BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated December 26, 1942, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,056 of December 27, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of rice of the description named and specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
- (ii) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per measure above which any rice of the description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo,
- (iii) direct that no person shall sell any rice of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article,
- (iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated December 28, 1942, published in the *Government Gazette* No 9,059 of December 31, 1942, fixing the wholesale price per bag and retail price per measure,
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, and 4 of the Second Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which rice of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto,
- (3) direct that every trader who sells rice in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for rice fixed by this Order,
- (4) direct that no person shall sell rice which is adulterated with any other article,
- (5) direct that every person who sells rice by wholesale shall, and every person who sells rice by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out —

- (a) the date of sale,
- (b) the quantity of rice sold,
- (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold, and
- (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, and

- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order —

- (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
- (b) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, and
- (d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag fixed by this Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, William Oswald Stevens, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Galle District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated December 28, 1942, published in the *Government Gazette* No 9,059 of December 31, 1942, fixing the wholesale price per bag and retail price per measure,
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag above which paddy of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto,

- (3) direct that every trader who sells paddy in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for paddy fixed by this Order,
- (4) direct that no person shall sell paddy which is adulterated with any other article,
- (5) direct that every person who sells paddy by wholesale shall, and every person who sells paddy by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of sale,
  - (b) the quantity of paddy sold,
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity of paddy sold, and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, and

(6) direct that for the purpose of this Order —

- (a) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
- (b) any sale of any quantity of paddy for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, and
- (d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag fixed by this Order

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

## Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, I, William Oswald Stevens, Deputy Controller of Prices, Galle District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated March 3, 1943, published in the *Government Gazette* No 9,094 of March 5, 1943, in so far as it relates to curzystuffs of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto,
- (2) fix the prices, which are for the time being fixed by Order of the Controller of Prices under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum wholesale and retail prices above which any article mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the Town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale and retail prices, respectively, above which any article of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule shall not be sold within the Municipal area of the Town of Galle and the Urban Council area of Ambalangoda,
- (3) fix the prices, which are fixed for the Municipal limits of the Town of Colombo increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Third Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale and retail prices above which any article of the description and grade in column 1 of the Second Schedule shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Third Schedule,
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one hundredweight or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by whole sale,
  - (b) any sale of any quantity less than one hundred weight of any article for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail
  - (c) a "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale any article mentioned in the Second and Third Schedules hereto,
  - (d) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale,
  - (e) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail,
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description or grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality,

(6) direct that any trader who, at any premises within any area of the District of Galle, sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade,

(7) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt, in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of the sale,
- (b) the description and grade of the article sold,
- (c) the weight of the quantity sold, if sold by whole sale, and the weight of the quantity sold, if sold by retail,
- (d) the price paid for the quantity sold,
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail

    - (a) a 49 lb bag shall contain not less than 48½ lb nett, a 150 lb bag shall contain not less than 148 lb nett and a 196 lb bag shall contain not less than 193 lb nett,
    - (b) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
    - (c) any sale of any quantity of wheat flour for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
    - (d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of wheat flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag, fixed by this Order

(vii) direct that every person who sells by retail red onions of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, and
- (d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of rice of all varieties which is less than 1 bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag fixed by this Order.

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

## Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provision No 2) I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Jaffna District, do, by this Order —

- (i) revoke with effect from this date my order dated March 30, 1943, published in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,107 of April 6, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of the commodities mentioned in column 2 of the Schedule hereto,
- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum price per hundredweight<sup>b</sup> (wholesale and retail) and the maximum retail price per pound above which the article of the description and grade specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail within the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
- (iii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
- (iv) direct that no trader shall sell any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description, grade or quality,
- (v) direct that every trader who at any premises within the limits of any area mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of the article of the description and grade,
- (vi\*) direct that every trader who at any premises within the area specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto sells any article of the description and grade specified in the Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that article, on demand, a receipt on which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale,
  - (b) the quantity of the article sold (by weight),
  - (c) the description and grade of the article sold,
  - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
  - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail

## THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

## Order

BY virtue of powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Benjamin Franklin Perera, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke my order fixing the maximum retail price per measure of rice within the Revenue District of

Kegalla, dated January 4, 1943, and published in the *Government Gazette* No 9,065 of January 12, 1943,

- (2) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per measure above which rice shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
- (3) direct that every trader who sells rice in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position in his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for rice fixed by this Order,

- (4) direct that no person shall sell rice which is adulterated with any other article or with rice of an inferior description or grade,  
 (5) direct that every person who sells rice by retail shall, on demand, give to the purchaser of that rice a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) date of sale,  
 (b) the quantity of rice sold,  
 (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold, and  
 (d) the nature of the transaction that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail,

(6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

- (a) any sale of any quantity of rice for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail
