GOYERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

L. D.-CF 13/39.

NOTIFICATION BY THE PRINCIPAL COLLECTOR OF CUSTOMS UNDER REGULATION 9 OF THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

IT is hereby notified that, on and after April 1, 1942, the Principal Collector of Customs will require that all goods consigned from any neutral country in Europe and imported into Ceylon shall be accompanied by a certificate of origin and interest in the Form in the Schedule hereto, to be signed, contersigned and attested as provided in that Form.

- 2. It is hereby further notified that the Principal Collector of Customs has determined that goods consigned from neutral countries in Europe shall be deemed to be grown, produced or manufactured in enemy territory if more than 5 per cent of the total cost (including the value of containers and other forms of interior packing ordinarily sold with the goods when they are sold by retail, but excluding the manufacturer's or exporter's profit, the cost of exterior packing, carriage to port and other charges incidental to the export of the goods subsequent to their manufacture) is derived from work done within enemy territory
- 3. Nothing in paragraph 2 of this Notification shall apply to the importation into Coylon, on any date prior to July 1, 1942, of any goods which are accompanied by a certificate of origin and intensit issued at any time before April 1, 1942, in accordance with the Notification under regulation 9 of the Defence (Trading with the Euemy) Regulations, 1939, published by the Acting Principal Collector of Customs in Gazette Extraordinary No. 8,569 of January 16, 1949
- 4. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Notification, the Notification by the Acting Principal Collector of Customs under regulation 9 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 8,569 of January 16, 1940, is hereby rescinded.

FORM OF CERTIFICATE OF ORIGIN AND INTEREST. .
