THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) Acts, 1939 and 1940.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulation.

- (1) This Regulation may be cited as the Defence (Subsidiary Currency Notes) Regulation, 1942.
- (2) In the application of the provisions of the Currency Ordinance, No. 21 of 1941, to currency notes of any denomination below one rupee proposed to be issued, or issued, by the Board of Commissioners of Currency under that Ordinance in order to meet the emergency arising out of the shortage of coins in circulation in Ceylon—
 - (a) section 12 of that Ordinance shall have effect as though there were substituted, for the words "the Secretary of State.", the words "the Governor.";

 (b) section 8 (1) of that Ordinance shall have effect as though there were substituted, for the words "payment of any amount.", the words "payment of an amount not exceeding five rupees.";

and, for the purpose of the application of such of the provisions of that Ordinance and of the regulations made thereunder as relate to the Currency Security Fund, every such currency note of a denomination below one rupee shall be deemed to be a coin of a corresponding denomination.

RICE.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulier, Controller of Prices, do by this Order—

(i.) rescind with effect from this date my order dated January 24, 1942, published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 8,852 of January 24, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of rice of the description and grade specified as Rangoon Raw A 1 in column 1 of the Schedule thereto;

- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum c.i.f. price per bag, the maximum wholesale price per bag at the "Granaries", the maximum wholesale price per bushel at the "Granaries" and within the Colombo Municipal area the maximum wholesale price per bushel outside the "Granaries" and within the Colombo Municipal area, the maximum retail price per bag within the Colombo Municipal area, the maximum retail price per bushel within the Colombo Municipal area and the maximum retail price per measure within the Colombo Municipal area above which rice of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold, provided that for any retail sale within the "Granaries" the maximum price per bag or bushel shall not exceed the maximum wholesale price at the "Granaries" per bag or per bushel (as the case may be) fixed by this Order; and
- (iii.) direct that paragraphs (iii.) to (viii.) of the said order published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 8,852 of January 24, 1942, shall apply in the case of any rice of any description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto as though those paragraphs were incorporated in this Order.
