8,642 of July 26, 1940, in so far as it relates to the number of members of the Kolonnawa Urban Council and to the number and limits of the electoral divisions of the town of Kolonnawa,
- (2) order under section 30 that subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Kolonnawa Urban Council shall consist of seven members and the town of Kolonnawa shall be divided into seven electoral divisions with the limits defined in the Schedule hereto,
- (3) order under section 21 that, for the purposes of the general election of the members of the Kolonnawa Urban Council to be held next after the date hereof and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the Order set out in paragraph (2) shall be deemed to be operative on any day, prior to the day specified in paragraph (4), on which it may be necessary that that order should be so operative, and
- (4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) shall come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Kolonnawa Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof

*South* From the last mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Division No 1

*West* From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Division No 1 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division

*Electoral Division No 3—Salewatta*

1 This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Slates and Slate pencils) Order, 1943

2 Each of the articles specified for the time being in the Schedule hereto, (hereinafter referred to as a "scheduled article"), is hereby declared to be a controlled article within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations

3 (1) Every person who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, has in his possession or under his control a stock of any scheduled article shall, within seven days from that date, furnish to the Controller a return setting out—

- (a) the name and address and the place of business (if there is a place of business) of that person,
- (b) the nature and quantity of such stock,
- (c) the purposes for which such stock is kept, and
- (d) the situation of the premises in which such stock is kept or stored

(2) Every person who, after the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, imports any scheduled article shall, within three days from the date on which he takes delivery of that article, furnish to the Controller a return setting out the particulars specified in the foregoing sub paragraph (1)

(3) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any scheduled article in his possession or under his control a separate return shall be furnished in respect of the stock kept in each such premises

4 (1) Except under the authority of a permit issued by the Controller, no person who is required by paragraph 3 to furnish a return shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises specified in such return

(2) Except under the authority of a permit issued by the Controller, no authorised dealer (not being a person required by paragraph 3 (1) to furnish a return) shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control, or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises at which he carries on business

(3) No permit under the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be required for the purpose of authorising the removal of any quantity of any scheduled article which is sold or otherwise disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this Order

5 No person who is required by paragraph 3 to furnish a return and who has not been appointed to be an authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control except in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller

6 (1) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article to any person other than an authorised dealer

(2) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article to any authorised dealer unless that dealer is the holder of a general or special permit issued by the Controller authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that importer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit

7 No authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article—

- (a) to any person other than the manager or principal of a school, or

(b) to the manager or principal of a school unless that manager or principal is the holder of a permit issued by the Director authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that dealer

8 Every application under paragraph 7 by the manager or principal of a school for a permit shall be addressed to the Divisional Inspector of Schools of the area in which that school is situated

9 (1) The Controller may in his discretion appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or supplying any scheduled article

(2) The Controller may cancel the appointment of any person as an authorised dealer if the Controller is satisfied after such inquiry as he may deem necessary that such dealer has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Order

10 (1) The Controller or the Director may in his discretion—

- (a) refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant therefor,
- (b) determine and specify in any permit the terms and conditions subject to which such permit is granted,
- (c) alter, add to or rescind any of the terms and conditions of any permit

(2) Every decision or determination of the Controller or the Director under the preceding sub paragraph shall be final

(3) Every person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall comply with the terms and conditions specified in such permit

11 Every importer and every authorised dealer shall—

- (a) keep and maintain in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose such records or registers relating to his stock of scheduled articles as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain; and
- (b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish

12 Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate

13 The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any information furnished or any record maintained by any importer or authorised dealer in pursuance of this Order or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—

- (a) enter the premises at which such importer or dealer carries on business or keeps his stocks of any scheduled article,
- (b) inspect the stock of any scheduled article kept on the premises, or
- (c) inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kept by such importer or dealer (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of scheduled articles

14 (1) The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller

(2) The powers conferred on the Director by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any officer of the Department of Education authorised in that behalf by the Director

15 In this Order—

"Controller" means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) appointed under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939,

"Director" means the Director of Education,

"importer" means any person who imports any scheduled article into Ceylon,

"permit" means a permit issued under this Order

1 For the purposes of the assessment tax, the percentage or rate to be deducted from the annual value for the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep, shall be as follows

- in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent,
- in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent,
- in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent, and

(d) in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent

2 (1) For the purposes of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

(a) to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and

(b) to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice

(3) For the purposes of this by law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed on a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person

3 No person shall obstruct any assessor or any person acting under the orders of an assessor, in the lawful discharge of his duties

4 In these by laws—

“building” includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure, whether used for human habitation or otherwise,

The Regulations under section 20 of the Petrol (Control of Supplies) Ordinance, No 52 of 1939, published in *Gazette* No 8,790 of September 5, 1941, are hereby amended as follows —

(1) by the insertion, immediately after Regulation 2 thereof, of the following new Regulations —

“ 2A (1) The conductor of every omnibus shall each day enter in a record, in the Form A in the Schedule to these Regulations the particulars required to be set out therein relating to each journey performed by the omnibus on that day and the quantity of petrol poured into the tank of the omnibus on that day

(2) The driver of every motor cab shall each day enter in a record, in the Form B in the Schedule to these Regulations, the particulars required to be set out therein relating to each journey performed by the motor cab on that day and the quantity of petrol poured into the tank of the motor cab on that day

(3) The conductor of every omnibus and the driver of every motor cab shall deliver the records kept as hereinbefore provided to the owner of the omnibus or motor cab, and it shall be the duty of the owner to make such records available for inspection at any reasonable time if so required by any person authorised by the Controller for the purpose

(4) Every person who is the owner of any omnibus or omnibuses or of any motor cab or cabs shall furnish to the Controller, at such times and in respect

of such periods as may be specified by the Controller by notice published in the *Gazette*, a return containing the following particulars compiled from the records required by the preceding provisions of this Regulation to be entered by the conductor of each such omnibus or the driver of each such motor cab, as the case may be —

- (i) the mileage travelled by each such omnibus or motor cab during that period,
- (ii) the total mileage travelled by all such omnibuses or motor cabs during that period,
- (iii) the total quantity of petrol represented by the petrol permits received by the owner in respect of the month in which that period occurs,
- (iv) the total quantity of petrol actually obtained by the owner during that period

2B (1) Every person who is the owner of any lorry or lorries shall, in the case of each such lorry, furnish to the Group Organiser from whom petrol permits are obtained by the owner, a return in respect of each month specifying—

- (i) the total quantity of petrol represented by the petrol permits received by the owner during that month,
- (ii) the total quantity of petrol actually obtained by the owner during that month, and
- (iii) the journeys made by the lorry during that month, the purposes for which each such journey was made, the nature and quantity of the goods carried on such journey, and the quantity of petrol used for such journey

The return in respect of each month must be furnished prior to obtaining delivery of petrol permits for the succeeding month, or on or before the fifth day of the succeeding month, whichever is the earlier

(2) Every such owner who makes any application for additional petrol permits during the course of any month must furnish a similar return in respect of the period commencing on the first day of that month and ending on the date of the application, together with particulars of each journey for which extra petrol is required and the purposes for which such journey is to be made

2C In regulations 2A and 2B, “owner” means the person for the time being approved as a consumer of petrol in respect of any omnibus, motor cab or lorry, as the case may be”, and

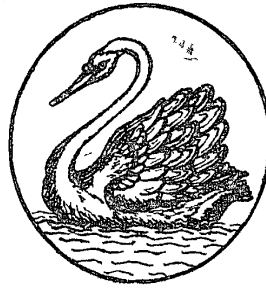

75 poles at the 2nd milepost on the Negombo Mingama road

75 poles at the Primary Sub station, Katuwapitiya road, Negombo

25 poles at the 3rd milepost on the Negombo Minuwangoda road

The poles should be not less than 32 ft long, 6 in diameter (barked) at top and 10 in diameter (barked) at a point 5 ft from the butt in the case of Halmilla, Teak or Hora supports, and 8 in diameter (barked) at top and 10 in diameter (barked) at a point 5 ft from the butt in the case of Palmyrah poles. All poles should be barked at the site of delivery, be free from knots and other imperfections and straight enough to be used as transmission line supports. Every pole will be inspected by an officer of the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings who will mark those he considers up to specification. Other poles will be rejected, and the decision of the inspecting officer shall be final.

Preference will be given to tenderers offering to supply the full number of poles required, but quotations may be considered for the supply of the number of poles required at any one of the three points. Similarly, while it is preferred that each tenderer should offer to supply any one variety of poles, offers for mixed varieties in lots of not less than 25 poles of each kind may be considered.

Tenders should be accompanied by a deposit of Rs 50 which will be refunded when the contract is awarded. The successful tenderer shall be required to deposit with the Chief Engineer and Manager, Department of Government Electrical Undertakings a sum equivalent to 5 per cent of the total value of his tender against the successful completion of his contract.

Early delivery of the poles is of the utmost importance, and tenderers should state the earliest date on which the first lot of not less than 50 poles can be delivered and subsequent dates on which the balance would be made available.

Tenderers should state in their tenders whether they have at their disposal motor vehicles and petrol allotments sufficient to carry out the contract, if not what permits they would require for (a) vehicles and (b) petrol, if the contract is awarded to them.
