THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)  
REGULATIONS, 1939

AND

## THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (CUSTODIAN) ORDER, 1940

WHEREAS the immovable property more fully described in the Schedule hereto belongs to Sinnathamby Visuvalingam

And whereas the said Sinnathamby Visuvalingam is now believed to be residing in Kuala Lumpur, and is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, read with the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations

AND whereas it is expedient that a Vesting Order should be made in respect of the said property and such powers in regard thereto as are hereinafter contained should be conferred upon the Custodian of Enemy Property

NOW, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations, and the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order—

- (1) that all the right, title and interest of the said Sinnathamby Visuvalingam to and in the immovable property specified in the Schedule hereto do vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property, and
- (2) that the said Custodian do have all such powers as may be necessary for the purposes of the control and the management of the said property, including the power to employ such agents as he may consider necessary for such purposes

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)  
REGULATIONS, 1939

WHEREAS Nagalingam Kanagasabai is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, by reason of his residence in the Federated Malay States now enemy territory within the meaning of the said Regulations

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Nagalingam Kanagasabai became an enemy as aforesaid, the said Nagalingam Kanagasabai duly appointed Nagalingam Nadarajah his attorney in Ceylon by a Power of Attorney executed in Ceylon on the 7th day of July, 1934, attested by Ponnusamy Canapathypillay, Notary Public of Vaddukoddai, Jaffna

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with, or for the benefit of, the said Nagalingam Kanagasabai is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations, unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to Nagalingam Nadarajah and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided

Now therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the said Nagalingam Nadarajah to have such commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings (other than transactions for or relating to the sale of immovable property belonging to the said Nagalingam Kanagasabai) with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Nagalingam Kanagasabai as he could have had under the aforesaid Power of Attorney prior to the date on which

the said Nagalingam Kanagasabai became an enemy as aforesaid, and I do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings (other than transactions for or relating to the purchase of such property) with the said Nagalingam Kanagasabai through the said Nagalingam Nadarajah.

THE CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Co-operative Societies Ordinance (Chapter 107), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this special order confer on Mr. R. C. S. Cooke, an officer appointed to assist the Registrar of Co-operative Societies with effect from November 15, 1943, the following powers of the Registrar under that Ordinance:—

- (1) power to register societies and the addresses of societies under sections 5, 6, 7 and 15;
- (2) power to register amendments of the by-laws of registered societies, under section 8;
- (3) power to sanction under section 34 (2), contributions by registered societies, out of nett profits, to a charitable purpose or a common-good fund;
- (4) power under sections 35 and 36 to inspect and dissolve registered societies; and
- (5) power under section 45 to deal with disputes referred for decision.

THE ADOPTION OF CHILDREN ORDINANCE,  
No. 24 of 1941.

REGULATIONS made by the Executive Committee of Home Affairs under section 27 of the Adoption of Children Ordinance, No. 24 of 1941.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Custody of Children Regulations, 1941.
2. The notice to be given by a person under section 18 (1) of the Ordinance shall be in Form 1 in the Schedule hereto.
3. The certificate of registration to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent under section 18 (2) of the Ordinance shall be in Form 2 in the Schedule hereto.
4. Every application under section 19 (2) of the Ordinance for registration as the custodian of a child shall be substantially in Form 3 in the Schedule hereto.
5. The certificate of registration as the custodian of a child to be issued by an authorised officer under section 19 (3) of the Ordinance shall be in Form 4 in the Schedule hereto.
6. The amount which a person registered as the custodian of a protected person is required to deposit under section 21 (b) of the Ordinance, shall be determined in accordance with the scales set out hereunder:—

If the protected person—	Rs. c.
(a) is not under 12 years of age, but under 14 years of age	1 50
(b) is not under 14 years of age, but under 16 years of age	2 0
(c) is not under 16 years of age, but under 18 years of age	2 50

7. The register of protected persons to be maintained under section 25 of the Ordinance, shall be in Form 5 in the Schedule hereto; the Assistant Government Agent shall maintain an index to such register.

8. (1) Where a person who is registered as the custodian of a protected person changes his place of residence, he shall deliver to an authorised officer, for transmission to the Assistant Government Agent of the district in which the new place of residence is situate, a written notice specifying—

- (a) his new address;
- (b) the No. of his certificate of registration; and
- (c) the address at which he previously resided.

(2) In any case where the person who is registered as the custodian of a protected person changes his place of residence from one district to another, the Assistant Government Agent of such other district shall, upon receipt of the notice of such change—

- (a) cause all particulars relating to such custodian and to such protected person to be entered in the register maintained by him under section 25 of the Ordinance; and

(b) take such steps as may be necessary to secure the cancellation of the entry made in respect of that case in the register maintained for the district in which the custodian previously resided.

9. In any case where a protected person ceases to be in the custody of the person registered as his custodian, it shall be the duty of such custodian to deliver to an authorised officer, for transmission to the Assistant Government Agent of the district in which the custodian resides, a written notice setting out the reasons for such cessation; and the Assistant Government Agent shall thereupon cancel the entry made in respect of that case in the register maintained for the district under section 25 of the Ordinance.

10. Every person who—

- (a) at the request of the parent or guardian of a child has temporary custody of the child for a period not exceeding three months for any purpose other than that of employment; or
- (b) has the custody of the child placed in his charge by the parent or guardian of the child for the purpose of attending school,

is hereby exempted from the provisions of Part II of the Ordinance.

11. (1) In these regulations—

“the Ordinance” means the Adoption of Children Ordinance, No. 24 of 1941;

“registered” means registered under the Ordinance.

(2) Justices of the Peace and Divisional Revenue Officers are hereby declared to be “authorised officers” for the purposes of the Ordinance and of these regulations.

In such a case, if the Council considers that the special circumstances of the case justify the grant of a retiring allowance, the officer so called upon to retire, may, with the approval of the Governor, be given such retiring allowance as the Council thinks just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which his length of service would qualify him ”,

(3) by the addition, immediately after by law 16, of the following new by law —

“ 17 (1) The Council may, with the approval of the Governor, pay a gratuity in accordance with the provisions of this by law to the widow or to the children or to the dependants of any officer or servant who dies in the service of the Council after he has completed five years' public service as defined in by law 13 (2) and while he is in receipt of a salary of not less than Rs 360 per annum

(2) (a) In the case of any officer or servant referred to in paragraph (1) who was holding a post on the fixed establishment of the Council at the time of his death, the gratuity payable under this by law shall be a sum equal to twelve times the monthly salary drawn by him in respect of that post at that time

(b) In the case of any officer or servant referred to in paragraph (1) who was not on the fixed establishment of the Council at the time of his death, the gratuity payable under this by law shall be a sum equal to three times the monthly salary of the post held by him at that time, and an additional sum equal to such monthly salary for each minor child surviving him. Provided, however, that such additional sum shall not be payable in respect of more than six such minor children in any one case

(c) In the case of any officer or servant referred to in paragraph (1) who was holding a post on the fixed establishment of the Council at that time of his death but was in receipt of a salary of less than Rs 360 per annum, the gratuity payable under this by law shall be a sum equal to three times the monthly salary drawn by him in respect of that post at that time, and an additional sum equal to such monthly salary for each minor child surviving him. Provided, however, that such additional sum shall not be payable in respect of more than six such minor children in any one case

(3) The gratuity shall be payable—

(a) where the widow of the deceased officer or servant survives him, to such widow, whether or not there is any child of such widow surviving him, or

(b) where the widow, whether with or without children, and also children by a previous marriage of the deceased officer or servant, survive him, to the widow and to the children of such previous marriage in such manner and in such proportion as the Council may determine, or

(c) where there is no widow surviving, to the children of the deceased officer or servant in such manner and in such proportion as the Council may determine, or

(d) where there is no widow or child of the deceased officer or servant surviving him, to the dependants who were living with and maintained by him at the time of his death

(4) Where any child, to whom the amount of any gratuity or share of a gratuity is payable under this by law, is a minor, such amount may be paid to some person approved by the Council, for the use and benefit of such child."
