THE MINIMUM WAGES (INDIAN LABOUR) ORDINANCE.

Notification No. 328.

BY virtue of the powers vested in him by section 10 of the Minimum Wages (Indian Labour) Ordinance (Chapter 114), the Governor has approved-

- (a) the minimum rates of wages set out in the Schodule hereto, being the minimum rates of wages for labourers on estates which have been fixed under section 8 of the Ordinance by the Estate Wages Boards specified in the Second Schedule to Notification No. 281 of December 21, 1940, published in Gazette No. 8,698 of December 23, 1940, and which have been confirmed under that section by the Board of Indian Immigrant Labour; and
 (b) the cancellation of the rates fixed under the Ordinance and specified in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Notification No. 281.

THE MINIMUM WAGES (INDIAN LABOUR) ORDINANCE.

Notification No. 329.

IT is hereby notified under a tion 10 (1) of the Minimum Wages (Indian Labour) Ordinance (Chapter 114) that the minimum rates of wages approved by the Governor and set out in Notification No. 328 published in *Gazette* No. 8,899 of March 31, 1942, shall take effect from May 1, 1942.

2. It is hereby further notified for general information that the said rates of wages have been fixed on the understanding that on all estates to which the rates are applicable, if a system of rationing of rice under the Food Control Ordinance is not in force at the time, clean unblended rice of good quality will be issued to each working Indian estate labourer at Rs. 4.80 per bushel. The issue of such rice will be at a rate per month not less than seven-eighths of a bushel for a man, six-eighths of a bushel for a woman, and five-eighths of a bushel for a child; provided a sufficient sum shall have been earned within the month to cover its cost.
