THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF EXPORTS) REGULATIONS.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 3 of the Defence (Control of Exports) Regulations, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order amend the Schedule to those Regulations (as last amended by the Order published in *Gazette* No. 8,932 of May 22, 1942), by the addition of the following new items to that Schedule.—

- “ 62. Tea
- 63. Coir bristle fibre
- 64. Rubber tyres and tubes ”

THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE.

Notification.

IT is hereby notified in terms of section 4 (3) of the Food Control Ordinance (Chapter 132), that the Orders specified in the Schedule hereto made by me under section 4 (1) of the Ordinance, and published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,939 of June 2, 1942, have been confirmed by the Board of Ministers on June 8, 1942.

Schedule.

- I. Order No. 17 under section 4 (1) (a) prohibiting the transport or removal of paddy or other grain from certain areas except under permit.
- II. Order No. 18 under section 4 (1) (g) directing the Food Controller to take steps for the allocation of supplies of rice and paddy to merchants and distributors in certain parts of Ceylon, and to organize and administer a system of rationing such supplies.
- III. Order No. 19 under section 4 (1) (d) prohibiting the removal of rice or paddy imported into Ceylon from Customs premises except under permit.
- IV. Order No. 20 under section 4 (1) (e) assuming control of every granary, warehouse or store in the Chalmers Granaries and the Manning Market in which rice is stored for the purpose of trade.
