**THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF IMPORTS) REGULATIONS.**

*Order under Regulation 4.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 4 of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order direct that no currency note issued by the Javasche Bank shall be imported into Ceylon except under the authority of a permit granted by or on behalf of the Controller of Imports.

**THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.**

DEFENCE Regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

*Regulation.*

The Defence (Finance) Regulations, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,509 of September 19, 1939, as amended by any subsequent regulation, are hereby further amended, in regulation 5A of those Regulations, as follows:—

(1) by the addition, at the end of paragraph (2A) of that regulation, of the following:—

“ Any

direction  
given under this paragraph may be either  
and may be revoked or varied by a subsequent  
”;

(2) by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (2A) of that regulation, of the following new paragraphs:—

“(2B) Where at any time the following conditions are fulfilled in the case of any individual, namely, that he is in a scheduled territory and that either—

- (a) he was on the nineteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-nine, a British subject resident in Ceylon and has not since that day been in Ceylon; or
- (b) he is, by virtue of a direction given by the Governor under paragraph (3) of this regulation, to be treated for the purposes of this regulation as resident in a scheduled territory—

the Controller may give a direction to any bank that, until the direction is revoked, any sum from time to time standing to the credit of an account of that individual at any office or branch of that bank in Ceylon specified in the direction shall not be dealt with except with permission granted by the Controller.

Any direction given under this paragraph may be revoked by a subsequent direction thereunder.

(2c) Where permission is granted under this regulation for the making of any payment to any person to whom either of the last two paragraphs applies, subject to the condition that the payment is made to an account of that person specified by the Controller, the sum paid shall be credited to that account by the bank with whom the account is kept, and the crediting of that sum shall, to the extent thereof, be a good discharge to the person making the payment.”

(3) by the substitution, in paragraph (3) thereof, for the word “resided”, of the word “been”;

(4) by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (3) of that regulation, of the following new paragraph:—

“(3A) For the purposes of this regulation and of any Order providing for exemptions from any of the provisions thereof, a personal representative of a deceased person shall, until the Governor otherwise directs, be treated as being resident in the territory where the deceased person was resident (for the purposes aforesaid) at the time of his death, so far as relates to any actions in which the personal representative is concerned solely

in his capacity as such, and any direction given under this paragraph may be either general or special and may be revoked or varied by a subsequent direction thereunder.

In this paragraph, "personal representative", in relation to a deceased person, includes the executor of the last will, or the administrator of the estate, of the deceased person;" and

(5) by the substitution, in paragraph (1) thereof, for the words "paragraph (3) does not apply", of the words "neither of the last two foregoing paragraphs applies".

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

Order under Regulation 43.

ORDER made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Regulation 43 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

1. This Order may be cited as the Lighting Restriction (Motor Cars) Order, 1942, and shall be in force throughout Ceylon.  
2. The head-lights of a motor car, other than a motor car which is for the time being used for the purposes of His Majesty's forces, shall either—

- (a) each be shaded or obscured in the manner set out in Schedule A to this Order, or
  - (b) each be fitted with a mask in accordance with the specification set out in Schedule B to this Order.
3. (1) Where the head-lights which are carried—  
(a) by a fire engine or ambulance, or  
(b) by any motor car which is used by any person for the time being specified by name, office or designation by writing under the hand of the Minister or of any officer acting under his authority,

are fitted with masks in accordance with the specification set out in Schedule B to this Order, the outer surface of such masks shall be painted red and one of such masks may be fitted with a special distinctive recognition device of a type specially or generally approved by the Minister for the purpose.

(2) No vehicle other than a vehicle referred to in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph shall carry any head-light fitted with a mask the outer surface of which is painted red.

4. Every head-light of a motor car which is for the time being used for the purposes of His Majesty's forces must be shaded or obscured in such manner and be fitted with such distinctive device as may be specially or generally approved by the Minister for the purpose.

5. (1) No electric bulb of greater power than seven watts shall be fitted, carried or used in any side-lamp of any motor car.

(2) The outer face of every side-light of a motor car shall be completely covered with cloth of a dark blue colour.

6. No spot-light, fog-lamp, reversing light, stop-light or interior light shall be used in or upon, or displayed from, any motor car; and no such light or lamp shall be equipped with a bulb.

7. The tail-light of every motor car shall be completely covered with cloth of a dark blue cover.

8. Every direction indicator of every motor car shall—

- (a) be completely obscured except for an area two-and-a-half inches long and a quarter of an inch broad on either side of such indicator; or
- (b) be effectively sealed or otherwise secured to the body of the motor car in such a manner as to prevent the display or use of such indicator, whether lit or unlit, in any manner whatsoever.

9. (1) The preceding provisions of this Order shall be complied with by the owner and the driver of every motor car at all times between the hours of sunset and sunrise, whether such car is stationary or in motion on any highway or in any part, recreation ground, garden or open space of any kind.

(2) Where any light is lit or displayed in contravention of the provisions of this Order, it shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any authorised person to extinguish such light and for such purpose to enter any premises, and to stop and enter any motor car, or to take such other action as he may deem necessary.

For the purposes of this sub-paragraph, "authorised person" means a person authorised by the Governor, by notification published in the *Gazette*, to exercise the powers conferred by this sub-paragraph.

10. This Order shall be read and construed as one with the Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, published in *Gazette* No. 3,628 of June 23, 1940:

Provided, however, that nothing in the preceding provisions of this Order shall be deemed to authorise any light in or on any motor car to be lit or displayed in any area in which a total blackout is in force under the Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, except in accordance with the provisions of that Order.

Schedule A.

Manner of shading or obscuration.

1. The outer face of the head-light shall be completely covered with cloth of a dark blue colour; and such cloth cover shall contain a circular area not less than three inches in diameter consisting of a double fold of such cloth so placed as effectively to obscure the filament of the bulb or the flame within the head-light.

2. The entire surface of the reflector of the head-light shall be effectively obscured by means of dull non-reflecting black paper, or in the case of a head-light other than an electric head-light, be effectively obscured by means of black paint.

Schedule B.

Specification of Mask.

The mask must be a flat metal disc carrying a small glass screened slot off-set above the axes of the bulb and reflector, and masked off

by a semi-circular cowl attached to the disc. Suitable mounting clips must be provided on the rear face of the disc to enable the assembly to be fitted within the original head-light rim, replacing the usual lens.

The flat disc must be cut from metal and be finished to the size of the head-light glass. The centre of the disc must be marked to correspond with the axes of the bulb and reflector and  $\frac{1}{8}$ " above this point a slot  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " long  $\times \frac{1}{8}$ " wide must be cut and so positioned that the lower edge of the slot is  $\frac{1}{8}$ " above the centre line of the disc. Behind the slot a slip of glass must be inset and held in place by a small pressed metal frame riveted to the disc. A semi-circular cowl blanked off in front must be provided for the purpose of screening observation from any overhead position and also to afford horizontal cut-off of the light beam as much as possible.

The cowl must be pressed out of metal and be provided with a flange about  $\frac{1}{8}$ " wide along the semi-circular edge to enable this part to be riveted to the disc.

The sides of the cowl must extend down to a point  $\frac{1}{8}$ " below the centre line of the disc in order to reduce to a minimum diffusion of the light beam in a lateral direction. The leading edge of the cowl must be blanked off with a semi-circular cap welded in position and extending to a point  $\frac{1}{8}$ " below the lower edge of the glass screened slot in the disc. The depth of the cowl from the face of the disc to the front edge must be approximately  $2\frac{1}{4}$ ".

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by regulation 43 of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

The Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, published in *Gazette* No. 3,628 of June 23, 1940, as amended by any subsequent Order, is hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) in paragraph 13, by the substitution, for sub-paragraphs (d), (e) and (f) of the proviso to that paragraph, of the following sub-paragraphs:—

"(d) any electric torch light carried by a pedestrian, if the face of the torch is painted with dark blue paint or covered with paper or cloth of a dark blue colour;

(e) lights carried by motor cars in accordance with the provisions of the Lighting Restriction (Motor Cars) Order, 1942;

(f) lights carried by vehicles (other than motor cars) in accordance with the provisions hereinafter set out;

(g) lights (other than lights carried by vehicles) which are exempted or approved for any purpose by the senior naval, military or air force or police authority in that area or are required or used by any such authority for the purposes of any operations connected with the maintenance of public safety or the defence of the Island;"

(2) in paragraph 14, by the substitution, for the word "directions", of the words "directions; and where such outdoor light is an electric torch-light, the torch shall, whenever lit, be so carried that the light therefrom is directed downwards;"

(3) by the omission of paragraphs 16 and 17 and of the sub-heading "Lights on Vehicles" above paragraph 16, and by the insertion, immediately after paragraph 15, of the following:—

"Provisions relating to vehicles other than motor cars.

16. (1) No electric bulb of greater power than seven watts shall be fitted, carried or used in any lamp on any bicycle.

(2) The outer face of every electric lamp on a bicycle shall be completely covered with cloth of a dark blue colour.

17. Every face of every lamp on a cart or jinricksha, and of every lamp (other than an electric lamp) on a bicycle, shall be completely covered with cloth of a dark blue colour or painted with dark blue paint.

17A. (1) The outer surface of the yoke or cross-piece and the rear surface of the platform or floor-board of every cart shall be painted or covered with white paint or some other white substance.

(2) The outer surface of the back of every jinricksha shall be painted or covered with white paint or some other white substance in such manner as to ensure that an area white in colour and not less than one foot in depth is visible from the rear when the hood of the jinricksha is down.

(3) The outer surface of the rear half of the rear mud-guard of every bicycle shall be painted or covered with white paint or some other white substance;"

(4) in paragraph 18, by the omission of the Proviso to that paragraph and the substitution thereof of the following:—  
"Provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to—

- (a) lights carried by any vehicle used for the purposes of His Majesty's forces, or by any person for the time being specified by name, office or designation by writing under the hand of the Minister or of any officer acting under his authority and lights carried by fire-engines and ambulances, if such lights are shaded or obscured in such manner, and are fitted with such distinctive devices, as may be specially or generally approved by the Minister for that purpose;

(other than lights carried by vehicles) which exempted or approved for any purpose by the senior naval, military or air force or police authority in that area or are required or used by any such authority for the purposes of any operations connected with the maintenance of public safety or the defence of the Island :

Provided further that an indoor light, which is essential for the purposes of any work done in any room or building or for the safety of the persons occupying any room or building, may be lit in such room or building if, but only if, every window, glass-door, skylight and ventilation grill of the room or building, as the case may be, is completely obscured in such manner as to ensure that no direct or reflected light from the building is visible from any point or place outside the building; and

(5) in paragraph 22, by the substitution, for sub-paragraph (b) of that paragraph, of the following :—

“(b) the provisions of paragraphs 16, 17 and 17A (which relate to vehicles) shall be complied with by the owner and the driver of every cart, by the rider or other person in charge of every bicycle, and by the owner and the puller of every jinricksha, at all times of the day or night throughout the period during which such provisions remain in operation in that area, whether such cart, bicycle or jinricksha is stationary or in motion on any highway, or in any park, recreation-ground, garden or open space of any kind.”; and

(6) in the Schedule to that Order—

(a) by the substitution, for paragraph 1 of that Schedule of the following new paragraph :—

“(3) The whole of the area comprised within the existing municipal limits of Colombo, Kandy, and Galle.”;

(b) in paragraph 2 of that Schedule, by the addition, at the end of that paragraph, of the following :—

(5) The whole of the area, one mile wide, along the coast of Ceylon from the northern point of the peninsula lying to the west of Puttalam Lake and Dutch Bay to Hambantota, exclusive of any area or part of any area specified or defined in paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) of this notice.

(6) The whole of the area within a radius of eight miles from Chapel Hill, Trincomalee.

(7) The whole of the area to the south-east of the Ceylon Government Railway (Colombo to Kandy line) at Kelaniya Station and bounded on the north by the Railway land, on the east by the property of D. A. Davith Silva and others, garden and field of Don Paulu Arachige Welun Silva and the Kebellawala, on the south by the Naramminiya-Dewata road, and on the west by the approach road to the Railway Station.

(8) The whole of the area lying to the west of Kelaniya Railway Station approach road situated in Peliyagoda Pattiya village in Ragam pattuwa of Alutkuru korale south, Colombo District, Western Province, and bounded on the—

North : By Colombo-Kandy main road.

(11) The whole of the Revenue District of Jaffna (excluding the Divisional Revenue Officer's division of Punakari-Tunukkai and that part of the Divisional Revenue Officer's division of Pachchilapali-Karachchi which lies to the south of the Jaffna Lagoon).

2. The provisions of Part III. of the Lighting Restriction Order (viz., paragraphs 13 to 17 inclusive) relating to Outdoor and Indoor Lights and Lights on Vehicles other than Motor Cars shall come into operation from the date set out above, and shall continue until the Minister issues directions that the partial blackout shall cease to be in force in the areas set out above.

3. All previous notices in this connexion are hereby cancelled.

- (1) rescind with effect from March 4, 1942, my Order dated March 3, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale prices fixed in respect of rice for the area specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per bag above which, respectively all varieties of rice except raw and all varieties of raw rice, shall not be sold within the area specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto; and
- (3) direct that paragraphs 3 to 6 of my said Order dated March 3, 1942, shall apply in the case of any sale by wholesale of any rice within any area specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto as though these paragraphs were incorporated in this Order.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do by this Order—

- (1) rescind with effect from this date my Order relating to rice dated February 2, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 8,858 of February 4, 1942.
- (2) fix the maximum wholesale price of rice as follows:—  
The wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of Schedule hereto, shall not sell rice of the description and grade specified in columns (2) to (3) above the maximum wholesale price per bag specified against their areas in the respective columns of the said Schedule;
- (3) direct that the wholesale dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the descriptions and grades of rice for sale and the maximum price of each of them fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) to (3) of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (5) prescribe that every wholesale dealer who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) to (3) of the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—  
(a) the description and grade of rice sold;  
(b) the quantity of rice sold;  
(c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;  
(d) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order:—  
(a) a bag of any variety of rice other than raw rice shall contain not less than 80 measures;  
(b) a bag of Raw rice shall contain not less than 112 measures;  
(c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;  
(d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;  
(e) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;  
(f) "Authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of part III, under head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people;  
(g) "Wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under regulation 5 of part III, under head E, of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;  
(h) The maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice of any description and grade which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such rice is sold;

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

## Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices, Colombo District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) rescind with effect from the date my Order relating to rice dated February 2, 1942, published in *Gazette* No. 288 of February 4, 1942;
- (2) fix the maximum retail price per measure of rice as follows:—  
The authorised distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not sell rice of the description and grade specified in columns (2) to (3) above the maximum retail price per measure specified in the respective columns of the said Schedule against the area in which their boutique or stores are situated;
- (3) direct that every authorised distributor in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the description and grades of rice for sale and the maximum prices fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no authorised distributor shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) to (3) of the schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (5) prescribe that every authorised distributor who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) to (3) of the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—  
(a) the description and grade of rice sold;  
(b) the quantity of rice sold;  
(c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;  
(d) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—  
(a) a bag of any variety of rice other than Raw rice shall contain not less than 80 measures;  
(b) a bag of raw rice shall contain not less than 112 measures;  
(c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;  
(d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one-thirty-second part of a bushel;  
(e) "Authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of part III, under head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Coomaswamy Balasingham, Assistant Controller of Prices, Puttalam District, do by this Order:—

- (1) rescind my order dated March 2, 1942, in so far as it relates to the brands of kerosene oil mentioned in column 2 of the Schedule hereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum price per four-gallon tin, the maximum price per gallon, and the maximum price per bottle above which kerosene oil of the brand specified in the corresponding entry of column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold (by wholesale or by retail) within the corresponding areas specified in column 1;
- (3) direct that every trader who exposes for sale any kerosene oil of the brand specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order at any premises within the corresponding areas mentioned in column 1 shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that brand of kerosene oil;
- (4) direct that no such trader shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;
- (5) direct that every trader who sells kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that kerosene oil on demand a receipt on which shall be set out—  
  - (a) the brand of the kerosene oil sold;
  - (b) the quantity of the kerosene oil sold;
  - (c) the price paid; and
  - (d) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purposes of this Order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (1/6th) of an Imperial gallon.

  - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, Richard Morgan Davies, Deputy Controller of Prices, Ratnapura District, do by this Order:—

- (1) rescind my Order dated February 8, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 367 of February 20, 1942, in so far as it relates to all grades of Raw Rice;
- (2) fix the price shown in column 1 (b) of the Schedule hereto as the price per bag of rice ex each Supply Station mentioned in the corresponding column 1 (a) in column 2, as the maximum wholesale price per bag at each Supply Station Centre mentioned in corresponding column 1 (a) & in column 4, as the maximum retail price per measure at each Supply Station Centre;
- (3) fix the price mentioned in column 2 increased by the amount mentioned in the corresponding column (3) (b) as the maximum wholesale price per bag to be recovered by the wholesale dealers at the places mentioned in corresponding column 3 (a) from authorised distributors;
- (4) fix the price in column 4 increased by the amount in the corresponding column 5 (b) as the maximum retail price per measure to be recovered by the authorised distributors at the places mentioned in the corresponding column 5 (a) from the consumers;
- (5) direct that every trader who exposes for sale rice at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 5 (a) of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by the Order for rice;
- (6) direct that no trader shall sell rice which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (7) direct that every trader who sells rice shall give to the purchaser of that rice, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description and grade of rice sold;
  - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
  - (d) the date of the sale;
- (8) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
  - (a) a bag of rice shall contain not less than 112 measures;
  - (b) any sale of rice by the bag shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (c) any sale of rice by the measure or half measure shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel, and half measure shall be equivalent to one sixty-fourth of a bushel.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Food Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, I, John Radley Walters, Deputy Controller of Prices, Badulla District, do by this Order —

- (1) rescind with effect from this date my Order relating to rice dated February 3, 1942, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 8,805 of February 13, 1942, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and grade specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule thereto.
- (2) fix the maximum retail price per measure of rice as follows:—The authorised distributors and retail dealers in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not sell rice of the description and grade specified in columns (2) and (3) above the maximum retail price per measure specified in the respective columns of the said schedule against the area in which their boutiques or stores are situated.
- (3) direct that every authorised distributor and retail dealer in the areas in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the description and grade of rice for sale and the maximum prices fixed by this Order.
- (4) direct that no authorised or retail dealer shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) and (3) of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality.
- (5) prescribe that every authorised distributor and retail dealer who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) and (3) of the schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description and grade of rice sold;
  - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
  - (d) the date of sale;
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order —
  - (a) a bag of any rice other than Broken Raw rice shall contain not less than 80 measures or 224 pounds by weight;
  - (b) a bag of Broken Raw rice shall contain not less than 112 measures and 224 pounds by weight;
  - (c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
  - (e) "authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 part iii. of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people.

- (3) direct that the wholesale dealers for the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the descriptions and grades of rice for sale and the maximum prices of each of them fixed by this Order;
- (4) direct that no wholesale dealer shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) and (3) of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (5) direct that when rice of any description and grade specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto is sold by the bag the maximum wholesale price fixed by this Order shall include the price of the container in which such rice is sold;
- (6) prescribe that every wholesale dealer who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in columns (2) and (3) of the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the description and grade of rice sold;
  - the quantity of rice sold;
  - the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
  - the date of sale;

- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order:—

- a bag of any rice other than broken raw rice shall contain not less than 80 measures and 160 pounds of weight;
- a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 112 measures and 224 pounds weight;
- any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
- "Measure" shall be deemed to be standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
- The maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor or other retail dealer for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag should be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
- "Authorised distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III., of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people.
- "Wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5, Part III., of Head "E" of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors.

- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order, “Ordinary” rice shall mean all varieties of rice other than Raw rice.
- (8) rescind my order dated February 16, 1942, relating to prices of rice in Matale District published in *Government Gazette* dated February 27, 1942.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Noel Edward Ernst, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kurunegala District, do by this Order:—

- (1) rescind my Orders dated February 2, 1942, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,860 of February 6, 1942, fixing the wholesale price per bag and retail price per measure;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which rice of the description mentioned in the headings of columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the corresponding areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule;
- (3) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions and grades of rice mentioned in the First Schedule hereto;
- (4) direct that wholesale-dealers and authorised distributors in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at their premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the descriptions and grades of rice for sale and maximum prices fixed by this Order;
- (5) direct that no wholesale dealer or authorised distributor shall sell rice of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with rice of an inferior description and grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every wholesale dealer and authorised distributor who sells rice of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description and grade of rice sold;
  - (b) the quantity of rice sold;
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold;
  - (d) the date of sale;
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) a bag of any rice other than broken raw rice shall contain not less than 80 measures;
  - (b) a bag of broken raw rice shall contain not less than 112 measures;
  - (c) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of re-sale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (d) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, equivalent to one thirty-second part of a bushel;
  - (e) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from an authorised distributor for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per bag fixed by this Order;
  - (f) "Authorised Distributor" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions, or groups of people;
  - (g) "Wholesale dealer" means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III., under Head E of the Food Control Regulations to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to authorised distributors or depots;
  - (h) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for rice of any description and grade which is sold wholesale shall include the container in which such rice is sold.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Purchase and Transport of Paddy and Grain) Regulations, 1942.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“authorised officer of Government” means a Government Agent, an Additional Government Agent, an Assistant Government Agent, or the Commissioner for Agricultural Marketing, and includes any person appointed by a Government Agent, an Additional Government Agent, an Assistant Government Agent, or such Commissioner as his agent for the purposes of these regulations;

“country rice” means rice produced or produced from paddy grown in Ceylon;

“driver”, in relation to a vessel or vehicle, includes the person for the time being in charge of that vessel or vehicle;

“grain” means country rice, kurakkan or meneri;

“producer”, in relation to paddy or grain, means the proprietor of the field on which such paddy or grain is grown or produced, and includes the lessee, usufructuary mortgagee or other person in possession of and taking the produce of that field or land;

“to transport”, with its grammatical variations, means to carry or to convey in any vessel, vehicle or by any other means whatsoever;

“vessel” includes anything made or used for the conveyance by water of persons or property.

3. No person shall, in the course of any one day, sell to any person other than an authorised officer of Government more than five bushels of paddy or more than two and a half bushels of grain.

4. No person other than an authorised officer of Government shall, on any occasion, purchase more than five bushels of paddy or more than two and a half bushels of grain.

5. (1) No person shall sell or purchase any paddy or grain at a price greater than the maximum price, or less than the minimum price, prescribed in the Schedule for the sale or purchase of paddy or grain.

(2) The prices prescribed in the Schedule may be varied by the Minister for Agriculture and Lands by notification published in the Gazette and in such other manner as he may deem necessary.

6. A receipt given to an authorised officer of Government by any person for the time being in possession of any paddy or grain for the payment of the purchase price of such paddy or grain shall be a sufficient acquittance to the Government of Ceylon and to that authorised officer of Government in respect of the purchase of that paddy or grain:

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this regulation shall affect the right of any person, claiming to be entitled to the money or to any part of the money paid by an authorised officer of Government for the purchase of any paddy or grain, to proceed against the person to whom such money was paid for the recovery of such money or any part thereof

7. (1) Subject as hereinafter provided—

(a) no person shall, except under the authority of a written permit issued by an authorised officer of Government, transport on any occasion, whether by road or otherwise, more than five bushels of paddy or more than two and a half bushels of grain;

(b) the driver of a vehicle or vessel shall not, without the authority of a permit in writing issued by an authorised officer of Government, keep in any place a vehicle or vessel more than five bushels of paddy or more than two and a half bushels of grain:

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this regulation shall apply—

(a) to the transport of paddy or grain by a producer of such paddy or grain from the field or land where such paddy or grain is grown or produced to a barn or other place situated in the same revenue district as such field or land and ordinarily used by the producer of such paddy or grain for the purposes of storage; or

(b) to the transport of any paddy or grain by any person for or on behalf of the Government of Ceylon.

(2) Where the driver of any vehicle or vessel contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1) (b) of this regulation, the owner of that vehicle or vessel shall be deemed to have committed an act in contravention of the provisions of this regulation.

8. Any authorised officer of Government, any police officer or any headman may at any time—

(a) stop and search any vehicle or vessel in or upon which he suspects or has reason to believe that any paddy or grain is being transported;

(b) may open any bag or other receptacle, found in or upon any such vehicle or vessel;

(c) may measure the quantity of any paddy or grain kept or carried in or upon any such vehicle or vessel or in any such bag or other receptacle;

(d) may drive or remove any such vehicle or vessel, or cause any such vehicle or vessel to be driven or removed, to any place for the purposes of any such search or measurement.

9. Any person who—

(a) does any act in contravention or evasion of any provision of these regulations; or

(b) abets any other person, or agrees or conspires with any other person, to do or to assist the doing of any act in contravention or evasion of any provision of these regulations; or

(c) obstructs any authorised officer of Government or any police officer or any headman in the exercise or discharge of any power or duty conferred or imposed upon any such officer or headman, by these regulations,

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction after summary trial before a Magistrate, be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand five hundred rupees or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding three months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
