THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

CF. D: 989/42

*Order under Regulation 35A.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by Regulation 35A of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (a) direct that the highway named Torrington place, which passes through land adjoining the Colombo Race Course and other premises appropriated for use in His Majesty's service, be stopped up at the two places described in the Schedule to this Order;
- (b) direct that the Director of Public Works shall cause to be erected and maintained at each of the said places a barricade of such description and size as he may deem necessary or sufficient for giving effect to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Order;
- (c) direct that no person shall cross or pass either such barricade or enter into or upon that part of Torrington place which lies between the said barricades, except under the authority of a permit in writing issued by the Air Officer Commanding, Ceylon, or by some other officer authorised by the Air Officer Commanding, Ceylon, to issue such permits on his behalf;
- (d) direct that this Order shall come into force on the twenty-first day of March, 1942.

*Schedule.*

1. The junction of Torrington place with the highway named Torrington square.
2. An imaginary line drawn across Torrington place, at a right-angle to the boundary between Torrington place and the Colombo Race Course, at a point one hundred and twenty yards from the junction of Torrington place with Torrington square.
