THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

Order.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by regulation 2 (2) of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, with the prior approval of the Secretary of State, by this Order vary the Order under the aforesaid regulation published in *Gazette* No. 8,798 of October 3, 1941, as last amended by the Order published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,847 of January 15, 1942, by inserting in the Schedule to that Order the names and addresses specified in the Schedule hereto.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulation.

The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by any other defence regulation, are hereby further amended, by the addition immediately after regulation 27c, of the following new regulation:—

Looting and kindred offences.

“ 27D. (1) If, in an area which has been subjected to attack by the enemy, whether by means of aircraft or otherwise, or in any area to which this regulation has been applied by Order of the Governor, any person—

- (a) steals any article from premises which have been damaged by war operations or vacated by reason of attack by the enemy or in consequence of any authorised directions given for the purpose of meeting or hindering any actual or apprehended attack by the enemy or of protecting persons and property from the dangers involved in any such attack; or
- (b) steals any article which has been left exposed or unprotected as a consequence of war operations; or
- (c) enters any premises, damages any property, assaults any person, or is found with any offensive weapon or housebreaking instrument, with intent to commit any offence punishable by penal servitude.

he shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation, and shall, on conviction thereof before the Supreme Court, be liable to suffer death or penal servitude for life, or, on conviction thereof after summary trial before a Magistrate, be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months.

(2) The Governor may, by Order direct that this regulation shall apply to any area in which, in his opinion, there is, or is likely to be, special difficulty in preserving public order by reason of any measures taken for the purpose of meeting or hindering any actual or apprehended attack by the enemy.

(3) In this regulation the expression "authorised directions" means any Order or directions made or given in the exercise of powers conferred by these regulations or made or given by any officer of His Majesty's forces.

(4) A person sentenced to death after conviction by the Supreme Court of an offence against this regulation shall be dealt with in like manner as persons convicted on indictment of murder".

NOTICE.

UNDER Regulation 2 of the Defence (Air Raid, Precautions Service) Regulations, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to constitute an Air Raid Precautions Service for the area consisting of all that portion of the Revenue District of Jaffna lying to the north of the P. W. D. bridge at Elephant Pass and to the north and west of the Jaffna Lagoon, to wit: the Jaffna Peninsula and the Islands of Karaitivu, Mandaitivu, Eluvaitivu, Analaitivu, Nainativu, Pungudutivu and Delft and to appoint Mr A. J. R. Vethavanam as Controller thereof.

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of regulations 3 and 14A of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (a) specify the area described in the Schedule hereto to be an area in relation to which the restriction of photography appears to me to be expedient in the interests of the defence of the Island;

- (b) appoint the Aerodrome Officer, Colombo Airport, to be a competent authority for the purposes of the grant of permits under paragraph (1) of the aforesaid regulation 14A in respect of the area described in the Schedule hereto.

- The whole of the area surrounding Protected Place No. 9 (Colombo Airport) which lies within a radius of 500 yards of the boundaries of that Protected place, as defined in Schedule A to the Order made under regulation 25 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations and published in *Gazette* No. 8,836 of December 23, 1941.

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

Order under Regulation 35a.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by Regulation 35A of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order direct that, subject as hereinafter provided, no person shall enter into or upon or pass along any of the highways described in the Schedule hereto:

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this Order shall not apply in the case of—

- (a) any member of any of His Majesty's forces or of any forces of any foreign power allied with His Majesty, if such member is in uniform;
- (b) any person employed at the Colombo Airport;
- (c) any member of the Aero Club of Ceylon;
- (d) any person who resides upon any land adjacent to any of the said highways;
- (e) any other person who enters into or upon any such highway after satisfying the Senior Military Officer for the time being in charge of the guard placed thereat as to his *bona fides*.

1. The road leading from the Galle road to the administrative buildings of the Colombo Airport.
2. That part of the road from Ratmalana to Attidiya, which lies alongside the northern boundary of the Colombo Airport.
