THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF EXPORTS) REGULATIONS.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 3 of the Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order amend the Schedule to those Regulations (as last amended by the Order published in *Gazette* No. 8,822 of December 5, 1941), by the addition of the following new item to that Schedule :—

“ 14. Empty gunny bags, and gunny cloth of any description.”

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. Nothing in any provision of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, requiring or relating to the registration or licensing of motor cars or to the carriage of identification plates on motor cars shall apply in the case of any War Department motor car.

2. The Officer Commanding the Troops, Ceylon, or any officer acting under his authority may issue to any person a permit authorising that person to drive War Department motor cars; and any permit so issued shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be deemed to be a certificate of competence issued under the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938.

Provided, however, that no person shall, by reason only that he is the holder of any such permit, be entitled to drive any motor car other than a War Department motor car.

3. In these regulations—

“certificate of competence” and “motor car” have, respectively, the same meaning as in the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938;

“War Department motor car” means any motor car belonging to His Majesty which carries an identification plate bearing a distinctive number assigned to that motor car by or under the authority of the Officer Commanding the Troops, Ceylon.

4. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence (War Department Motor Cars) Regulations.

The Minimum Wages (Indian Labour) Ordinance, Chapter 114.

Estate Wages Board, Puttalam and Chilaw.

NOTICE is hereby given in accordance with the provisions of section 8 (1) of the Minimum Wages (Indian Labour) Ordinance, Chapter 114, that the Estate Wages Board for the Revenue District of Puttalam and Chilaw intends at about 10 A.M. on February 7, 1942, at the Puttalam Kachechi to proceed in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 8 (3) of the said Ordinance to vary the minimum rates of wages already fixed for all estates within its jurisdiction. Any interested person who wishes to be heard should inform the Chairman of his intention to be present, or make his representations to him in writing.
