THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

Order under Regulation 2.

I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, in the exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 2 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, do hereby declare that the services specified or described in the Schedule to this order are of public utility, essential for the prosecution of the war and essential to the life of the community.

Schedule.

All service, work or labour of any description whatsoever, rendered or performed by officers or servants in the employment of the Government of Ceylon, in their capacity as such officers or servants, whether the remuneration for such service, work or labour is computed or paid on a daily, weekly or monthly basis, or otherwise.

Note—The purpose of this Order declaring the services performed by Government officers and servants to be “essential services” is to secure that persons who prevent or interfere with the performance by Government officers and servants of their official duties, or who endeavour to cause disaffection among Government officers and servants, should be liable to prosecution for acting in contravention of Regulations 17 and 19, respectively, of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.
