## Order under sections 21 and 30

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No 61 of 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order

- (1) revoke, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Order relating to the number of members of the Weligama Urban Council and to the number and himits of the electoral divisions of the town of Welgama, published in Gazette No 7,933 of July 1, 1932, as last amended by order published in Gazette No 8,356 of February 25, 1938,


